on January 12, 2013 prior to the Installation of


The 3rd Annual After-Easter Leaster bowling tournament is back for more fun AGAIN this year. The Southwestern WI Shrine Clubs special event is Saturday April 6th at Pioneer Lanes, 1185 Hwy 151, Platteville, WI. Only \$20 per player entry fee. 3 per lanes - Singles Scratch. 1 p.m. start time. Walk-ins will be honored and mocked.

The object of the game is to get the lowest score. The purpose of Low Ball is to practice on your 7 and 10 pins and to practice focusing on a specific target. You want to get the lowest score, but there is a catch. Here are the rules for Low Ball:

- 10 frame gameBall must hit at least one pin
- Every gutter ball or zero (0) count = +10 to final score
- Lowest score wins

In Low Ball, bowling strikes and spares are scored exactly the same way you

would score a strike or spare in a regular game of bowling. At least one pin needs to be knocked down. A perfect game in low ball is a twenty (20). Meaning that one pin is knocked over on each of the two balls per frame in the score. To get the lowest possible score, aim for the 7 and 10 pin each frame. If you knock down 4 pins on your first ball, you want to try to hit only one of the remaining six pins down. If you knock down 6 pins on your first ball, you want to try to hit only one of the remaining 4 pins and so on. A gutter ball will be recorded as a strike if it is on the first ball in a frame. If on the second ball you do throw a gutter ball, it will score as a spare. You've got to knock or topple over at least one pin on each thrown ball to get a low score. Therefore, this version of the game is quite a challenge. If there is a tie, there will be a 5 frame bowl off.



# Patient Creates Local Support through "Curvy Girls"

Shriners Hospitals for Children® provides treatment for all types and levels of scoliosis, a musculoskeletal disorder that causes an abnormal curve of the spine. Our pediatric orthopaedic surgeons are especially skilled and able to provide care to children needing complex surgeries to correct their scoliosis. One patient receiving expert care from Shriners Hospitals for Children for this condition is Camille Tharpe from Shreveport, La.

When Camille was first diagnosed with scoliosis at age 10, the realities of how treatment might affect her seemed to be a distant issue. On the verge of entering the challenging social constructs of preteen life, she approached her condition with a cautious, yet optimistic, outlook.

Upon her first visit to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Shreveport, Camille's medical team began monitoring the development of her spine. While initial visits yielded positive results, later examinations indicated movement and changes consistent with additional curvature in her spine. Camille was informed she would require a back brace running from her hips to her shoulders to prevent further curvature.

"My reaction was kind of what other preteen or teenagers' reactions would be – absolutely terrified," she said. According to Anthony Sin, M.D., a neurosurgeon providing spine care at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Shreveport, concerns about physical appearance are common among those undergoing care for scoliosis.

#### Looking for Support

Immediately after learning she would require a brace, Camille and her mother, Christine, searched for support outlets online. Their search led them to Curvy Girls, a national scoliosis support group founded by Long Island teenager and scoliosis patient Leah Stoltz. By that evening, Camille had spoken with Stoltz on the phone, and her focus had already begun to change toward the positive.

"That was a total turnaround moment and she was ready to embrace wearing her brace after that phone call," Christine said. "Girls need to have someone they can talk to about wearing a back brace 23 hours a day, the clothes you wear with a brace and how to just get through the day."

With the support of the national organization, Camille set out this past summer to form the first Curvy Girls chapter in Louisiana. Through fliers, media appearances and promotion to local physicians' offices, Camille generated enough interest to host her first local Curvy Girls meeting.

Attended by local scoliosis patients and several parents, the inaugural meeting had an important impact on Camille.

"The major thing I took away from our first meeting is that I'm helping these girls, but they're helping me so much and they're encouraging me to be braver and more open," said Camille. Shriners Hospitals for Children is pleased to be

# **Another Banner Year at the Alliant Energy Center**

Circus Chairman John Thorstad is pleased with the results of this year's circus, as we have had 2 years in a row with great circus attending weather. No snow, sleet, or freezing rain. The final profit check has been turned over to the office with a total net profit of \$127,000.00. (2nd best year in recent history

Total attendance was 31,497 for the 6 shows. The Saturday 2:30 p.m. show had the largest crowd with 7211 and the Friday night show with 3629 was the smallest. It is a record setter when you have to set up folding chairs on the arena floor to handle the walk-in crowds.

"A tip of the fez" for the great support this year, many hands and great idea's make things run smooth, and Chairman John thanks everyone for pitching in. "First, I must always thank my wife Debbi for all she does with the ticket counting and with the food purchases. 2nd to Mark Severson and Bob Sands who attended meetings with the new AEC Executive Director Mark Clarke while I worked and got a few positive changes to our current contract which helps both Zor and the Carden Circus. Next comes the program bicycle door prize donor's: Directors Staff, Mini Cars, Camel patrol, Madison Clowns, Road Runners, Midgets, Wranglers, Funsters, and the following clubs: Sahara, Madison, Southwestern Wi., Lakeland, Mound View, Green county, Wild River, St. Croix Valley, and Indianhead plus the Divan and Past Potentates. And to the Pipes and Drums who again purchased all the bicycle helmets for all the winners. And lastly, thanks to all who "bit the bullet" and did not request a refund on their parking stub which saved us approx. \$ 600.00."

As for the elephants – we had several PETA, Alliance for Animals, and Dane County Supervisors who purchased tickets and came to watch the animals during the show and for the rides at intermission with camera's and note pads. We had several Shriners positioned around the rings who kept a watchful eye with no major problems reported.

Zor had to rebill 11 members who used their tickets and had not paid for them totaling \$638.00. Medical report from Sunday night's motorcycle accident: after being transported to the hospital, they were back later that night to help with the final loading of equipment. Ring master Joseph Bauer took 2 weeks off, the girl on the back of the cycle performed the following night in the Danville, Illinois, and the cycle driver finished off the Sunday night performance. 
