



## Who needs a Measles vaccine?

INFANTS 6-11 months	<ul> <li>Not required</li> <li>One dose of MMR vaccine may be given if infant is travelling to an area that is considered high-risk</li> <li>The child will still need both routine doses once they turn 12 months old</li> </ul>
CHILDREN 1-3 years	<ul> <li>First routine dose:</li> <li>Children receive one dose of the MMR* vaccine at</li> <li>12 months of age</li> <li>Children travelling to high-risk areas are recommended to receive their second dose, despite not yet being 4</li> </ul>
CHILDREN 4+ years	<b>Second routine dose:</b> Children receive a second dose of measles containing vaccine, MMRV**, between 4 and 6 years old
ADULTS Born in or after 1970	Would have <b>received vaccination in childhood</b> , if unsure of vaccination history they are recommended to receive one dose of MMR vaccine* and may be eligible to receive a second dose***
ADULTS Born before 1970	Natural immunity: People born before 1970 are generally considered immune from a previous infection  May be eligible for 1 dose for travel to a high-risk area
