St. Croix Valley Shrine Club discuss plans

At the regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors of the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club, President Larry Wiegand and his committees finalized plans for the coming year activities.

The Club lived up to its reputation as the premier Shrine Club in the state by reporting on several new initiatives designed to offer additional support to the Shriners Hospital for Children*.

In addition to the clubs annual Little East West Shrine Game in October, they also are in the process of adding two more fund raising/support projects. Among them is an idea used in the past but brought back with a fresh spin by new Noble Tyler Behr. In Ty's plan, Nobles will be asked to bring in teddy bears to be given to the Auxiliary for the children at the hospital. Plans so far include making little St. Croix Valley vests for the bears to identify the club making the donation.

Noble Helmer also passed out special stickers provided by Noble Jack Thomas. The stickers will be placed on jars and coffee cans and distributed throughout the Valley to collect Pop Tops for the Shrine Auxiliary. The tops are used to fund wheel chairs at the Hospital.

The St. Croix Valley Shrine Club reported on last year's Hospital Day/Trout Pond. Past Potentate Larry Riemenschneider said last year's event was held under the protective covering of the parking garage and was very successful. The combined events will again be co-hosted by Zor and Osman Shrine on Hospital Day of May 16th. The club voted to donate \$1,000 to the event.

Jerry Hauschildt, the leading Shrine recruiter and head of the annual Onion Sales, gave his report saying the onions are coming along fine. The Vidalia onions will appear a week later than last year due to dry weather in the south.

The Zor Roadrunners Captain Jerry Wilkens reported their first practice is planned for Wednesday, April 29 at the New Richmond Legion Club, followed by later practices to be ready for the 2015 parade season. Increased Shrine membership has resulted in newer members wishing to become drivers. New members will need practices before they can join the parade unit.

Roger Keller, the new chairman of the Little East West Shrine game, explained some new ideas for the upcoming event on October 2 & 3rd. Included is the Potentates Banquet on Friday, Oct. 2nd at Junior's in the downtown River Falls Best Western Plus Hotel. The new features of the event will include special goody bags given to attendees that will be custom decorated by the children at the Shriners Hospital for Children. The banquet will also have a custom made ice sculpture with expanded menu complete with appetizers. The traditional event will help celebrate the University Homecoming with a joint parade, Shrine units from all over the Upper Midwest and a Shriners Grand Marshal.



Every Shriner must pay these dues annually (unless they're a perpetual member)

- Zor's annual membership dues are \$70.00 per year based on following:
 - \$50.00 Temple dues (Zor's dues) are (This amount may vary from Temple to Temple)
 - \$5.00 Hospital (Dues are the same for each Temple)
 - \$15.00 Imperial per capita (The same for each Temple)
- Associate dues for Zor are \$50.00
- Perpetual members may make a one-time payment for life.
- Perpetual dues for 2015 would total \$1600.00 based on the following:
 - \$1000.00 Zor's annual dues (20 years times \$50.00)
 - \$150.00 Hospital (30 years x \$5.00)
 - \$450.00- Imperial per capita (30 years x \$15.00)
- A noble cannot be in arrears to pay the \$1600.00
- Nobles that owe for this year are in arrears \$70.00
- Therefore they would need to remit \$1670.00

A special thank you to all who continue to support my "pop tab" project. Started in 2000 as a local fund raiser then presented to



the General Auxiliary at Twin Cities in 2002 for other groups to consider; it has grown and provided many thousands of dollars for our "kids". Both Twin cities and Chicago now have picked up the project at the hospitals as well as many of the Auxiliaries. We just had a local man bring us 264,000 all bagged and labeled - Yes, he counted them!

Since 2000, we have recycled over 10,000 pounds and raised over \$6000 from our garage. As a side note, the gray colored tabs on soup and vegetable cans are steel. We must go through every bag or bottle with a magnet and take out all steel and other items then place in larger containers so we get the best price at the recyclers. Thanks again and keep the tabs coming to help the wheel chairs roll!

They were joined by Chief Rabban Bob Giesler and Lady Pat along with Oriental Guide Wally Trouten and Lady Gayle. The day started out with hospital tours and a lunch in the Activity Mall.

After lunch, the Chairman of the Chicago Hospital Board of Governors William R. Kuehn welcomed the guests from the Divans of the various temples that support the Chicago Hospital. He also recognized the Potentates from the Temples in attendance. Hospital Chief of Staff Dr. Jeffrey D. Ackman and Occupational Therapist Kate Nikolai shared not just one, but two patient success stories. Douglas E. Maxwell, President and CEO of Shriners Hospital for Children updated everyone on what is happening system wide and a surprise announcement for the hospital and guests. The Chicago hospital is one of the first to receive an EOS imaging system. The EOS system provides full-body images of patients in a natural standing or seated position in both 2D and 3D. The system also delivers a radiation dose that has been measured to be nine times lower than that of computed radiography X-ray1 and 20 times lower than basic CT scans2 in accordance with the ALARA (As Low As Reasonably Achievable) principle of radiation reduction. For these reasons, the EOS system is the ideal mode of imaging for

monitoring the treatment of pediatric scoliosis patients like those who seek treatment at Shriners Hospitals.

Also announced was the use of the ReWalk Device. ReWalk is a wearable robotic exoskeleton that provides powered hip and knee motion to enable individuals with Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) to stand upright and walk. It is always uplifting to hear about all of the advancements and success stories that our hospitals are making in the treatment of our patients.

The attendees were also provided with folders that describe the various services provided to patients at the Chicago Hospital.
