Former Shrine patient turned basketball star is Parade Grand Marshal

To see him on the basketball court you would never know this polite young man had been a patient at the Shriners Hospital for Children® in the Twin Cities.

Marcus Kadinger of Downing, Wisconsin was born with an under developed left arm.

His story started at birth when his doctors told his parents Mike and Jodi Kadinger their son did not have a left hand. After several consultations, the Kadingers brought young Marcus to Shriners Hospital for Children®. He was fitted with a prosthesis developed along with his growing body.

While at the hospital Marcus was introduced to an intern that made a connection with him and got him used to wearing a prosthesis. He attended Camp Achievement several times spending time with other children in similar situations. Seeing other kids, some older than he, made him see there is nothing he could not do.

In fact, Marcus now only wears his prosthesis for two things, kayaking and lifting weights. The prosthesis guy at Shriners helped him with his weight lifting in 6th grade.

Marcus' parents got him signed up for Saturday morning basketball in the 1st grade and he just loved it. By the time he entered 3rd grade he was scrimmaging with the team and he was good at it.

His father Mike couched the boys in 5th and 6th grade. Marcus played on an AAU Team summer league. They called themselves "Magic". He did well. One game after 8th grade, Marcus scored 31 points. He is a natural athlete playing football, track and field and "played good" as he modestly said. Good enough to be named MVP in track as a miler, 400 meters and high jump but basketball was his first love.

As a freshman his team won 2 games. As a sophomore they won 7 games and by the time he was a junior his team went on to win 13 games and went on to the playoffs. By his senior year, Marcus was a starter and his team won 14 games and only lost in the second title game at state.

Marcus remembers one game against Somerset was his best. There was a writer in the stands, two scouts from Marian College and his entire family. His team was down by 18 at half time. In the second half they poured in 20 points and came back to win in the closing seconds. As Marcus said "It was the highlight of me athletic career."

The feature, done on "Life to the Max" was posted on You Tube under number 209.

His plans for the future include earning a degree in sports management and psychology. Due to his Shrine experience and the influence of Kevin Monson, a Clear Lake athlete his father introduced him to. Monson too had a missing a left hand and had been a patient at Shriners in 1970. Marcus said "he helped me feel comfortable wearing his prosthesis and helped me feel normal." Today, Marcus has all kinds of friends around town and in school and truly feels comfortable with his life.

Marcus pays a big compliment to his parents for treating him like a normal athletic son. He has learned to be comfortable meeting people without fear. This was the lesson he learned not only from his parents, but also the people at Shriners.

For Marcus Kadinger, the ideal job out of college would be serving as an intern at the Shriners Hospital for Children® to help others in similar situations face life with confidence and courage.

Little East West Shrine Game

Marcus and his family will be guests at the Little East West Shrine Game Potentates Banquet on Friday, October 2nd at Juniors at the Best Western Plus in downtown River Falls. The following day he will take his place at the head of the Shrine/UW RF Homecoming parade. Marcus will also be introduced before the Homecoming Game on Saturday afternoon

The event is the major funding source for the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club. Proceeds raised go to fraternal charities, which includes the Shriners Hospital for Children®.

Tickets for the game go on sale soon and can be purchased from any Shriner in the St. Croix Valley.

AWARD OF MERIT RULES

This award is presented for dedicated and exemplary voluntary service to Zor Shriners and to the Shriner's philanthropy, the Shriners Hospitals for Children®, over a minimum of five years.

Recognition for outstanding service to Shrine Clubs or Units solely shall be the responsibility of those bodies and the nominee shall not be eligible for the Award of Merit recognition as they do not meet the guidelines. The Award shall preferably be presented to Nobles not otherwise recognized as serving on the Divan or by appointment to prominent positions.

No member of the Zor Divan or past member of the Divan will be eligible for consideration until at least five years following his being on the Divan. Then only for Voluntary Service that is within Zor's sphere of influence.

To nominate your candidate, please provide a nomination letter describing why you feel this Noble is deserving of this award, i.e., what activities he has participated in, what offices has he held with the club/unit, how has he contributed to the shrine philanthropy, how has he been involved with helping children, etc.

Your nomination letter should be forwarded to the Zor Shriners office NO LATER THAN November 1, 2015.


