

My lady, Judy, and I were fortunate to join several of our Zor Shriners and their ladies at the 2017 Imperial Session in Daytona Beach. The temperature was hot, but after all it was July in Florida. Within that backdrop, Shriners International was at center stage acting on items in the 'call', making many committee reports, and delivering updates to the several hundred Nobles in attendance.

Our 'Patient Ambassadors', Isabella and Emily, were introduced and their individual stories were shared. As usual, seeing these kids and hearing their stories brought tears of joy to our eyes and gladness to our hearts.

A very interesting and impressive report was that of a relatively new emergency response team; where doctors and other team specialists will travel to a disaster or crisis area to help children in need. Recently the 'Go Team' as described by John McCabe, Executive Vice President of Shriners Hospitals for Children, traveled to Mexico City, Mexico to help child burn victims hurt in an explosion. Several of these children were flown back to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Galveston, Texas for treatment. Another crisis event took the 'Go Team' to Guatemala, where our emergency responders helped many children there in need of medical attention.

This demonstrates the far reaching affects that our hospital system is having, and can have in the future. There are many children who are located in rather remote areas of the world where disasters and crisis can leave them in need of the services our professionals can provide.

This reminds us of one of the reasons we became Shriners, and as such, we can be proud of our hospitals and the many professionals who demonstrate the love and care our fraternity and great philanthropy wants to deliver.

We had a great time with many of our friends from Zorland, our counterparts, and Shriners from all over the world.

Recorders Notes By Robert Gorsuch PP, Recorder

There were 50 pieces of legislation in the Call to be acted on. A few pieces of legislation that impacts us as Zor Shriners:

1. Any proposal to move the location of a Temple needs to be signed by at least 100 members of the Temple or 10 percent of the membership, whichever is less.

- 2. All Temples shall elect members by a majority vote of the written ballots cast.
- 3. A fez can be provided to a new Noble as part of the initiation fee.

4. The Imperial Potentate can grant dispensation to allow participation by non-Nobles in a parade at the annual Session of Shriners International for the annual Session during his term in office.

5. In civic parades, and non-Shrine public appearances, with permission of the Potentate, Nobles and their ladies may also dress in clown costume and participate with the Clown unit of the temple but only Nobles may perform, compete, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels, or operate any vehicle of the temple units while parading.

6. A new temple in Santa Cruz, Bolivia was chartered.



Paying It Forward

Paying it forward is the term for doing a helpful act and asking the recipient to help others rather than pay you back.

What does this have to do with membership? Shriner participation in public events such as parades, circuses, and football games is done with hope of bringing smiles to faces of all ages in the community. Without active members, the local Shriner sightings will start to disappear. These events are a calling card to the community that says to the kids: "Shriners are fun"; to the parents: "Our hospitals offer such great care"; and to the men in the crowd: "Ask how you can join us".

I shared last month about a new patient opportunity. The point was we never know what conversation or activity is going to make a lasting impression and a possible referral in the future. Enjoy this example of a patient inspired to pay it forward to a local club: a young boy knew about Shriners through a family member, and eventually learned about the hospitals through an event held at the Twin Cities hospital. The fish pond event took place when this boy was 4 years old, and he returned yearly to fish while his family volunteered. Three years later this boy was a referral to the Twin Cities Shriners Hospital for issues with his feet and legs. Lucky for him, no surgery was involved, but molds and orthotic appointments took place to alleviate pain.

Fast forward another three years and this fifth grader started volunteering with maintenance on parade gokarts for the Road Runners. This became a regular activity for him for two summers. The concept of "Paying It Forward" didn't end there. Before starting school, this helpful kid completed his Eagle Scout project and earned his Eagle Scout recognition at the age of 14. Each summer, following that great achievement, he has enjoyed helping Twin Cities hospital patients fish at a summer camp field trip through the local Shrine club. He also returned to go-kart maintenance when he's not working. While this 16 year old is a typical teenager in many ways, he has a first-hand appreciation for the ability to be active when you have a body that allows it.

Yes, I have been drawing on personal stories this summer, because personal stories speak from experience. Do you have a story to tell? Opportunities are everywhere!! Get involved, be active and reach out with conversation to people of ALL ages. Masons and Shriners pay it forward as a result of those who have done the leg work before us. Hospital staff pay it forward by providing the phenomenal care to kids from a facility that is supported by Shriners. Patients and families pay it forward in ways that are yet to be seen.

Touching back to the story about this young Eagle Scout. (see next page) We really don't know what the future holds for this Shriners Hospital patient. However, as Masons and Shriners, we can continue to set an example and remember to voice an invitation for young men to join our brotherhood sooner than later in life. On a side note, it would be another proud moment for this boy's family if he continued his interest to become a 5th generation Mason and a 5th generation Shriner. How do I know that? I can proudly say this Eagle Scout, Adam Johnson is my grandson.



Every year, Shriners Hospitals for Children selects two National Patient Ambassadors to represent the health care system's patients. The ambassadors spend the year telling their stories of perseverance in the face of adversity and the ways Shriners Hospitals for Children has made a dramatic, life-changing difference in their lives. The new national patient ambassadors were introduced during the premiere of their documentary called Free to be Me as part of Shriners International's annual convention, known as Imperial Session.

Isabella Rose

From birth, Isabella had difficulty feeding and sleeping. Her parents, Roselyne and Tim, went from doctor to doctor seeking answers, but no one could identify a cause. As she grew, her parents became convinced that something was seriously wrong. Isabella's speech sounded like she was whistling and she had ear and sinus infections constantly.

Searching for answers

For five years, Roselyne and Tim sought answers for their little girl but continued to be unable to

obtain even a cause or a diagnosis. Some professionals thought Isabella was cognitively impaired; others thought she was deaf. One day a family friend in the Chicago area heard about the issues Isabella was facing and suggested the family apply for treatment for Isabella at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago. The family did not know at the time that their friend Dick Anderson was a member of Medinah Shriners and, at the time, Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Shriners Hospital in Chicago. Anderson was glad to be of help. He has said that helping Isabella and her family find the help they needed was life-changing, and that he wished all the Shriners understood the impact they can have on the health care system's patients and families.

At their first appointment, an interdisciplinary team of professionals assessed Isabella and, within minutes, provided a diagnosis. Isabella had a submucous cleft palate, a form of cleft palate that is not easily identifiable, as the palate is covered by a thin membrane. "It felt like the whole world came down on us; we finally knew the diagnosis," said Roselyne. Isabella was scheduled for surgery to repair the cleft and subsequently received speech therapy for two years.

Finding her own voice

Isabella, now 14, lives in Florida with her family. She has gone from struggling to be understood to becoming a gifted vocalist and hopes to perform professionally one day. Isabella volunteers at a local veterinary hospital, pet sits and babysits. She enjoys painting, poetry and outdoor activities. She also actively seeks ways to give back to Shriners Hospitals for Children.



Free to be Me: Emily's Story - 2017-2018 National Patient Ambassador

Emily Mellish

Emily's mother, Joy, did not experience significant issues during pregnancy, but moments after Emily was born, that changed. Emily was rushed by ambulance to a hospital in a larger city only hours after

birth, and spent her first two weeks in the NICU, where doctors gave her a complete assessment.

Emily was born with spina bifida, as well as severe scoliosis (missing eight ribs on her left side) a leg-length discrepancy, additional orthopaedic conditions, bladder and kidney problems and other issues. When she was 6 weeks old, Emily had surgery to close the defect over her spinal cord. The following day, a long list of serious complications began, keeping her in the hospital for 28 days. During this time, the Mellishes learned about Shriners Hospitals for Children from a close friend. "It was comforting to know that even before I needed to worry about a place to take her orthopaedcally, that someone had come forward and said there was place where Emily would be taken care of," said Joy.

Finding the right team

Emily was first seen at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie when she was approximately 6 months old. There, she

has undergone several surgeries. Other surgeries, including a VEPTR (vertical expandable prosthetic titanium rib) procedure, which stabilizes the spinal curve and levels growth, were done through a collaboration between Shriners Hospitals for Children and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Emily has also been seen at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia, where external fixators were used to straighten Emily's leg at the knee, and increase leg length.

After this, she was able to ride a bicycle for the very first time. Emily always amazes her doctors with her "no limits" attitude.

Giving back with Beads for Needs

Today, Emily is an energetic and sociable 11-year-old. She loves dancing, swimming, painting pottery and public speaking. In 2012, she started Beads for Needs, a foundation dedicated to raising funds for Shriners Hospitals for Children through bracelet and photograph print sales, and has raised more than \$80,000 for Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie. Without Shriners Hospitals for Children, Emily would not be Emily, she would be forced into a box," said Joy. "With Shriners Hospitals there are no limits to what she can do."
