







Shrine Circus Elephant Information

Some of you may have heard that the Dane County Board's Public Works and Transportation (PW&T) Committee is considering an amendment to its ordinances that would ban elephants at Dane County owned properties. Clearly, this would affect the Zor Shriners Circus held in Dane County's Coliseum.

In Mid-December, a PW&T committee hearing was held and the amendment issue has been postponed until a January meeting. Circus Chair John Thorstad and Co-Chair Mark Severson are working with Zor's attorney and other professionals to

address this situation. At this time, we believe that this will not have an impact on the 2012 circus and we are planning to host the elephants at the circus. The Circus committee has implemented an email campaign with Dane County Nobles to contact their supervisor to oppose the amendment. It is a team effort - it's a "360 program" because we take care of the kids all the way around and you are a part of that. It's delightful that you had Carol and me out here and we'd love to do it again. For the new members, have fun and help the kids. That's what it's all about. God bless you and keep up the good work.'

"First off, I would like to congratulate the Master Masons who have become Zor's newest Shriners," said Ill. Bob Morrison. "When you young guys reach my age, you're going to look back, and, in the top 10 list of your favorite moments, Shrine is going to be there. Get involved and enjoy yourselves.'

"Today was an exciting day and for a number of reasons," said Imperial Sir Gary Bergenske. "I want to start off by saying that John F. Kennedy, back in the early 1960's, back in his inaugural speech, said 'and the torch will be passed to a new generation'. The average age of a Shriner in Shriners International is 67 years old. The average age of your class today was 38 years old. I stand before you to say that, for the first time, in all the Ceremonials that I've been to, the torch is being passed to a new generation. Today, their names were inscribed on a scroll that lists many famous Shriners. How many of you are NASCAR fans? David Ragan should be a Shriner by this time next year; he drives the #6 UPS car. He's working on his MM degree now. Those old names that we know, like John Wayne, Bart Starr, Gerald Ford they were Shriners. They came from that other generation, that past generation. I charge our new Nobles tonight that you go out and you find other Nobles and you grow your generation in our Fraternity. You make it happen. There's a generation that's missing. How many people do you talk to about Shrinedom – a young guy in his 20's or 30's – and he says his grandfather was a Shriner. Not that many say that their father was. I am so proud today to see that the torch has been passed.

"I have been fortunate this year to travel to many of our Shriners Hospitals for Children® as a member of the strategic task force that is charged with the task of finding ways to make our hospitals more efficient. Our goal is to balance our budget and treat more children in more places. That is our plan in the next 3-5 year span. I want to share with you the one incident that touched my heart the most. You know that children at a young age from 2-6 years... I like to call it the 'no fear years'. They have absolutely no fear. Shriners Hospitals for Children® got a call on 2 children that had been badly burned. These two children were from China; these two children... their lives had been given up upon because they had been burned so severely. The last resort, the last hope was Shriners Hospitals for Children®. I was at our Galveston hospital where these two children are now being treated and

they're doing quite well. The little boy is about 2 and the little girl is about 6 - they are brother and sister. The little sister had no fear. She was out of the house safe. Her little brother was still in their burning house. She went back in that burning house to retrieve her little brother. They both made it out... but not very good. When I saw them about a month ago, they were both using walkers going down the halls. Both of them had their legs burned off; both of them were missing all their fingers. They did not have any hair. (The image of) burned children will upset you more than anything that I can think of. And yet these two little ones were smiling at each other while walking on their prosthesis. As I sat next to them - I couldn't communicate with them other than with gestures because they didn't speak any English – and I can tell you that, in their eyes, they were saying 'thank you... you have given us hope, you have given us life." These two children are what all of you represent: hope and love. That is what you are! We have the greatest physicians in the world and the greatest staff. The Shriners are wonderful people but what we really provide is hope and love to children.'

Fun followed dinner with music and dancing to the Kristi B band – soft rock, country and everything in between. The Hospitality Suite was hopping as the Nobility eagerly watched the Badgers game. It was a fun, exhausting day that left the Nobility enthused about the future.






Student Researches and Fundraises for Shriners




