139th Imperial Session Now History

The 139th Imperial Session was held in Indianapolis June 28 – July 4, 2013. Representing Zor were Potentate Bob Gorsuch, Chief Rabban Larry Hanson, Assistant Rabban Monte Steiber, and High Priest & Prophet Bob Giesler. Also attending from Zor were Treasurer Dale Olson, Recorder Jim Stelsel, PP John Thorstad, PP Mark Severson, PP Earl Buehler, PP Steve Peterson, and PP Bob Kaschel. All except Olson were accompanied by their ladies. It was also an honor to have Grand Master Dan Slavik and his Lady, Laura, in attendance and attending most of our business and social events. PP Earl Buehler received his Emeritus standing in the hospital

corporation. He earned this recognition by attending 16 consecutive Imperial sessions.

Per usual, the highlight of the week was the public relations presentation. It is at this time the two patient ambassadors for the coming year are introduced. This is always a Kleenex event as there is not a dry eye during the presentation as we hear the story of how our hospitals and staff change the lives of young people.

The legislative item that created the most buzz and debate was the resolution to permit Shriners in Arkansas to be Shriners without the prerequisite requirement of being a Mason. It passed with over two thirds vote of the over 800 voting

delegates. This only pertains to Arkansas. There were a total of 34 resolutions to be considered. 3 of them were withdrawn. Of the remaining 31 resolutions 22 passed and 9 failed.

Over 600 clowns led the parade down Meridian Street on July 1. While it fell

short of the Guinness Book of Records for number of parading clowns, it was the largest number to ever be involved in a Shrine parade. 14 clowns from Zorland paraded.

Next year's Imperial session will be held in Minneapolis July 6 – 10, 2014.

To nominate your candidate, please provide a nomination letter describing why you feel this Noble is deserving of this award, i.e., what activities he has participated in, what offices has he held with the club/unit, how has he contributed to the shrine philanthropy, how has he been involved with helping children, etc.

Shriner Finds a Creative Way to Promote the Health Care System

One reason Shriners International has been such a remarkable fraternity for so many years is its members' dedication and passion for their philanthropy. Every year, Shriners spend countless hours raising funds for and volunteering at Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

One example of someone with this kind of devotion is Charles Gregory of Houston. Gregory was raised a Mason in 1993 and joined Arabia Shriners in 2011. He is part of a Shriner legacy that includes his grandfather, his father and uncle.

“I became a Shriner because I always wanted to do everything I could to help people and leave the world a better place” said Gregory. “At the same time, I get to be around great men who share those same values.”

Gregory is the Vice President, COO and General Counsel of Royal Recycle

and Disposal. He joined the company in 2001 and helped it grow into one of the largest independently-owned residential haulers in the Houston metropolitan area. Gregory has a law degree and worked as a commercial and corporate litigator before joining Royal Disposal.

Since becoming a Shriner, Gregory wanted to figure out a way to generate more exposure for the philanthropy and the fraternity. He developed the idea of using one of his trucks as a moving billboard for Shriners Hospitals for Children. The truck features the health care system's logo with scattered hand prints in vibrant primary colors.

“When I was a kid all I knew about the Shriners were the circuses they would perform in,” said Gregory. “My hope is that the truck will encourage the younger



generation to find out more information about who we are and the work we do.”

The moving billboard travels 170 miles a day, six times a week, on busy highways and through affluent neighborhoods in the Houston area. Last July, the truck made an appearance at the Board of Governors meetings at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston and Galveston. The truck will also be available at local

Shriner parades and other fundraising events.

Gregory knows the \$6,000 he spent out of his own pocket for the project was well worth every penny.

“I can't think of a better way to give recognition to both organizations,” said Gregory. “My plan is to add more trucks with the logo and have them available in other cities.”

Introducing our 2013-14 National Patient Ambassadors

Olivia Stamps of Batesburg, S.C., and Brendon Wiseley of Tulsa, Okla., have been selected as the health care system's national patient ambassadors for 2013-2014. The announcement was made on July 3, 2013, after the premiere of their video, "Walking toward Endless Possibilities" during the Imperial Session of Shriners International in Indianapolis.

Every year, Shriners Hospitals for Children® chooses two national patient ambassadors to represent the thousands of children who receive care at the health care system every year. The Ambassadors share their stories to inspire others and raise awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children.



Meet Olivia and Brendon:

Olivia has cerebral palsy, which affects her mobility. She was originally diagnosed at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago, but since moving to South Carolina, she has been cared for by the Shriners Hospital in Greenville, S.C.

Olivia has benefited from Shriners Hospitals' expertise in treating the orthopaedic effects of cerebral palsy and in movement analysis. In the movement analysis laboratories, available at 12 Shriners Hospitals facilities, high-speed cameras, reflective markers, force platforms and muscle sensors combine to record and measure how a child with a mobility impairment is moving. A team of medical professionals can then determine the best treatment plan to help the child improve.

After reviewing the data from Olivia's analysis, her team recommended surgery to lengthen her heel cords and hamstrings. After surgery at age 6 and rehabilitative therapy, Olivia, now 10, has a perfect walking gait and can run, dance, jump on a trampoline, ride a bicycle and keep up with her peers.

Brendon is Back on the Track

Brendon loves to race. In fact, he was on the track in a micro junior car when he was 5, and is a track favorite in his hometown of Tulsa, Okla.

His ability to participate in the sport he loves nearly came to a quick end when he was 7 years old, and was injured in an accident involving a lawn mower. Although he lost a leg, the expertise of the prosthetics staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Shreveport and the health care system's commitment to personalized attention and care combined to get Brendon back on track. Brendon is able to race again – the only difference – now he passes his helmet to collect donations for Shriners Hospitals.

The stories of Olivia and Brendon are representative of the successes that can be found throughout the 22-facility Shriners Hospitals for Children health care system. We applaud their achievements, and those of all the patients they represent in their roles as National Patient Ambassadors. Shriners Hospitals for Children is pleased to have been able to help them on their journey toward life's endless possibilities.
