

Gearing up for Parade Season

Illustrious Sir STEVE LIVERNASH

As I reflect on the journey that brought me from a new Shriner to serving as your Potentate, one feeling stands above the rest. Pride. Not pride in position, but pride belonging to something that truly matters. Years ago, I was parading in Princeton with the Zor FUNsters. About halfway through the route, I noticed a teenage girl in a wheelchair along the curb holding a handmade sign that read simply, "Thank You Shriners." At first, I assumed it was just part of the general excitement that surrounds a parade. Then I realized that the sign was not meant for the marching band, the fire trucks, or the candy throwers. It was meant for a small group of Shriners walking & driving by in funny vehicles. She had made it just for us... "Imagine That".

I did not know her, and she did not know us, but she knew what Shriners do. Perhaps she or someone she loved had been helped by Shriners Children's. Perhaps she had spent long rides traveling to appointments. Whatever her story was, she was thanking people she had never met for kindness given from the heart, not the pocketbook. In that moment, I felt something catch in my throat, and I was deeply proud, not of myself, but of the organization I was privileged to represent.

I will be honest about something else. When I first joined, I thought the fez looked a little silly and felt hesitant about wearing one. It took an experience to change that feeling into maturity.

One day before a variety show as a greeter, I was standing with my fez on when I felt a small tug at my right hand from behind. I looked down to see a little girl smiling up at me. She said, "Thank you, Shriner." I was puzzled because I did not understand. Then she added, "Thank you for helping my brother," and just as suddenly as she appeared, she skipped away. In that instant, I understood. She was not thanking me as a man. She was thanking a man wearing a fez. She was thanking every Shriner who had come before me and helped her family long before I ever put one on my head.

Since that day, it has been one of the greatest honors of my life to wear the Zor fez. It represents not only who we are today, but every Noble who has worn one before us since 1872. It stands for service given freely, without expectation of reward, simply because we care about children and their future. Gathering for fun and fellowship with purpose. We are an extended family brought together by the nature of giving back. Just plain good people united.

Anyone who has spent time with our patients knows they are the true heroes. These children face challenges most of us cannot imagine, yet they meet each day with courage and often with a smile. They remind us that what we sometimes call a bad day would not even register on their scale of hardship. Their strength humbles us and gives purpose to everything we do.

From hospital rooms to parade routes to fellowship gatherings, it is all for the kids. In 2026, as we celebrate one hundred years of Shriners Children's Chicago, we are reminded that this mission has been bringing hope and healing for a full century.

Every Shriner has a story that inspired him to join. Past Potentate Wally Trouten once said his only regret was that he had not become a Shriner twenty years earlier. That simple statement speaks volumes. Somewhere along the way, something inspires a man to take this step. No one simply wakes up one morning and decides to join without a reason.

Our membership team is working diligently to reconnect with Nobles who have drifted away and to extend a hand of welcome back into the fraternity. I want to personally thank Membership Chairman Rodney Schultz for his dedication to this effort, and Divan members Mark Mayre, Dave Chavez & Chad Fonseca, much of which happens quietly behind the scenes. Your Divan teams are working together with enthusiasm and purpose between board meetings. The fundraising team is planning events and initiatives to strengthen our presence in the communities we serve.

If we share or tell our story of inspiration well today, someday another Shriner will pass through a small town parade, notice a simple sign or hear a quiet thank you, and feel the same sense of pride and responsibility that so many of us have felt. In that way, we leave a legacy that continues long after our own time of service. "Imagine That"



Patients and families appreciate our ear, nose and throat (ENT) physicians in the craniofacial/cleft program at Shriners Children's Chicago. We celebrated them during Kids ENT Month in February. We have 5 ENTs who evaluate patients to address concerns which might include is a child sleeping well or having issues with clogged ears, which are more common in children with clefts.



Having ENTs on staff is part of Shriners Children's multidisciplinary approach to treating our young and mighty patients. ENTs



like Kathryn Colman, M.D. who work in our Thursday cleft 'team day', will also surgically place ear tubes, and can remove tonsils and evaluate adenoids if there are issues related to cleft/craniofacial conditions.

Message from the 2026 Chief Rabban

Spring Brings the Start of Parade Season

Happy Spring to everyone! As we move into April, we welcome the longer days, warmer weather, and the official start of the spring season. With it also comes the beginning of another exciting parade season.

As units begin preparing their schedules, it is important to remember that **all parades must be submitted to the office for approval by the Potentate**. This includes any parades that may be added during the season. Without proper approval, participants risk not being covered under insurance for the event. Unfortunately, as we have seen in the past, accidents can happen, and it is essential that both our members and the temple remain properly protected under the coverage provided through the temple and Shriners International.

The easiest and fastest way to submit a parade request is through the online portal available on the Zor Shriners website.

To register your parade through the portal:

1. Visit **zorshriners.com**.
2. From the main menu, select **Calendar**.
3. You will see a **QR code for the Event/Parade Request**.
4. Click the **QR code to open the Event Planning page**.
5. Select **"Start Now."**
6. Complete the form by answering the questions provided. When entering the Name of the Event, please include your **unit name, the parade name, and the city where it is held**. The start time may be approximate if the exact time is not yet confirmed.
7. Once finished, click Submit.

After submission, the request is automatically sent to the Potentate via email for approval. Once approved, the event is added to the Zor calendar and may also appear in social media posts and the Zephyr.

The portal also offers the option to send email reminders to your unit members, both in advance of the parade and even on the day of the event.

If you have any questions about submitting events through the portal, please contact your Divan representative or the office, and someone will be happy to assist you.

For those who prefer the traditional method, you may still send a list of parades to the office. However, please remember to allow additional time for mail delivery and for the request to reach the Potentate for approval.

A Final Reminder Regarding Parade Announcements

When preparing your parade unit announcements for event organizers, please remember that Shriners Children's should not be listed as the recipient of parade proceeds unless all funds received from sponsors for that parade are being donated to Shriners Children's. You may certainly state that your participation helps raise awareness, but the announcement should not imply that proceeds are being donated unless that is the case.

Thank you to all units for your cooperation and for helping ensure a safe, successful, and enjoyable parade season.
