During the evening, Cheryl Hoffman presented Pearl Christensen with a beautiful plant as a token of their appreciation for all she has done for the Auxiliary.

I don't think that will change but I think as we continue to lose membership we will continue to support our hospitals financially but less hands on with our transportation. Our older Shriners are not able to go on 14 to 16 hour day trips and we may see more use of public transportation for our patients. We are also going to see more use of local clinics doing the follow up visits which will eliminate a lot of the traveling into those big cities. I see fewer Shriners getting together for good meals and fellowship but less parading and more family involvement in our recreational endeavors. Maybe this is just a short term thing, who knows, and the next epidemic like polio may change Shriners forever. I am encouraged by the new Shriners I have met that they will continue our overall goal of having fun with a purpose. They are eager to help out and that is welcomed by those of us who are not able to do as much anymore.

I'm also encouraged by their ideas on how to raise money as our current methods seem to be falling short of our goals. We are all aware of the push to change the circus and of course as it has changed so has the revenue it generates and this means we will need new fundraising endeavors in the near future. Some of our clubs are raising more money with local food events than Zor raises with our Gun Raffle or Variety Shows, and while we aren't looking to stop doing these right away we do see a need to bring on new fundraisers that bring in more money.

Well enough for my predictions, thanks to all of you for everything you do that makes Shriners the Greatest Philanthropy in the World and thanks to all of you you helped make 2016 a really great year.






## Message from Zor's First Lady




