

Official Notice of Zor 2012 Annual Meeting and Election of Officers

The official Notice of Zor's 2012 Annual Meeting and Election of Officers Zor Temple's Annual Meeting and election will be held Saturday, January 14, 2012 at the Zor Shriners Center in Madison. A total of 7 Zor officials will be elected and six members of the Appointive Divan named to posts during the election and post-election meeting and installation ceremony. This is the official notice required by Imperial Council:

Election and Installation at Zor Temple on January 14, 2012

Notice is hereby given that the Annual Meeting for Zor Shrine will be held at the Zor Center on Saturday, January 14, 2012, beginning at 1 p.m. at which time annual reports will be presented, officers and representatives elected for the coming year, and such other business transacted as may properly come before the meeting.

properly come before the meeting.
ARTICLE 25, Section 325.4 to 325.6 of the Imperial Code reads as follows:

Each Temple must elect its officers and representatives by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited. Said election shall take place at the Temple's annual meeting in January of each year. Nominations must commence not later than 9 p.m. for an evening meeting or 3 p.m. for

an afternoon meeting of the day on which the election is held, and when that hour arrives, all other business must immediately cease and not may be transacted until the election is concluded.

ARTICLE 25, Section 325.10(a)

The printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets or other devices, by a Noble suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the Temple, is prohibited. (b) for any violation of section (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble and he may declare the election of said officers void and order a new election.

New Terms Enhance Membership Efforts

Back in 1872, when the Shriners fraternity was established, it made perfect sense to emphasize the middle-Eastern motif of the organization by naming it the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine.

While the fraternity is still based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth, neither that tongue-twisting formal name – nor even the more commonly-used name of Shriners of North America – fit the organization today.

Today, there are active members of the fraternity located around the world, and an increasing effort to reach and recruit new members on an international scale. It is important they be acknowledged in the name of the organization.

Consequently, at the 2010 Imperial Session in Toronto a resolution was passed to officially replace the corporate name, The Imperial Council of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for North America. The resolution also stated that Shriners International should replace the name or any abbreviated versions of it (such as Shriners of North America). Nobles are encouraged to use Shriners International when referring to the fraternity, both in speech and in any temple publications they produce.

Also, just as a reminder, at the 2002 Imperial Session, a proposal to replace the word 'temple' with the word 'Shriners,' when the term is used as a proper name for a group of nobles was

passed. For example, Mecca Temple is now Mecca Shriners. The word temple can still be used to designate general groups of Shriners, or

the building where Shriners often gather. For example, there are now 193 temples located in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, the Republic of Panama and The Philippines, with another temple in Germany currently under dispensation. There are also affiliated clubs located around the world.

Whether we are attracting interest and members globally or locally, we want to be sure we make it as easy as possible for potential Shriners to understand who we are and what we do. Therefore, it was also decided that when speaking to or providing materials for non-Shriners, it is fine to refer to a temple with a secondary references of 'chapter', which is also a clear indication that we are a fraternity.

All of these changes are part of an overarching effort to increase membership by using terms people everywhere can understand, accept and respond to in a positive way. Additional efforts include the website beashrinernow.com, which is specifically for potential new members.

The future of the fraternity depends on increasing membership. While these efforts are important, it is equally critical for every Shriner to be willing to share his interest in and commitment to the fraternity with those around him.

It was a beautiful day in La Crosse for the UW-L Shrine football game Saturday October 1. The campus was abuzz with tailgaters, students, parents, and Shriners. Nobles started showing up around 11am to setup for the game. The Firehouse Jesters parked their parade vehicles in front of the stadium. Potentate Steve Peterson and the Divan joined the La Crosse area Nobles to sell programs and welcome people to the event. During halftime, the Potentate greeted the crowd from the 50-yard line as the La Crosse Shrine Club presented a gift to the King of the Game. The Nobility and the crowd were treated to a real nail biter of a game. The UW-L football team earned its first win of the season with 31-28 victory over UW-Stevens Point.

The King of the Game was Samuel His parents, Martin and Carole, came to La Crosse with Samuel's siblings Paul, Mary, and Julia (who had her cleft palate helped by the Shriners in Chicago). Samuel was born in Ethiopia. He and his older brother were adopted in August of 2008 but their new life was interrupted just five weeks after coming to America by an accident involving a lawn tractor. Samuel was transported via Flight for Life to Children's Hospital in Milwaukee. He was hospitalized over two months and received numerous surgeries. He sustained amputation of both legs below the knees, his left arm near the elbow (which has been reattached), extensive skin grafts, and a colostomy. He is considered a triple amputee (because the left arm is still not functional) and it presented a more unique challenge. Shriners Hospitals for Children® was recommended by numerous professionals because of their highly specialized skill in dealing with injuries of this kind/extent.

On July 29, 2009 Samuel received his prosthetic legs that were fashioned with a tiger print that he had picked out. He was walking unassisted shortly thereafter, and has continued to improve in all aspects. His colostomy was reversed 10 months after the accident and he is on no regular He progressed through medications. a set of penguin-patterned legs that he named "Happy Feet" and now has an animal pattern where when he notices a curious stare, he'll begin pointing out the gorilla, or elephant, or antelope . . . He is simply a happy, active first-grader who is registered for indoor soccer. His smile and laugh are infectious and his spirit is a source of inspiration.

Samuel enjoyed the game and liked the gift of a UW-L sweatshirt from the La

Life is now good for 11 year-old Collin,

who was born with an extremely toed-in left foot. Doctors had wanted to wait until he was older to deal with the issue. As a youngster the condition did not get any better. He had problems playing sports, which he loves. He would suffer pain with any running or walking.

After a series of conversations with doctors his parents, Chris and Tracey Schone, did not feel comfortable with the treatment options presented, which ranged from hip to knee surgery.

When he was 9 years old, during a routine visit to their doctor at the Baldwin Collin. In early 2010 the family was notified Collin had been accepted and treatment

began. The Schones liked the Shriners Hospitals for Children® because they allowed Collin to take some rather involved 'gate' tests - tests which Chris said they would never have been able to pay for on their own. The tests involved having sensors attached to Collin's body and a video taken of him walking. These tests indicated to the doctors at Shriners that the problem was isolated to just his ankle, not

his knee or hip, which they had feared.
With this diagnosis, Dr. Meilke of
Shriners performed surgery on his left
ankle late in April of 2010. They cut the bone off and rotated it 25 degrees to a normal position. Some hardware was then added to hold in all in place while Collin recovered. This type of surgery is not new to the doctors at Shriners, because it is done routinely. This was great comfort to the Schone family. Just knowing they were confident, made everything better, said

The casts held everything in place and he quickly healed. Collin now walks and runs like any active 11 year old boy. In fact, he has gone out for football at the Glenwood Middle school where he begins 6th grade.

The Schones could not say enough good things about the Shriners Hospitals for Children®. Chris and his friend Deanna commented how pleased they were with the care, concern and treatment they received. Collin also said that his visits to Shriners were a lot of fun with the nurses, doctors and everyone treating him so well.

Bob Cotner, Director of Development, Shrine Hospital Chicago made a presentation on Donor Relations. He stated the small fund raising projects and estate donations are very important but his job is securing large donations which can be in the millions of dollars with the hope of securing enough in donations to support the SHC each year. He also reviewed the experience of two patients who were treated at the Chicago Hospital.

Treasures Report: D. Anderson read the abbreviated financial report, as of September 30, that shows Total Revenues YTD \$282,505, Total Expenses \$334,912 for a loss of \$52,407 with unrealized Wells Fargo loss of \$50,319 leaving a Net Loss of \$102,726. As of September 30, end of the month balances show Checking Accounts \$58,098, less bills to be paid in 30 days \$8,379. Cash Reserves, Hospital Patient Transportation Accounts \$156,146, Hospital Transportation Account Tampa \$199,450, Building Improvement Accounts \$64,018, Long Term Investment Accounts \$871,456, and Perpetual Membership \$22,845. D. Anderson moved the report be accepted and seconded by W. Trouten.

Motion Carried.

Membership Report: B. Calverley, Membership Chairman, reported that as of September 30, we had 2 Affiliations, 2 Restorations, 1 Demit, 2 Deaths, and 2 Suspensions for a net loss of 1 Noble. As of September 30, our total Membership is 1755. At the present time we have 94 Nobles who have not paid their 2011 dues. B. Calverley moved the report be accepted and seconded by L. Riemenschneider. Motion Carried.

<u>Departed Nobles:</u> J. Stelsel, Recorder, read the names of 16 departed Nobles as reported in the third quarter. K. Gant gave a prayer for the departed Nobles.

D. Jones PP. Trustees Report: reported the Trustees met with our investment advisor last month to review our investments which we do every six months. A downturn has been seen in the last six months but he thinks the fourth quarter will be better. During the last quarter our mutual funds are down about \$50,000. We need to thank our Potentate for refinishing the Gazebo and the two benches in the entry way. We have received some complaints from our Nobles that the weeds along the fence next to the beltline need to be cleaned up. Our lawn mowing service did cut the weeds down outside the fence but the brush along the fence has grown into the fence and Nobles Buehler PP. and Thorstad PP. agreed to work on this project and anyone who would like to help them should contact them. The American Transmission Company will be putting a transmission line across our property and we are waiting what the monetary effect will have on us. Our rentals were down in the third quarter and only 3 or 4 rentals are scheduled in the fourth quarter. D. Jones PP. moved the report be accepted and seconded by M. Severson PP. Motion Carried.

Chicago Hospital Report: E. Buehler PP. reported Bob Cotner is a great and optimistic guy and is doing a great job in getting large donations for the Chicago Hospital. The Hospital budget was submitted to Tampa two weeks ago but no reply has been received. We have been interviewing candidates for a new Hospital Administrator but no selection has been made at this time. Our patient applications are up but our patients are down and maybe some of this is due to taking insurance payments which may make parents decide to use local hospitals in their community. E. Buehler PP. moved the report be accepted and seconded by M. Severson PP.

Motion Carried.

Twin Cities Hospital Report: R. Rommel reported a letter was sent to Gillette Children's Hospital in the Twin Cities that outlines a working relationship between Gillette and the TCH.

We are awaiting Gillettee's response which should be prior to out monthly board meeting on the 19th. On September 7th the Imperial Strategic Assessment Task Force met at the TCH to review various hospital plans for success at which time the Gillette plan was presented to the task force. Zor received credit for 36 new applications through August and our goal for the year is 96. Total applications received were 519 compared to 711 a year ago. An evaluation clinic was held October 1st in Sparta with 5 applications accepted. A Clinic will be held October 29th in Wausau. All Imperial required budgets have been submitted to Tampa on a timely basis. Thanks to all the divers who transport the patients to TCH. R. Rommel moved the report be accepted and seconded by L. Riemenschneider. Motion Carried.

Circus Report: J. Thorstad PP. reported the Madison Circus will be Feb. 17th to 19, 2012. Tickets to the Nobility should be in their hands by December 10th and the price will remain the same except reserve seats will increase to \$20.00. He reported that PTA has filed a written request with the county that elephants not be permitted in or on county buildings or properties.
