Maggie is a near-native of Jacksonville (first year in Waycross), and after working in Atlanta and Washington DC, returned to Jacksonville. Maggie joined the Florida Air National Guard in 1973, starting a military career that culminated with the designation of Chief Nurse for the Air National Guard in 1986.

During her career, which included 27.5 years of military service and 40 years at St Vincent's Hospital, Maggie was married for 56 years, and raised 3 children. In fact, Maggie returned to school, UNF, and was awarded a BS-N in 1985, at a time when two of her daughters were also in attendance at UNF.

Maggie loves all sorts of crafts, including sewing and quilting. Retired in 2003, Maggie continues her goal to manage her Parkinson's disease, an affliction for the past ten years.

The deposit is refunded if the member shows up, or if they can get someone else to take their place at the workshop.

For retreats, a non-refundable deposit is due at sign-up. The amount is determined by how much of a deposit the venue requires.
