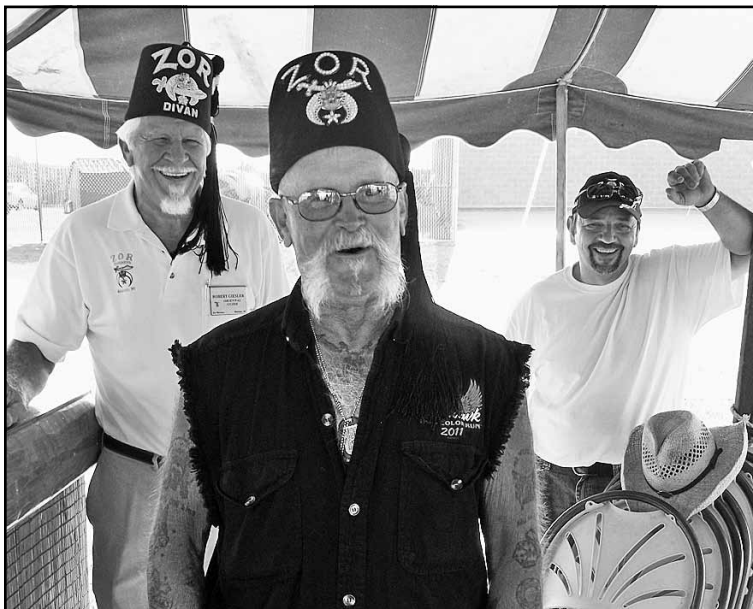
2nd Annual Cycle and Classic Car Ride

The activities are plentiful that weekend, beginning on Friday evening with the Hospitality Room will be open that evening for everyone to socialize and get to know one another (3:00 to 5:00pm and 8:00 to 11:00pm). This is a great time to meet and greet the candidates and their ladies.


