


What is a mystery dinner?



Tabs Collection Supports "For the Love of a Child"

Since 1923 the Shrine Women's General Assembly "For the Love of a Child" continues to provide childhood memories during a challenging time in a child's life. Lorraine Schluter, Augusta, WI has been gathering tabs through the Osseo-Fairchild schools for the last 3 years. Schluter said the collection started when she put a photo of a Shrine Hospital patient in a wheelchair with a sign asking for the tabs along side the schools other collection projects. The idea started slowly, but this year she has been able to turn in a quart bags full of tabs each month. In April a third grade student turned in a large tub full.

The tabs help the auxiliary to fund wheelchair purchase, repair, and upgrade wheelchairs for the kids. One wheelchair costs between \$5000 and \$16000. The Women's General Auxiliary for the Twin Cities Shrine Hospital has a goal of \$100,000 to fund the purchase of wheelchairs. Schluter is grateful for the support of the Osseo-Fairchild school in assisting in the attainment of this goal.

Schluter has volunteered in the Osseo-Fairchild Elementary Foster Grandparent Program for 22 years. Along with the tab collection, she made 40 tray favors every month for several years. A few times the school Art Class assisted in making them.

The Eau Claire Auxiliary meets every 3rd Monday at 12:30 at Dove South, Eau Claire. Membership is open to all individuals who would like to make a difference for a child being served at the Shrine


