During the 2011 Imperial Session, held in Denver July 3-7, Michael G. Severe of Erie, Colo., was elected the Imperial Potentate of Shriners International, making him the highest-ranking Shriner in the world. In this role, he serves as President of the Board of Directors for Shriners International and Chairman of the Board of Directors for Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

Imperial Session Welcomes New Imperial Potentate and Outer Guard

Severe is a management consultant in the manufacturing sector. He was a manager of IS at Auto-trol Technology Corporation, division manager for Adolph Coors Company, CTO for EG&G/Kaiser-Hill and Corporate Management Consultant for Titanium Metals Corporation. Severe received his bachelor's degree in business administration with an emphasis in management information science from the University of Northern Colorado.

Severe was raised a Master Mason at the age of 21, progressing onto the York and Scottish Rites and becoming a Shriner at the age of 22. He held various officer positions at Glenwood Lodge #65, AF&AM, and was Past Patron of Erica Chapter # 69 – OES. At El Jebel Shriners, Severe belonged to the Scooter

and Motorcycle Units and became president of his unit in 1989. In 1990, he was appointed Outer Guard, progressing to become Potentate of El Jebel Shriners in 1999. During the 1999-2000 Imperial Year, Severe served on the Imperial Strategic Planning and Imperial Florence Committees. He has also served as Chairman of the Public Relations Committee.

Severe's wife, Patty, is employed by St. Joseph Hospital. He has two children, Joe who works as a logger in Idaho, and Lauren who is attending the University of Northern Colorado as an English major; Patty has two grown children, Aaron and Amanda; and two grandchildren, Sydney and Derek.

Shriners and Masons Knock One Out of the Park

Hot. Balmy. Overcast. Those were the conditions Saturday July 9 in Madison but it was a sellout crowd at the Duck Pond. Thousands of people came to enjoy Madison Mallard baseball action, including many members of the Zor Shriners and Hiram Lodge No. 50. It was a very special occasion for both groups — they were there to present 2 (AED) Defibrillators to the Mallards for use in their facility.

Ted Erickson from Hiram Lodge explains how this presentation came about: "Starting last year during the Madison Baseball Mallard season, my daughter - Lisa Erickson AKA "Millie the Duck" - was experiencing some medical issues during a game. Well, my daughter having been involved with Job's Daughters for many years knew of the AED Defibrillator program through the Wisconsin Masonic Charity Foundation and approached me last fall about the program. It being too far into the 2010 baseball season there wasn't enough time for (a presentation). I spoke with Conor Coila, General Manager for the Madison Mallards, and they also felt the need for the AEDs.

"I approached Past Potentate John Thorstad last fall to see what they thought about doing a joint effort in getting the AED's together. He brought it back to the Zor Shriners Director staff. John and I chose the date for the presentation July 9th, 2011 and together made a fun family outing for all. Potentate Steve Peterson and W.M. Jerry Roscoe from Hiram #50 each threw out an honorary 1st pitch of the game."

Other highlights included the Zor Color Guard presenting the flags of our country, state, and more while Bill Gant sang the National Anthem. Nobles and Ladies dined on brats, burgers, chicken breasts, and all the fixings plus ice cold liquid refreshment. This is the 7th year that the Zor Shriners have enjoyed hospitality and notoriety at a Madison Mallards game.

The Madison Clowns were enjoying the event and pointed out that the there were no Funsters at the event and they wondered if perhaps that the Funsters were lost and went to Wausau instead of Madison for the baseball game.

Other notable events are the game were all the fun door prizes that the Director's staff gave out and Tom Nelson almost getting hit in the head with a foul ball. He said that the ball probably wouldn't have caused much damage if it had connected.

By the end of the evening, the Mallards fell to the Wisconsin Rapid Rafters 7 to

2 but the enthusiastic local crowd was treated to a fireworks display nonetheless.

Tom Nelson PP shared his thoughts: "This is a great outing for the Shriners, to showcase our (organization) ... and this is great outing for the family. It's really a fun event to attend."

"Good time," said Chuck Porter, member of Director's Staff. "Good attendance. Great door prizes and hospitality."

John Thorstad PP and member of Director's Staff had this to say: "The event went very well. The Mallards were very pleased with our donations of the defibrillators... and our 4 door prizes that we give away (to the crowd) to get the name Zor Shriners out in the public. Great crowds – it was a sellout. We've got fireworks tonight and there were plenty of giveaways! Everybody has a good time here. I didn't get to see Steve throw his pitch. I'm told that it didn't make it all the way to home plate but everyone tries their best."

"The event was great," said Larry Hanson High Priest & Prophet. "Good weather – well, it was a little bit warm, but it was great. The #1 Clown Unit is here but the #2 unit hasn't shown up yet. (Or is it #11?) It's always a great time. The Directors Staff does a good job with this (event)."

Potentate Steve Peterson gets the last word: "It's a great night. It's summer time; it's baseball time. This is the 7th year that we've put on the Color Guard for the Mallards. Beautiful evening, good crowd out here, and a good turnout by the Zor Shriners – that's what it's all about: good fellowship and having a good time. We donated a defibrillator to the Mallards. We know that it can be of great use to them. The owner was very appreciative because he knows how (the AED) can help them. He definitely supports us Shriners because he knows the good work that we do – it's all for the children.

"I want to thank the Color Guard for coming out and thank Bill Gant for his singing. Thank you to the Director's Staff for organizing this event and having all the door prizes. This shows how fun we have – how much fun we CAN have – and we need to do more events like this around Zorland. I'm looking forward to the baseball game we're gonna have in Wausau between the Woodchucks and the Rafters. It will be a joint event between the Masons and the Shriners, just like this event "






