

Leaving our total membership at 1540 regular members and 13 Associates for a total of 1527 members. C. Miller moved acceptance of the report and seconded by J. Harker. Motion Carried.

J. Stelsel, Recorder, read the names of 14 Nobles whose deaths were reported in the second quarter of 2014 and J. Harker gave a prayer for the departed Nobles.

Committee Reports:

Trustees Report:

J. Harker reported the trustees have voted to replace the roof on our building which is 28 years old. The

new pad for parking the catering vehicles and patio pad in front of the temple has been completed. The Trustees are reviewing the lighting throughout the building to save energy, we still have a few problems with Hyvee catering. G. Cuskey move acceptance of the report and seconded by D. Olson. Motion Carried. Note: The issue of why the POW Flag has not been put up was raised and it agreed this should be done as soon as possible.

Calendar Sales:

M. Steiber reported the calendars have been delivered to the Clubs & Uints and all should be sold and the money turned in by December 5, 2014.

Twin Cities Hospital Report: B. Ausen read the report submitted by R. Rommel, member of the TCH Board, during the Imperial Session Joe Dertinger one of our TCH patients is one of the National Patient Ambassadors and will spend the year traveling to various events and activities to represent every single one of our patients. A business plan for dental services is being developed and will be brought to the Board at the August meeting which are needed by many of our patients. Year to date donations were \$294,000 compared to \$372,000 last year. There were 127 new donors in the month of June. A Noble visited the hospital during the Imperial Session and presented a check on the amount of \$300,000 in exchange for a Charitable Gift Annuity. During the Imperial Session 900 visitors visited the TCH. The Walk for Love had approximately 800 walkers and raised over \$70,000 in gross receipts. One of our Out Patients parent answered our surveys and stated "My child couldn't be in better hands" and stated how wonderful the Physicians & Staff were, how they listened to questions and provided explanations, the centralized coordination of care, ability to see specialists, and the patient heaving a single clinic room. J. Harker moved the report be accepted and

seconded by D. Olson. Motion Carried. **Old Business:**

S. Peterson P.P. reported the total income from the shows was \$25,858.45 with the Clubs & Units receiving \$12,858.45 and Zor receiving \$12,716.90. Thanks also the Clowns who attended the various shows. Thanks to Bob Sands Promotions for the telemarking and promotion for Zor and looking forward to continue the shows in 2015. S. What To Do In Wisconsin Dells, WI...In December 2014

It's early September. Summer still has a few official weeks left before Fall takes over. The weather is great -still in the 70s and 80s during the day with abundant sunshine. Badger and Packer games are happening and one can still tailgate in short sleeve shirts. Very few are thinking beyond September.
