ZOR ADVERTISING RULES

As Recorder of Zor Shriners I am required to inform all Nobles at least once a year what the fundraising requirements are per General Order No. 1, pages 44-47. I encourage all to review it in its entirety but here is a summary of the critical parts of it.

It is natural to associate the fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fundraising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe his or her money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fundraising activity by a temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the chairman of the board of trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations, shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the potentate of the temple having jurisdiction thereof.

There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fundraising Activities as outlined in General Order No. 1 is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of Shriners International.

MEDICAL STAFF BRINGS CARE AND EXPERTISE

to the Caribbean

In partnership with World Pediatric Project, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia medical staff members can offer their expertise and services to children all around the world who might not otherwise have access to care.

An international nonprofit, World Pediatric Project provides children with access to lifechanging surgical care. Through its traveling medical teams and U.S. referral program, over 2,000 children a year receive treatment they would not have access to in their native regions. Orthopedic surgeons Joshua Pahys, M.D., and Steven W. Hwang, M.D., have both collaborated with World Pediatric Project, traveling to the Caribbean to perform spine

surgeries for children experiencing pain and compromised lung capacity due to scoliosis. With help from World Pediatric Project, our staff is able to secure donated supplies, airfare and lodging during their visits.

Dr. Pahys traveled to Barbados for a medical trip for the first time in October 2018. "The trip was truly a life-changing experience for me. It gave me such a wonderful and much-needed dose of perspective to see how much good a small group can do when everyone focuses their energy towards a common goal," said Pahys. "It was my first of I hope many more mission trips with World Pediatric Project."

In addition to facilitating visits from U.S.-based medical teams, World Pediatric Project brings international patients to our hospital for care, securing visa appointments, travel and housing arrangements, and interpreters for patients and their families. Chief of Staff Scott Kozin, M.D., and Dr. Hwang have treated international patients at the Philadelphia Shriners Hospital and overseen their recovery until their return home.



Deniesha first began to notice signs of scoliosis, or curvature of the spine, when she was 9. Now 15, Deniesha and her mother knew that they would need to travel to the United States for surgery. They contacted World Pediatric Project and they arranged for Deniesha and her mother to travel from their native Barbados for treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia.

Despite the difficulty of a complex, lengthy spine surgery, Deniesha was excited about the opportunities this treatment would give her. "I was bullied due to my scoliosis. It was really hard on me," said Deniesha. "I'm excited about this surgery so I can be a normal teenager.

Thank you to Shriners and World Pediatric Project for making me the person I am now."







were viewed with incredible awe. Capturing images and forever retaining a moment of history. A memory that could be carried with

you and shared with others. The days of a telegraphed message had to be an eyebrow lifter in the 1800's. Communicating through a line fastened on a pole connected between two destinations along the train track rails. The speed of information was now faster than walking, horseback or canoe.
