Workshops:

Thank you Elaine and Sheryl for such a great Elfin Magic workshop! Your planning, kitting, and guidance were spot on. I hope everyone who was able to join us enjoyed their day of sewing, food, and laughter. Who knew there were so many ways to install a zipper!

January 21, 2023 - 9-3 Fellowship Hall - Camden Bag - Denise Adams will show us how to create this beautiful bag. We have not had a bag class in years, so this is a beautiful one to try. She used a "Free Spirit" jelly roll for her sample, which will be at our meetings. The supply list is below:

Camden Bags- Zig zag stitched bags. Made from rectangle for the sides and oval for the bottom.

Fabric:	Small	Medium	Large
Sides yards if using 1 fabric	1 1/4	1 ½	3 3/4
I used 2 ½ x42-44" strips	16	20	37

Binding, bottom & handles 1 yard for any size

The large bag- length of strips are 55" so you need to sew strips together & then cut to 55" or cut strips lengthwise. The 3 3/4 yards are enough for binding, bottom & handles also if using 1 fabric

Side interfacing: I used bosal double sided fusible batting duet fuse II if available in precut rolls (2 ¼ X 20 yards or 25 yards)

Small need 1 yard or 1 roll, Medium 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards or 1 25 yard roll , Large 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards or 3- 20yard rolls or 2- 25 yard rolls

Bottom interfacing: Use precut Camden bag bottom from Bosal or 1 yard (20x36) of stiff double sided fusible interfacing like Craft-tex plud by Bosal or Peltex 72F by Pellon

Matching thread: 50 weight 2 ply thread. For hand sewing, heavy cotton thread like Aurifil's 12 weight cotton

<u>Handles:</u> Plastic tubing (.170 1/4 " polyethylene 5 feet. I got at Home depot. Also non fusible stiff interfacing ¾ vard

Embellishments: Buttons large & small for layered look.

<u>Tools needed:</u> Sewing machine that has a zig zag stitch, Microtex 90/14 for straight stitching, Inspira denim 110/18 for zig zag or Janome purple tip needle, Teflon pressing sheet, Teflon sole plate (like steamfast travel iron) Dritz thermal thimbles, wonder clips, pins, scissors, rotary mat & cutter, acrylic rulers seam ripper, Milliner's needle size 7 for hand sewing
