Zor Clowns Introduce "Lightbulb the Clown"



Snowmobile Club Teams With Shrine to Support Hospital

It was a clear crisp day in northern Wisconsin as a group of enthusiastic snowmobilers stopped for a lunch break in the tiny hamlet of Dallas, Wisconsin just south of Rice Lake.

What separates this from any other snowmobile run is its mission. This run was the 16th annual Indianhead Snowmobile / Shrine Club joint fundraiser for the Shrine Hospital for Children. Some 16 units pulled into Clickers Bar and Grill in Dallas, one stop on a 100 mile round circuit that began in at the Blue Hills Masonic Lodge in Rice Lake at 8:30 am on Saturday, January 22nd.

When the snowmobile club started out they were doing the usual poker run and did not have a place for the money they raised. Paul and Delores Bussy, one of the club members, had the opportunity to attend a Shrine summer picnic and they and members like Bruce and Marlene Arnold and others decided to ask the Shrine Club if they could use the Shrine Hospital as their fundraising mission. As Delores said "It has been a marriage ever

The club has generated from \$10,000 to \$15,000 for the Shrine Hospital every year.

According Jim Sockness of Rice Lake, the fundraiser chairman for the past 10 years, after they partnered with the Indianhead Shrine Club, it began to grow in interest and participation. Even during years of no snow, the run brings in revenue. Sockness is relatively new to the Shrine, but he worked on the run before. The snowmobile run always starts at the lodge in Rice Lake, but has a different route every year, always ending up at the

lodge, where they hold a banquet and

present their pledges to Shrine officials.
At last count, the run this year has brought in over \$10,300 with more coming in. Sockness said he expects to have almost \$11,000 to \$12,000 once all pledges are in.

Pete Schneider, of Rice Lake, was the trail boss for this year's run. Schneider said the club manages some 60 miles of trails in Barron County. There are 4 clubs in the county. Each divide up the work of grooming, marking, set up and tear down of signs each year.

Shrine patient takes part

One of the major fund raisers for the Snowmobile club is 21 year old Brent Thunberg of Rice Lake. He is not only an

active promoter and participant in the run every year, he was also a recent patient at the Shrine Hospital for Children. He started at the hospital when he was 4, receiving treatment for cystic fibrosis. He has undergone 4 surgeries at the hospital, one to straighten his leg and others to fix

The first couple years, he was too young to drive, but rode in the event. Later, he started driving his own sled and today he has not missed a run. Every year Brent is one of the top fundraisers. His mom says, "Brent is very determined young man." Brent added "I love it when someone says I can't do something... I love the challenge."

Host Dale Holman had this to share: "I think it went wonderful! It's always fun to have the Clown party for the Potentates and all our sweethearts. Along with decorating the Potentate as the true clown he is, we raised money for the Shrine Red Sneaker fund with our raffle. This year we raised \$420 which will be donated in the name of Potentate Steve Peterson and Lady Mary Ellen."

"He looks great in his clown outfit; I think they did an excellent job on him," said Tom Nelson, PP, who then shared a memory about his evening as a clown: "That was a good night. It was fun to be made up and then, afterwards, when it was all done, we went back to the hotel. We were all down in the lounge and people would walk by staring at me! Kids would run up to me. You're not used to being in makeup like that and you forget about (having it on). People come up to you and ask about what you're dressed as and why you're dressed that way. I had a lot of fun with it."

"I had just as a good time tonight as I did 20 years ago getting my face painted," said Dick Jones, PP.

Tom Thorstad, PP, reminisces about the night he was turned into a clown:"It was at the Shrine Center. My mother was there, my aunt was there – it was a good time. The Clowns do a fantastic job on this event. Dale does an excellent job putting this together. They always have a good crowd every year."

"The Clowns always do a great job," said Assistant Rabban Bob Gorsuch, "They're a special unit."

"I think the party turned out great again.

It was nice to have some of the #2 Clown Unit here to support us. I hope they come back again, too," said High Priest and Prophet Larry Hanson, who is also a member of the Zor Clowns. "We spend about a year looking at the upcoming Potentate and try to figure out how we're going to dress him. I think that the last few years, it's turned out really good. I think Steve turned out really well tonight. We spent all this time telling (him) we're gonna cut the moustache off and then we got to talking - we've never done a handlebar moustache. Foxy said let's try that handlebar because it's something unique and we can blend it all in instead of trying to cover (the real moustache) all up. It's the first time we did it and turned out

"They did an excellent job on Steve," said Chief Rabban Larry Reimenschneider, "it's a good fun party and it's something you'll remember for the rest of your life... how you were made up as a clown."

"It's fantastic to be honored as the Clown fisherman this year," said Potentate Steve Peterson. "This means a lot to me because trout fishing is an enjoyable part of my life and Zor Shrine is a very enjoyable part of my life. Now I know how much fun the Zor Clowns have! This event is one of the first milestones after being elected Potentate. I was a little nervous (about the moustache) - I wasn't sure what they were up to. I was somewhat confident that it wouldn't change. It is amazing what Foxy does with you. It's neat that we have such a special clown here that does a fantastic job like that. It's super that we have such a supportive group of Clowns in Madison as well as the other clown units who are here tonight. They are all great for Zor! I want to thank the number of Nobles and Ladies who came out tonight as well as the Past Potentates who brought the pictures of their clown personas. I know the Clown Party has good memories for them as well as for me. It will be a night that I will remember the rest of my life. Also, to see my Lady Mary Ellen excited to see what I was going to look like - it's a night I've been looking forward to and it's just great being "Lightbulb the Clown."





afternoon session programming that included speakers from the three Shriners Hospitals for Children® that serve MSA patients. Dr. Reggie Hamdy, M.D. and Chief of Staff from Montreal, Canada, described the programs at his facility and the beginnings of building a new hospital. Sara Klaas LSW with the Rehab program at the Chicago location spoke on program direction of Spinal Cord Injuries. Dr. Ken Guidera. M.D and Chief of Staff at the Twin Cities location also described their programs and coordinating services with other hospitals in the area. Each brought patients and their parents that have gone through their facilities. Testimonies were given on how their lives have changed because of what we as Shriners do for them.

Here are comments from attendees at the Winter Session. Chief of Staff-Wayne "Words cannot explain what I learned on the hospital presentation. The information on their fields of expertise were overwhelming, and gave me a better understanding on what they try to accomplish with their patients. Having the patients come up to speak on what the hospitals have done for them were very touching and moving (I have to admit that I had a hard time holding back my tears). On Saturday morning, I learned a lot on how the membership needs to improve, where we stand, and where we need to be in the future. I feel that today's generation is not as interested in volunteering their time to organization like we do, but it is up to us to give them some insight on what we do to make them understand the importance of helping others. Also I would like to congratulate ZOR on earning the bronze level for membership growth. So let's go for that silver!"

Oriental Guide - Monte Steiber: "This was my first MSA Winter session. Overall. I was impressed with the speakers and presentations. They were well done and provided good information, and were the best that I have seen. The 4 patients and patient families were also very interesting to listen to (as well as emotional). It helps to drive home the reason we do what we do as Shriners.

High Priest & Prophet – Larry Hanson: "The Friday afternoon session with Dr. Reggie Hamdy, M.D. from Montreal, Sara Klass from Chicago and Dr. Ken Guidera, M.D speakers were, as always,

quite informative. There were 4 hospital kids there and they, along with their parents, spoke. As usual they were very appreciative of all the Shriners do at the hospitals. Dr. Guidera told us that the arrangements with the University Hospital in Minneapolis have not come together and they will be looking for other options. Friday evening's main speaker was Past Imperial Potentate Ken Smith, he talked about the hospitals and how we may have to change our set-up to survive. This topic was brought before Imperial in the past and will probably be brought before us again this year at 2011 Imperial Conference in Denver. There was as much discussion in the hospitality rooms on subjects as there was at the meetings. I came away with some new ideas and with a better understanding of how MSA works. It is a meeting that should be attended by all the Elected Divan in the

Assistant Rabban- Bob Gorsuch: "Regular communication of membership numbers to Divan and Clubs/Units was one aspect of the membership presentation. We should strive to reach the Silver and Gold award levels. As I understood it we only need to reduce the loss by .1% to keep our Bronze status; reduce loss percentage by 2% to achieve Silver status: and have a net increase of one or more in actual membership to achieve the Gold Status. As usual, the hospital and patient presentations were tremendous. We need to not forget we are not about just fun and fund raising to stay alive; we are about fun and kids!

It appears serious financial problems still plague our hospitals. It should make for an interesting and important Imperial Session in Denver in July.'

Chief Rabban – Larry Řiemenschreider: "Membership Committee meeting. John Archer and Tom Moe called on each Shrine temple and reported their membership status and asked suggestions from us on how we thought we could improve it. They suggested we start a retention letter in February or March. They reported that in South Dakota and North Dakota that 80% of Masons are Shriners. In Wisconsin approximately 35% are Shriners. Maybe if we visit Blue Lodges more we might increase those numbers. Also, El Riad's rush parties are sponsored by clubs and units, but have smaller parties and more of them. Virtual mentors should be matched up with their own age and interests. Each temple should have approximately fifteen virtual mentors and should be selected by their positive mental attitudes.

Potentate- Steve Peterson: "Presentations by the three hospitals represented - comes down to 'its all about the kids'. They make kids the best they can be with their disability or injury. We as Shriners need to be proud of what we do daily. As the patients say – "Shriners make my life better". Nobles are working every day to make miracles happen at our hospitals. Nobles - we are heroes and need to continue to make ZOR strong in helping the kids and having fun doing it.

Membership presentations revealed that in 1986 we had 847,000 plus members and at the end of 2010 we have 340,000 plus members. That is lost of nearly 57 %. MSA is challenging each Temple to work on creations and restorations in returning our fraternity to a positive growth pattern. This will take commitment, hard work and passion. We nobles need to be proud of our Fraternity, Brotherhood, and the Community programs we have developed. Now is the time to go into our communities and let good men know what we have to offer them and how we have



MSA Reservations and Guidelines

Unit Leaders

The Midwest Shrine Association (MSA) Winter Session has just concluded at the Oasis of Khartum in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. Web site http:// msa2011.org/index.htm Zor's Ill. Sir Steve Peterson has requested that you be informed that the Nobles of Khartum Shriners promise an exceptional time in and around Winnipeg when we travel there for the fun and excitement of the Midwest Shrine Summer Session Thursday through Saturday 4-6 August 2011 (Divan and some others must arrive on Wednesday for meetings). A great deal more coordination is required to travel to MSA this year because of the Canadian site and bus transportation.

Any individual with a Driving under the Influence or a felony on his or her record will not be permitted to enter Canada. Please note that travelling into and returning from Canada requires each individual to have in their position a current and valid USA Passport. It can take several weeks and maybe even a couple of months to receive a passport. I just renewed my passport and it took about 4 weeks.

Zor would like to provide a bus for this excursion if there are a sufficient number of riders. This bus will leave on Tuesday 2 August. We will schedule pickup points at a couple of locations within Wisconsin. Winnipeg is approximately 750 miles from Madison. Legally the bus can only travel about 600 miles per day so we must overnight on the way up and on the return trip. If there is enough interest a second bus leaving on Wednesday could be scheduled.

We must make reservations for a bus and lodging in Winnipeg and at the stopping points NOW. We must have your anticipated needs before the end of February no exceptions!!! We can not answer all the questions you will no doubt receive until we get some idea how many of Zor's membership want to make this pilgrimage. Additionally, there are penalties for rooms reserved and not used. Zor will be making commitments no later than Friday March 4.

Unit leaders must take charge and contact your membership to determine your units' interest in making this trip. While you are at it determine how many seats you will need on the bus. How many rooms will these riders need at the stopping points? How many rooms your unit will need in Winnepeg Wed-Fri or Thur-Fri nights (we assume all will be checking out Sat).

When Brice and Jennifer Morano of Gibson, City, III., learned they were expecting their first child, they were ecstatic and looked forward to the happy event.




Kyra and her parents are all smiles after her cleft lip and palate surgery at Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Chicago.
