

ZOR SHRINE QUARTERLY MEETING

APRIL 24, 2010, WAUSAU WI

Potentate J. Thompson called the meeting to order at 2:55 P. M.

K. Gant gave the opening prayer and all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to their flag.

Potentate J. Thompson asked for a motion on the minutes of the Quarterly meeting of October 10, 2009 as printed in the Zephyr. S. Peterson moved approval of the minutes and seconded by D. Anderson. Motion Carried.

Treasurers Report: D. Anderson, Treasurer read the abbreviated financial report as of March 31, 2010 that shows Total Revenues YTD \$220,254, Total Expenses \$104,044 for a gain of \$116,210, with Unrealized Wachovia Gain of \$13,012 leaving a Net Gain of \$129,221.

As of March 31, 2010 end of the month Balances show Checking Accounts \$266,914 less bills to paid in 30 days \$24,494, Cash Reserves, Hospital Patient Transportation Account \$84,186, Hospital Transportation Tampa \$192,704, Building Improvement Accounts \$95,581, Long Term Investments Accounts \$900,213, Perpetual Membership (26,270) \$22,251. (See attachment #1) D. Anderson moved the report be accepted and seconded by R. Jenkins PP. Motion Carried.

Membership Report: B. Calverley, Membership Chairman, reported that as of March 31, 2010 we had 0 Creations, 2 Affiliations, 8 Restorations, 2 Demits, 13 Deaths and 8 Suspensions for a net loss of 13 Nobles. As of January 1, 2010, we had 1873 members less a net loss or 13 we have 1860 Nobles (1842 regular plus 18 Associates) as of March 31, 2010. (See attachment #2). B. Calverley moved the report be accepted and seconded by T. Nelson PP. Motion Carried.

Departed Nobles: J. Thompson reported the list of names of the departed Nobles is not available for reading at this meeting. They will be read at the next quarterly meeting. I will ask Chaplain K. Gant to give a payer for our departed Nobles. K. Gant then gave the payer.

Trustees Report: D. Jones PP, Chairman of the Trustees reported on

the three major functions of the Trustees, which are to oversee the investment of Temple excess funds, the usage of the Shrine Center and the maintenance of the facility. We have about \$1,020,000 excess funds. 55% are invested in CD's and 45% in Wells Fargo mutual funds.

In March of 2009, our excess funds were down to about \$860,000 from a high of \$1,050,000. Therefore, we are almost back to even. However, our CD's are only yielding 1.5 to 2.0%. Out rental, revenue has been declining over the past few years. In the past, our revenue covered our operating expenses of the building. Today it only covers about 50%. This is due to a turn down in wedding receptions, completion on the west side, and a cut back by businesses of holding meetings.

We cannot be overly aggressive in promoting the outside use of our facility in order to protect our property tax exemption. The building is 25 years old and we have to maintain our plumbing, heating and a/c, parking lot and the inside such as painting and carpeting. We are computerizing the A/C and will be repaving the parking lot. (See attachment #3) D. Jones PP. moved the report be accepted and seconded by R. Jenkins PP. Motion Carried.

Circus Report: E. Toman reported on the 56th annual Madison Circus, which had a net profit of \$145,000, which was \$15,000 over budget the highest revenue ever from the Madison Circus. Total Attendance was 32,224 the 3rd highest dating back to 1990. A breakdown of attendance, unit participation, program sales, prizes given away and dollar figures have been in previous Zephyr's and are contained in the attachment. The LaCrosse Circus topped 7300 spectators and Zor's profit was \$3500. We have 12 summer circuses this summer and they are listed in the Zephyr.

A new 3 years contract for telemarketing has been signed with R. Sands and the contract with Carden for Madison & LaCrosse and the Alliant Energy Center are pending. (See attachment #4). E. Toman moved the report be accepted

and seconded by B. Kaschel PP. Motion Carried.

Onion Report: T. Nelson PP. for Onion Chairman R. Winter reported this year we have ordered 6275 bags of onions, which is 280 bags less than last year. Vidalia onion signs, recipes and 5 lb bags will be provided by Glennville Produce Co. Each club or unit contact person will be notified as soon as possible of the date (May 5, 6, or 7) that the onions will arrive. R. Amdall PP. is in charge of trucking. (See attachment #5). J. Soderholm PP moved the report be accepted and seconded by R. Jenkins PP. Motion Carried.

Chicago Hospital Report: E. Buehler PP. reported the hospital is operating in an excellent and efficient manner as we expect. The Staff has been reduced by 26 positions and wages have been cut by 4% to 5%. The new gate room has been completed at a cost of over 1 million dollars. The patient load is being maintained.

Twin Cities Hospital Report: Before D. Anderson gave the report he and members present thanked K. Johnson PP. for his nine years of serving on TCH Board with a standing ovation.

D. Anderson read the Twin Cities Shine Hospital Report from R. Rommel, Zor's representative on the TCH Board. R. Rommel thanks the Divan for appointing him to the TCH Board. The TCH continues to be innovative and reactive to the needs of our children. I serve on the Public Relations/Patient Recruitment Committee as well as the Finance Committee.

The 2009 operating budget of about 15 million was met. The 2010 operating budget was approved at \$14,267,985 which is a 5% reduction from 2009. Plans continue to move to the U of M Fairview Hospital approximately around July 2011. In 2009 1,183 applications were received and 870 were approved. Evaluation Clinics will be held April 24th in Hayward, September 25th in Chetek and October 2nd in Sparta. There were 11,044 physical therapy treatments during the past year.

During 2009 the Women's General Auxiliary contributed \$209,500 to the wheelchair program. Hospital Public Relations has developed new banners for public information, which can be purchased for \$425. Zor's Challenge goal for new patients in 2010 is 95. Through February there were 13 applications approved. Zor had 79 patients in 2008 and 86 in 2009. The hospital has completed applications for Medicare/Medicaid provider status. I thank you again for your support of the TCH. (See attachment #6)

Old Business: J. Thompson reported on his 100 new Nobles goal for 2010. The Wisconsin Rapids Ceremonial on June 12, at the present time we have about 25 petitions and we are hoping for another 25, so I am asking all of you to find your new candidate and bring them to Ceremonial. We had a membership event called the Mardi Gras Membership Party in Platteville on March 26th with 90 people in attendance. We received 5 petitions for the Blue Lodge and 2 for the Shrine. The next Membership event will be on May 15th in Edgerton. The Mini Cars are hosting a Luau Party so bring your Non-Masonic and Non-Shrine friends to this event.

NEW BUSINESS

ShrineSavers Program: B. Giesler reported on the Imperial Council member benefit program, known as ShrineSavers. Imperial is asking each Temple to adopt a Resolution that allows Nobles to obtain products and services at a reduced price, which would have the Temple furnish a list of members for this program. (see attachment #7) B. Giesler moved this resolution be adopted by the membership and seconded by T. Nelson PP. Motion Carried.

J. Thompson again thanked Kevin for his years of service on the TCH Board and a Thank You to Jan Johnson for her years of service on the Woman's Auxiliary.

K. Gant gave the closing prayer.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:53 P. M.


