Start the fun on Friday evening with a fish fry at the Club House where all

are invited (Nobles, ladies, candidates, family and friends). The Hospitality Room will be open that evening for everyone to socialize and get to know one another (3:30 to 5:00pm and 7:30 to 11:00pm). This is a great time to meet and greet the candidates and their ladies.

Saturday is jam-packed with fun activities and excitement for all who attend and participate in the activities, starting at 7:00 a.m. with candidate registration (see Agenda for complete schedule of events). 
Meals will be served to fit almost


From The Potentate

Nobility Enjoy Wildly Successful Little East West Shrine Weekend By Milt Helmer

Each fall before the Little East West Shrine Game in River Falls, the Nobles of the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club assemble to enjoy an evening with the Potentate of the Zor Shrine Temple.

This year, Potentate Joe Thompson from Shullsburg was the honored guest at the Potentates banquet held on Friday, October 1st at the River Falls Golf Club. He and his Chief Rabban Steve Peterson of Wausau were introduced by Assistant Rabban Larry Riemenschneider of Amery. The annual banquet was hosted by St. Croix Valley Shrine Club President Barry Ausen of Star Prairie and featured a bountiful dinner catered by the West Wind Supper Club of River Falls.

In his remarks at the banquet, Thompson said it was great to feel the energy toward the Shrine in the St. Croix Valley. He also said he is looking forward to the coming ceremonial scheduled for December 4th at the Chula Visa Resort in Wisconsin Dells. Thompson expects the St. Croix Valley to present 9 new members and called on Shriners present to make that happen.

Club Secretary Rod Rommel outlined the history of the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club. According to Rommel, the club was chartered back in 1958 and the Little East West Shrine Game has been in continuing operation since 1962. That means the game will celebrate its 50th year next year.

When the game first started, it pitted the University of Wisconsin River Falls againsta Minnesota University team, hence the East West theme. It was a combined affair that happened in conjunction to the University homecoming. Rod recalls that the proceeds reported in December of 1962 were a little over \$100. The Shrine got other units involved and 15 years later the event grossed \$14,800 with a net to charity of \$13,000. Today the event grosses from \$16,000 to \$18,000 thanks to the united efforts of Shriners throughout the Valley. All proceeds go to the Club's fraternal charities.

OCTOBER 12, 2010 • MADISON, WI

Potentate J. Thompson called the meeting to order at 4:05 P. M.

K. Gant gave the opening prayer and all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Potentate J. Thompson asked for a motion on the minutes of the Quarterly meeting of July 21, 2010 as printed in the Zephyr. L. Riemenschneider moved

approval of the minutes and seconded by B. Giesler. Motion Carried.

D. Anderson Treasurers Report: read the abbreviated financial report as of September 30, 2010 that shows Total Revenues YTD \$335,694, Total Expenses \$306,166, for a gain of \$29,528, with unrealized Wells Fargo Gain of \$17,967 leaving a Net Gain of \$47,496. As of September 30, 2010 end of the month Balances show Checking Accounts \$115,138 less bills to be paid in 30 days \$6,797. Cash Reserves, Hospital Patient Transportation Account \$88,361, Hospital Transportation Account Tampa \$182,119. Building Improvement Accounts \$57,720, Long Term Investment Accounts \$885.752 and Perpetual Membership \$22,449. D. Anderson moved the report be accepted and seconded by L. Hanson. Motion Carried.

Membership Report: B. Calverley, Membership Chairman, Reported that as of September 30, 2010 we had 2 Creations, 1 Affiliation, 1 Restoration, 3 Demits, and 12 Deaths for a net loss of 11. As of September 30, 2010 our total membership is 1844. At the present time we have 108 Nobles who have not paid their 2010 dues. The Imperial has established a new quick reference guideline when talking about the cost to patients for care. The new guideline is "all care and services are provided regardless of the patients' ability to pay" is the correct phrase to use when describing cost of care. Do not use

free, at no cost or at no charge or without financial obligation. B. Calverley moved the report be accepted and seconded by B. Ott. Motion Carried.

Departed Nobles: J. Stelsel, Recorder, read the names of 20 of our departed Nobles as reported in the third quarter. K. Gant gave a prayer for the departed Nobles.

Twin Cities Hospital Report: Rommel, Associate Board Member, reported Christmas Cards are upstairs for signing which will be sent to troops of the armed forces. We hope to send 1500 signed cards. The TCH Board of Directors has approved the 2011 hospital budget and has forwarded it to Imperial for review and action. The total budget is \$14,750.00 and is below the 2008 budget of \$17,500.00. Patient numbers are 3.5% ahead of last year. Zor has received credit for 55 new patients and goal is 95 patients. We have had three successful screening clinics in Adams/Friendship, Chetek and Sparta. Negotiations continue between TCH, Imperial and UM. Fairview hospital concerning a possible affiliation. Thank you to the Zor Drivers who transport our patients. R. Rommel moved the report be accepted and seconded by B. Ott. Motion Carried.

Trustees Report: D. Jones PP., Chairman of the Trustees reported investment accounts totaled \$1,006,000 the beginning of the year. We spent \$93,000 on capital improvements, added \$20,000 to investment accounts from the excess cash resolution, and had gains in Wells Fargo investment of \$20,000, CD interest earnings of \$12,000. This investment account as September 30, 2010 is \$965,000. The YTD gains on equity investments was about 4.5% compared to the S&P 500 of 3.9%, CD's about 1%.

Building usage is up a little, bar sales up 35%, and food sales up 35%.

We served about 2500 meals and the

We served about 2500 meals and the average meal served was \$13.07 excluding tax and gratuity.

We still need to hold more events and we have to rely on our membership to promote usage. Our contact with Queen Anne's expires at end of 2010 and we are preparing to renegotiate a new contract with them. We have spent about \$93,000 in capital improvements this year which includes resurfacing the parking lot. Painting Hankwitz Hall, new bar top and bar dishwasher.

We had a few roof leaks. We are preparing out 2011 budget that will include replacing the floor and window covering in Hackwitz Hall and possibility a new roof. D. Jones PP. moved the report be accepted and seconded by W. Reck. Motion Carried.

Donor Relations: W. Reck, Donor Relations, Chairman, reported on attending the donor relation conference in Tampa last week. It costs about 65 million each month to run the hospitals and about 45 million of that comes from donor relations that leaves 20 million which comes out of our endowment fund. Imperial have divided into 8 regions headed by a high powered donor relations person. They are looking to big corporations for big donations. One of the big corporations suggested they could set up a payroll deduction system for employees to have a given amount deducted from their paycheck each pay period for the hospitals. This is happening at the Imperial level, but for the temple levels we asking you to give me leads and ideas for the donation program. Since 1922 we have served over 96000 patients and we expect to reach 1,000,000 be the end of the year or early next year. W. Reck move the report be accepted and seconded by D. Anderson. Motion Carried.

New Business:

J. Thompson congratulated Tom Walton and Bob Gorsuch for their 33rd degree and happy birthday to Karl Gant.

J. Thompson reported for the Parade to Glory he is suggesting funds be sent to the General Fund or the Membership Fund. He asks that the Club & Units appear at the PTG in person and in their uniform

Announcements: J. Thompson reminded all about the Membership Halloween Party on the 30th.

We are in the process of activating the Keystone Cop Unit and there is meeting on this activation right after this meeting. After the steak fry there will be a meeting of the Geek unit.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:47 P. M.



The official Notice of Zor's 2011 Annual Meeting and Election of Officers

Zor Temple's Annual Meeting and election will be held Saturday, January 15, 2011 at the Zor Shrine Center in Madison. A total of 7 Zor officials will be elected and six members of the Appointive Divan named to posts during the election and post-election meeting and installation ceremony. This is the official notice required by Imperial Council:

Election and Installation at Zor Temple on January 15, 2011

Notice is hereby given that the Annual Meeting for Zor Shrine will be held at the Zor Center on Saturday, January 15, 2011, beginning at 1 p.m. at which time annual reports will be presented, officers and representatives elected for the coming year, and such other business transacted as may properly come before the meeting.

ARTICLE 25, Section 325.4 to 325.6 of the Imperial Code reads as follows:


which the election is held, and when that hour arrives, all other business must immediately cease and not may be transacted until the election is concluded.

(b) for any violation of section (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble and he may declare the election of said officers void and order a new election.

Shriners International Former Patient One of the Fraternity's Youngest Potentates

Drew Borske remembers the day he was a young patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago and he first encountered a group of Shriners.

"I met these wonderful men with red fezzes on, and they were the nicest people," he recalls. "I knew one day I had to join."

Born without the lower part of his right arm, Borske started treatment at the hospital when he was just six months old and continued receiving care there until he was 19. He still looks upon those years with fondness and credits the hospital staff for giving him the unique prosthetic devices he often needed to enjoy an active childhood.

In January, at the age of 39, Borske became Potentate (president) of Sesostris Shriners in Roca, Neb. He is among the youngest Potentates in Shriners International's history, and his experience as a former patient gives him a unique appreciation for the medical care provided by the fraternity's official philanthropy, Shriners Hospitals for Children.

"I loved going to the hospital because of the people and care I received," he said. "The doctors, nurses and staff were always friendly. I felt they listened to me and considered my recommendations. There was never an attitude that 'we can't do that.'

As a teen, Borske played soccer; and when he wanted to play tennis, hospital staff developed a special prosthetic device so he could serve the tennis ball. When he wanted to play ball with his father, they created a prosthetic attachment so he could catch the ball. Borske joined his school's gymnastics team, and his frequent handstands often damaged his prosthetic hand.

"I was a rather rambunctious boy and often destroyed my prosthetics," Borske said.

The doctors didn't discourage him, though. Instead, they told him to "keep doing what you're doing and we'll keep fixing them."

The idea to become a Shriner always remained in the back of Borske's mind. When he was 29 years old, he decided to act on the idea during a quick stop at a local store where Sesostris Shriners were hosting Shriners Hospital Awareness Day.

"I asked a few of them, 'how do I become a Shriner?" he recalls. "Their eyes got as big as saucers." The next day, Borske filled out the paperwork, and four years later, he was already a member of the Sesostris board.

Borske has referred patients to Shriners Hospitals for Children for care, including a neighbor boy who still had difficulty walking after two surgeries to correct his clubfoot. Doctors told the boy's mother nothing else could be done.

"I told her, 'I'm a Shriner, and I know we can help him," Borske said. The boy received treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Twin Cities, and today he walks fine, Borske said.

For Borske, the most rewarding aspect of being a Shriner has been transporting patients to the hospital in Minneapolis.

"It's very moving for me," he said. "Taking another patient to receive care probably has been the most fulfilling part of my life."

As the new Sesostris Potentate, Borske plans to increase community awareness of Shriners International and the hospitals it supports. He was a recent guest on a local radio show promoting the 64th Annual Sesostris Shrine Circus, held in March. He is also recognizing nobles and their ladies for their efforts. Instead of a Potentate's Ball, he decided to have a Nobility Ball and a special Ladies Apprecia-

'We're letting the nobility know that they are the special ones," Borske said.


