



KOLBE DONATION TO WAUSAU SHRINERS

On June 12th, the Kolbe team participated in an annual brat fry fund raiser. The fund raiser is put on each year with the proceeds with matching funds from the Company to a different Non-Profit organization each year.





ZOR COMMUNICATIONS

Greetings All Nobles, Ladies & Friends,

This month's communications note is a bit of a somber note. I attended the Divan meeting held on June 19th, where the main topic was this year's budget. Due to the decreasing in our membership and our fund-raisers not producing as much as we did in the past, we find ourselves running more in the negative then normal. Because of this, it is necessary for them to find ways to save some money by cutting the budget in certain areas. The one I am addressing today is the Zephyr. Along with a committee of volunteers, we took a look into ways of cutting cost and still being able to reach our members. We were asked to do

some research to find out what the annual cost was to produce the Zephyr for the year and offer some ways to cut the cost. I was amazed when we got the actual monthly cost, which was slightly over \$3000.00 per month, \$36,000.00 per year, (\$30.00 per member). At this cost, we are ensuring every Noble, Widow, appendant body, and advertiser gets a copy, with the exception of those who have already opted-out and use the on-line version. We are currently producing almost 1520 copies monthly.

After looking at all the ways we might be able to off-set some of the cost in the production of this award-winning magazine and still keep our members informed of the activities of Zor, the committee offered two recommendations maintaining the over all quality of the magazine:

- 1) **Produce the magazine every other month** (6 issue per year) starting in October. Because of the increase in articles, being two months' worth instead of one, go to 28 pages. This would be a savings of almost \$12,000.00 per year.
- 2) Run an extensive OP-OUT campaign and try to get as many members as possible agree to go online instead of getting a hard copy. This would be a more effective way of cutting cost and keeping up communications with the member.


The two recommendation were approved by the Divan and starting with the October issue, we will only be producing the Zephyr on an every-other-month basis. We are also asking for anyone that would like to op-out and just use the on-line version, please contact me by e-mail, zorcommunications2019@gmail.com, and say "Op-Out".

I would like to thank each and every one of you for your understanding concerning this decision. This was not an easy decision for anyone to

make, but a necessary one for now. Hopefully, in time as we can find ways to get closer to a balance budget and return to our monthly issue.

Please remember, we have started a new year of *Friends of the Zephyr*, with the envelopes that were sent out in the May issue, a way for you to help cut the cost of the Zephyr and support your Temple.






PICNIC IN BARABOO
