



News from Cincinnati

2016 Burn Awareness Week

Burn Awareness Week is February 1-7, and the *American Burn Association* is focusing on scald prevention this year. Scald injuries are the most common injury in children under the age of two. This demonstrates that the need for burn education is still out there.

The Facts:

- · The average annual cost of scald injuries is \$44 million
- Over 136,000 children were seen in emergency rooms for burn injuries in 2011
- 1100 children die each year from fire and burns

What to do if a burn occurs:

- · Cool the burn with COOL (not cold) water to stop the burning process
- Remove all clothing and/or diaper from the injured area
- · Cover the area with a clean dry sheet or bandage
- · Seek medical attention

Here are some tips to prevent burn injuries:

DO

Set the water heater temperature to 120°F

Keep hot food and liquids away from the edges of counters and tables

Place pots and pans on back burners with handles turned away from stove edges

DO NOT

Leave a child unattended in the bathtub

Allow your children to adjust the water temperature or sit near faucet handles

Set anything hot on tabletops within reach of young children who can pull them down


