



# WILLIAM "BILL" BURKHARDT



The best proof of a life well lived is the memories a fallen Brother leaves with those who survive. Noble Bill Burkhardt, who died on January 22, 2019, left plenty.

By the time this writer joined the Fraternity in 1994, Bill Burkhardt was already notorious. He was one of the "greatest generation," men who endured the Great Depression and then World War II. Bill, born in 1927, was too young to serve during the war. But he managed to enlist after the war was officially over and participate in winning the peace as a military police officer.

After spending two years trying to control GIs intent on enjoying free time in Italy, Bill returned home. He ended up working for the State of Wisconsin, working his way up to the position of head of the Bureau of Weights and Measures. He was responsible for the honesty of scales, gasoline pumps and meters throughout Wisconsin for more than 25 years.

It was as a Freemason that Bill touched the most lives. He joined the Lodge in 1966. Shortly thereafter, he joined Scottish Rite and the Shrine. As a Shriner, he was active as a



member of the Directors Staff, the Jesters and the mini cars. He was a fixture at the concession stand for UW Football games. And he was a dependable dad, driving kids to

appointments at the Shriners Hospital for Children in Chicago.

The list of activities, though, doesn't tell you the full measure of what Bill was like. He was hard working in his support of Masonry and the Shrine. And he was the epitome of irreverence in his pursuit of those goals.

Bill raised me in 1994 when I joined the Fraternity. He took it upon himself to make sure that I did not become overly serious about my newfound Masonic connections. Shortly after I joined, my new brethren introduced me to the Lodge by making me the Junior Deacon. As part of that duty, I was to

exchange certain words with the Worshipful Master. I was anxious to do a good job. So of course, when it came time for Bill to whisper the Grand Masonic Word in my ear, he said, instead "I love you." Fortunately, I have enough irreverence of my own to respond with "Well I love you too!"

After that, Bill and I were fellow travelers in Masonry. In emulation of him, I told bad jokes. As much as Bill joked about well, everything, he always was serious about the mission of Freemasonry. He loved the kids we help in the Shrine. He loved the young men coming in to the Fraternity. He loved his country, his family and his fellow man.

Masonry has been one of the major pillars of my life. That is the case largely because of wonderful men like Bill Burkhardt who made me welcome in the Fraternity. When I came into the Shrine, Bill was involved in the ceremonial, wearing an absurd black beard that had been stuck onto his chin. He called out loudly asking who would join the caravan to Mecca. I joined the caravan, and am glad Bill was there to make the journey special.

# Board of Trustees member helps Jamaican child receive life-changing care

Shriners Hospitals for Children — St. Louis Board of Governors member Joe Shivley teamed up with Poplar Bluff, Missouri pediatrician Debra Robertson, M.D., to help bring baby Isabel from Jamaica to St. Louis for life-changing brachial plexus palsy surgery.

When mom Geneva was in labor last January, Isabel "Izzy" became stuck in the birth canal for over six minutes, which caused tearing of the nerves in her arm. Though some babies with minor cases recover naturally, many require a nerve repair

surgery, ideally before age 1. The Bennett family lives in South Central Jamaica in the town of May Pen, which is about two hours from the capital of Kingston and the nearest children's hospital.

The Bennetts knew something was wrong with Izzy's shoulder when she was born. When Dr. Robertson came to Jamaica on a medical mission trip last July, she recognized Izzy's condition and




Baby Izzy before brachial plexus palsy surgery.

suggested the Bennetts take Izzy to Bustamante Children's Hospital in Kingston. She also recommended reaching out to the Shriners, and connected them with Moolah Shriner Joe Shivley to help get Izzy an appointment. "This is why we do what we do as Shriners," Shivley said. "This hospital works miracles."

Despite the fact that Mr. Shivley lives in Poplar Bluff and the Bennett family lives in Jamaica, Izzy received a surgery appointment date and an emergency medical visa. The family made its way to St. Louis and she underwent surgery on January 15. The mission group Mission Four 18 and their leaders Len and Aimee Scott helped tremendously, as Geneva and dad Terrence serve as local representatives for them in Jamaica.


Izzy will stay in the United States for three to four weeks, depending on her recovery time. She will have a second surgery later this year. Once she recovers, she will have much more range of motion and will be able to start walking and keeping up with other kids her age, all due to the help of our local board member!






# William (Wally) Trouten TAKES THE HELM

determined to continue moving Zor forward

fter a fun-filled day of ceremony and questionable attempts at humor by the Directors' Staff, Noble Wally Trouten became Zor's Potentate. Other members of Zor's Divan were installed as the Temple's leadership, vowing to meet Zor's challenges with Masonic resolve.

Zor's Installation always involves a combination of the serious and the frivolous. On a serious note, the Directors Staff conducted their annual candle lighting to remember those Shriners who have passed on. The assembled Nobles adopted the 2019 budget for Zor. They heard reports and updates. They then proceeded to elect the Divan, Zor's leadership, for 2019.

At that point, the dignity of the occasion was shattered, as usual, by the Directors Staff. Past Potentate Mark Severson invaded the speaker's dais clad in an outlandish sport coat and outfit which had every appearance of having been put together at a St. Vincent DePaul store. He took over the microphone and attempted to ridicule Potentate-elect Trouten. Noble Severson was aided in his pathetic attempt at humor by the other directors. Surrounding another microphone, the other directors acted as a geek

chorus, sounding off with seemingly random verbal outbursts. Some people will do anything for a laugh.

And, while it seems that Directors' Staff skits are an inevitable part of the installation, at least this year's was short. The target of the skit, Wally Trouten, said later the ridicule did not bother him. "Now I don't have to be in fear of Mark and John [Thorstad] anymore," he said. "I was laughing right with them." It is fortunate that someone was.





Potentate Trouten and his Divan were subsequently installed in due form. The assembled group broke for a reception, then, dinner. Zor has a tradition of withholding the Fez from the new Potentate until he has been found by strict trial and due folly to be worthy and well qualified.

This year, per tradition, the process of judging the incoming Potentate involved his family offering testimonials to his character. In Wally's case, these were loving and appreciative, with not even the slightest hint of contrivance. Despite the positive support for him, Past Potentate John Thorstad took on his recurring role of Devil's advocate, urging the assembled multitude to reject Wally Trouten. Happily, this throng proved to be lenient and gave a "thumbs up" mandate. Gayle Trouten then lovingly placed the Fez on Wally's head, rewarding him with a kiss.

Potentate Trouten, brings to the position his experience of more than four decades of membership in the Masonic fraternity. In March 1976, he was raised a Master Mason in Melody Lodge #2 in Platteville. He joined the Fraternity, he said, because it offered guidelines for his life.

Wally has a long and deep interest in athletics. He has coached little league baseball and football. Athletics are a great way to introduce young people to being purposeful and disciplined while still having fun. But, he said, too many coaches in youth athletics are driven by the desire to win, to the point where it ceases to be fun for the kids. He values Masonry's ability to combine fun and connection with other good people within a structure which emphasizes good character.

The Potentate said joining the Shrine was always his goal. He was very active in his blue lodge for many years, however, serving in every chair at least once. He has been Worshipful Master three times. He found that experience invaluable



in developing leadership skills. He joined the Shrine because he values the involvement it offers to his wife Gayle.

"After years of leaving her at home while I went out to coach sports teams, I wanted Masonic activities which would involve my wife," Wally said. "The Shrine is where the rest of Masonry could be if it would involve our ladies."

Since becoming a Shriner, Wally said he has formed valuable friendships and connections. "I have a great friend from Saskatchewan," he said. "The quality of the people you meet in the Shrine is just amazing. These are great men and women who are really trying to make a positive difference for the world."

During his year at the helm of Zor, Wally wants to help all the units and clubs within Zor to rise to their highest level. "If you're good, become great. If you're great, help another unit or club become good," he said. "We need to boost our presence everywhere. We all share the same goals of fun and charity."

"At the end of my year, I would like people to look at Wisconsin for the excellent things we are doing here," he said. He noted that the Imagineers group has worked to improve communications within Zor dramatically. The changes to the Zor Zephyr and other messaging are being noticed, he said.



A graduate of Winona State University in Winona, Minnesota, Wally has a Master's in Education from Minnesota State University in Mankato. He did post graduate work at Illinois State.

He pledged that he will begin each morning with the same rubric: "It's a great day to be a Zor Shriner." We should all strive to emulate him.





### Chicago Shriners Hospital Offers High Tech Machine to Help Find Veins

Patients who require lab work or IVs at our hospital may notice new high tech machines to help locate their veins. The Chicago Shriners Hospital recently added AccuVein vein visualization technology.

The two devices, nicknamed "Vinnie" and "Vito", can aid health care professionals in finding a good vein for venipuncture. To use them, staff hold the device above the skin, turn on the AccuVein machine and the veins are illuminated in a red light for IV placements and blood draws.

This device can be helpful for patients like Yadira who have a brittle bone disorder called osteogenesis imperfecta. When these patients come to the hospital for infusion therapy, they require a tourniquet that is looser than for patients with typical bones. Maureen Tavarez, RN, used AccuVein for Yadira's recent IV placement. "Sometimes you feel the vein and it is not necessarily a good vein. It can be thinner than it is. With the vein viewer you see the thickness of the veins."





Diane D. Cotsilis, BA, MLT ASCP, laboratory manager at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago, helped our hospital secure the new machines. Cotsilis said AccuVein provides a hands-free option that shows veins in real-time, and they work in light or dark conditions.

The reaction from nursing and laboratory staff has been very positive. Kathleen Nebril, MT, a medical technologist in the hospital lab said she finds it helpful when veins may be difficult to locate. "For those few patients where you have neither sight nor feel it is helpful," she said. Nebril said patients enjoy the chance to see their own veins through the device. "The kids really like it. We try to take an unpleasant experience and make it something cool."






