In the U.S., electrical burns and injuries from lightning result in approximately 3,000 admissions to specialized burn units annually, and result in about 1,000 fatalities. In addition, electrical fires in residences cause more than 25,000 fires annually.

Remembering a few basic safety tips can help keep you and your children safe.

In Your Home, Especially if Young Children are Present:

- Place covers on all electrical outlets.
- Unplug all electrical items within a child's reach.
- Do not allow toys that must be plugged into an outlet.
- Teach your children to never touch electrical outlets or play with electrical cords.

In Your Home, for Everyone's Safety:

- Use extreme caution when using electrical appliances near water.
- Do not overload electrical outlets.
- Replace electrical items that show signs of wear, such as frayed wires.
- Keep your clothes dryer free of lint accumulation to avoid it becoming a fire hazard.
- If you are in or standing in water, do not touch anything electrical.
- Do not use extension cords to plug in appliances.
- Plug items in appropriately (do not force a three-prong plug into a two-prong outlet).
- Use certified surge protectors and power strips.
- Keep clothes, curtains, and other flammable items away from heat sources.
- Use correct wattage light bulbs.

And Outside, Remember to:

- Come indoors and remain there during an electrical storm (one with lightning strikes).
- Never play near electrical wires.
- Stay away from areas marked DANGER: HIGH VOLTAGE.
- Never climb utility poles, transmission towers, etc.
- Do not climb trees that are near power lines.
- Do not throw anything at utility poles or wires.
- Only fly kites in dry weather and in open spaces. If your kite does get caught in an electrical wire, call the electric company for help.

Contact a Qualified Electrician:

- If you have recurring instances of blown fuses or tripping circuit breakers
- If you experience a tingling feeling when touching an electrical tool or appliance
- If your outlets or switches are warm or discolored
- If there is a burning or rubber-like smell coming from an appliance
- If you have flickering lights
- If there are sparks coming from an outlet
- If wall outlets are cracked or broken

Raised a Master Mason in 1939 at Vincennes, Ind., Lodge #1, Skelton was a member of both the Scottish and York Rites. In 1969, he received the honorary 33rd degree and in 1995 received the



Chief Rabban Monte Steiber: The Midwest Shrine Association meeting was held in Sioux Falls, SD on February 21 - 22. All 14 Temples were in attendance. This is a great opportunity to meet with the Nobles and Divan members of the other Temples in the Midwest, and find out what programs they have for membership growth as well as what fund raisers they are running. Doug Maxwell, Past Imperial Potentate and chairman of the Shriners Hospitals for Children was in attendance and gave an update on the hospitals as well as the status of the "Wounded Warrior Project". Many of the Temples have the same issues and the synergy of working together on solutions leaves one with a positive attitude when we depart for home. There were several breakout sessions to attend (18 in total) on Friday afternoon. The representatives from Zor split up and attended the sessions that had the most interest to Zor. Monte Steiber and Bob Giesler attended the Budget & Financial Planning Session.

Details and information for the Summer MSA is also presented at the Winter Session. As part of the membership program, several Temples are challenging another Temple on who can initiate the most members for this calendar year. Zor Temple has challenged the Osman Temple of St. Paul. If Zor wins, then the Osman reps at next year's Winter Session have to wear cheese heads, and, if Osman takes in more members (on a percentage basis), then the Zor reps have to wear the Viking helmet with the horns and braids. Therefore, the challenge is now to bring in new Nobles so that next year's Potentate does not have to wear the Viking helmet at the Winter Session in Fargo, ND. We need everyone's help in order to be successful.

Assistant Rabban Bob Giesler: The only thing that I would add would be the numerous comments about Units no longer parading and the statements from nearly every Temple that indicate that young

(under 50) members are not interested in parading. I think we are seeing the end of an era and the beginning of a new emphasis that is still evolving. Zor will soon be accepting Pay Pal for Dues and Zor events.

High Priest & Prophet Chuck Miller: The meeting was beneficial to me for a couple reasons. 1. The conversations in the van going to and from the event bonded the elected Divan which helps us concentrate on the same issues. 2. Met new counter parts and we shared ideas on membership, circus, and MSA's. 3. All the Membership ideas coming from everyone on committees, Nobles, Divans, members, and Imperial Shriners - this alone was worth the trip.

Oriental Guide Gary Cuskey: It was interesting to hear the report from Douglas Maxwell, Past Imperial Potentate and current Chairman, Shriners Hospitals for Children, regarding the activities, changes, and contemplated changes being made in the hospitals. Further, it was good to hear firsthand info regarding the Shriners Hospital's association with Mayo Clinic and the potential association with the Wounded Warriors Project. In a break-out session dealing with temple fundraising, it was motivating to hear the types of events and activities that other temples, as well as their clubs and units, are doing in an effort to raise funds.

First MAGEC® surgery in the United States completed at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia

Health Care System Pioneers Innovative Pediatric Spine Surgery

The newest treatment being offered for young children with scoliosis curves too large for bracing is the MAGEC (MAGnetic Expansion Control) Spinal Bracing and Distraction System. Children worldwide are affected by scoliosis, or a curvature of the spine and Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Philadelphia has an extensive scoliosis program that is designed to treat all forms of the condition, using every tool available.

In the past, these large and potentially life-threatening curves were treated with traditional growing rods, which require a moderate surgical procedure for implantation, then a smaller procedure every six months to lengthen the spine. Although the lengthening procedures are relatively minor, they still involve general anesthesia, anxiety and discomfort. The MAGEC rods are an alternative to the emotionally and physically painful treatment regimen of the traditional growing rods. With MAGEC rods, there is still a moderate procedure for implantation, but the non-invasive lengthening procedure eliminates the need for repeated lengthening surgeries. This results in significant safety, health, mental and physical benefits for the child and their family. Patients will also be able to get back to their activities of daily living sooner with this surgical option.

After the initial MAGEC surgery, this specially designed rod can be gradually lengthened from outside of the skin, and in the exam room, avoiding the need for general anesthesia and an incision, with the External Remote Control (ERC). Magnets outside the body contained in the ERC device communicate with the magnets of the implanted rods. The ERC is a portable, hand-held unit that uses permanent magnets to automatically modify the length of the growing rod through the touch of a button. The ERC will be used a few times a year as the child continues to grow.

“The MAGEC system is a game-changer in early onset scoliosis care. We expect that it will decrease the number of surgeries these young patients have to undergo.



The decrease in surgeries will translate into decreased complication rates,” said Philadelphia Shriners Hospital orthopaedic surgeons, Patrick J. Cahill, M.D., and Harold J.P. van Bosse M.D., regarding this historic case.

The first patient to benefit from this procedure is Tianni Swint, a 4 year old with infantile scoliosis and Prader-Willi syndrome, from Brooklyn, N. Y. Her parents, James Swint and Shakema George, did a lot of research to seek out the best option for Tianni. They welcomed this new innovative option to aid in their daughter's treatment for scoliosis.

The spine team members at the Philadelphia Shriners Hospital are known for being pioneers in the newest cutting-edge technology for spine care. Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia is proud to have completed the first surgery using the MAGEC system in the United States since the FDA granted 510K clearances on February 27, 2014.
