

Collected 67 total prom dresses for the Shriners Hospitals for Children Twin Cities.


Thank you, ladies for all your hard work and efforts that went into collecting these beautiful dresses for such a wonderful cause.
















The big circuses are behind us and it seems, I have been working on these for years. Bob Sands our promoter decided he was going to retire after many, many years of excellent service to


