We Came to the Circus – the "Biggest" Show in Town – With Big Rewards!

This slogan resounded throughout Zor since December, when Chairman John Thorstad began his enthusiastic promotions of the Zor Shrine Circus. The efforts of John and the circus committee paid off with big rewards! Record attendance and record profits brought big smiles to Chair John and Potentate Joe Thompson.

Presenting the check to Potentate Joe at the Eau Claire Potentate Party, Chairman John was excited to announce that the proceeds from the circus were \$145,000 and the final count for attendance was 32,304 (third highest in recent years).

Circus activities started last year following the 2009 circus as plans were made to move forward with the 2010 circus. Businesses were contacted for program advertisements; committee assignments were made; lots of discussions between the Chair/committee, the promoter and George Carden to ensure a quality show for Zor.

During the weekend, many tasks kept volunteer Nobles busy, ushering and assisting patrons, clowning and welcoming guests, selling programs, securing the facility, finding lost parents, registering Nobles and ladies, and keeping the flow of people moving through the turn styles as they entered the circus. As a result of record attendance, chairs were set up on Saturday afternoon for the overflow of individuals who came to see one of the most entertaining shows.

Ladies were kept busy with the behindthe-scenes by continually preparing and refreshing the food buffet. Special thanks to Ladies Cathy Holm, Debbi Thorstad, Sheri Severson for preparing the hot food – it was delicious, and to Nancy Nelson, and all of the Divan ladies for their help in keeping the food area clean and well stocked. This year brought more challenges as the ladies were sorting and counting 19 different tickets for each of the 6 shows; imaging counting over 32,000 tickets, and putting them in numerical

order. It was a huge task that was greatly appreciated by Chairman John Thorstad and Lady Debbi.


acts from all over the world to dazzle and amaze circus goers.

Recorder's Roll Call

Hey, we had a great Madison Circus; the weather was perfect which resulted in near record attendance of approximately 32,300. Thanks to all of the Nobles and Ladies who worked at the circus.

As a reminder Clubs & Units who are booking their events for 2010 must remember fundraising events and parades participation, permission must be submitted to the Zor Office for approval before the events take place. If you book additional events after you have submitted your request for approval, you must notify your Divan Representative and notify the Zor Office. If the event is fundraising for the Hospitals, a written request must be submitted to the Zor Office so we can forward the request to the Imperial Office for approval.

As of March 1, 2010 we still have 294 Nobles who have not paid their 2010 dues. Dues were due on or before January 1, 2010. If you do not have your 2010 dues card please make an effort to pay your dues before the end of the month. Zor and other Temples are required to make payment of the \$15 per capita tax and the \$5 hospital assessments to the Imperial Office by March 31, 2010 regardless of whether you have paid your current dues



Combine sugar, vinegar and 2 cups water in large bowl, stirring to dissolve sugar. Separate onion slices into rings. Drain onions Marinate overnight. thoroughly. Add mayonnaise and celery salt, mixing well.

Cream of Vidalia Onion Soup

(1998 Vidalia Onion Cook-off winner, featured on Georgia Public Television)

Ingredients

3/4 cup of butter divided

3 cups Vidalia Onions 3 tablespoons flour

1 tablespoon fresh thyme

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

2 and a half cups milk 1 and a half cups half & half

Cheese to your taste - your choice Directions:

Melt 1/2 cup butter in skillet over medium heat. Add onions and saute until tender. Set aside. Melt remaining 1/4 cup butter in dutch oven. Add flour, salt, thyme, pepper and stir until smooth - cook for 1 minute stirring constantly. Gradually add milk and half & half. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened. Stir in onions, reduce heat, and simmer. Add cheese to taste and garnish with Vidalia Onion tops or parsley.

Vidalia Onion Spread

Ingredients:

5 to 6 Vidalia Onions, sliced thinly and then quartered

1/2 cup white vinegar 2 cups water

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup Miracle Whip

Celery seeds to taste Directions:

Mix vinegar, water and sugar. Marinate the onions in this mixture overnight. Drain Vidalia Onions for at least 2 hours in a colander. Mix drained Vidalia Onions with salad dressing and a generous amount of celery seed. Serve on crackers or as open faced sandwiches on bread.

DADS Safety Seminar – Come One, Come All


