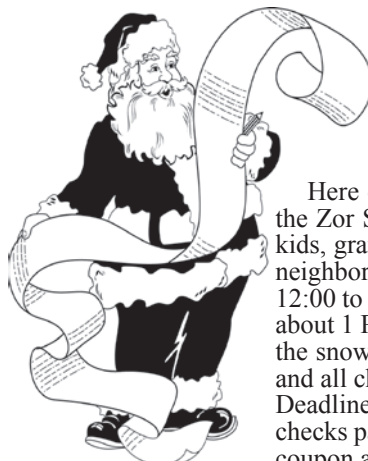

Since the launch of the Love to the rescue national media campaign on June 11, it has delivered more than 718,682,000 impressions (eyeballs) targeting adults 18+. Summarized below are the results for each medium.

National Television

Love to the rescue has aired on 24 national cable networks including large, broad-based (BET, TBS, TNT and USA), satellite clusters (Dish and Direct TV) and some specifically targeting women 25+ (Bravo, E!, HGTV, Lifetime, Oxygen, Style and We).

Digital Display

Love to the rescue banners appeared on 50+ digital sites, reaching target audiences including moms, upscale viewers and women 25+.

Online Search

Shriners Hospitals for Children website visits are up 87% and unique visits are up 90% from last year.

These numbers clearly meet the Love to the rescue campaign's objective of increasing awareness of our organization by tell our compelling story. In January 2013, we will conduct a follow-up study to gauge the increase in awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children. We fully expect to have made significant progress in developing the public's knowledge of us and the work we do. This will ultimately lead to more donations to support our mission of providing the highest quality, specialized care regardless of a patient's ability to pay. AWARD OF MERIT RULES

This award is presented for dedicated and exemplary voluntary service to Zor Shriners and to the Shriner's philanthropy, the Shriners Hospitals for Children®, over a minimum of five years.

Recognition for outstanding service to Shrine Clubs or Units solely shall be the responsibility of those bodies and the nominee shall not be eligible for the Award of Merit recognition as they do not meet the guidelines.

The Award shall preferably be presented to Nobles not otherwise recognized as serving on the Divan or by appointment to prominent positions.

No member of the Zor Divan or past member of the Divan will be eligible for consideration until at least five years following his being on the Divan. Then only for Voluntary Service that is within Zor's sphere of influence.

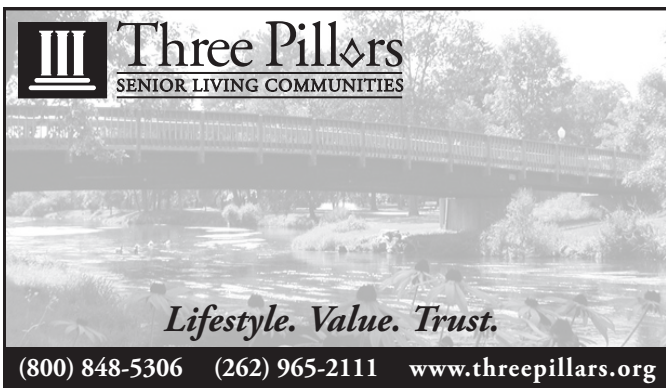

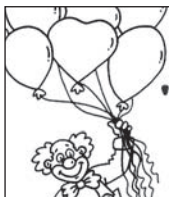
