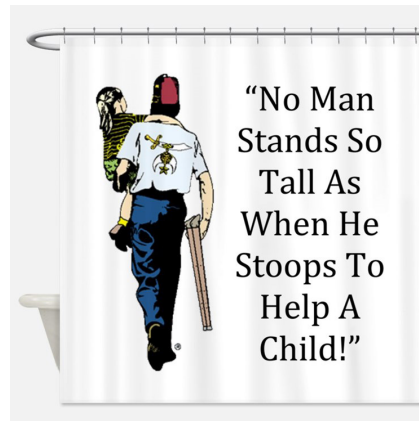

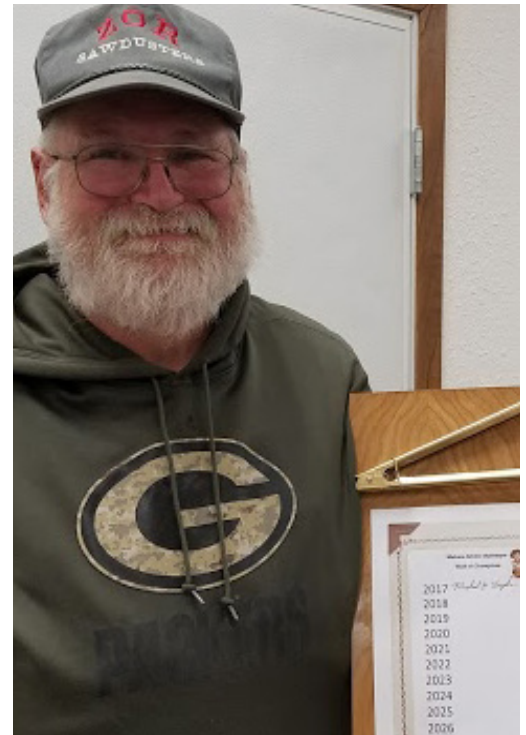

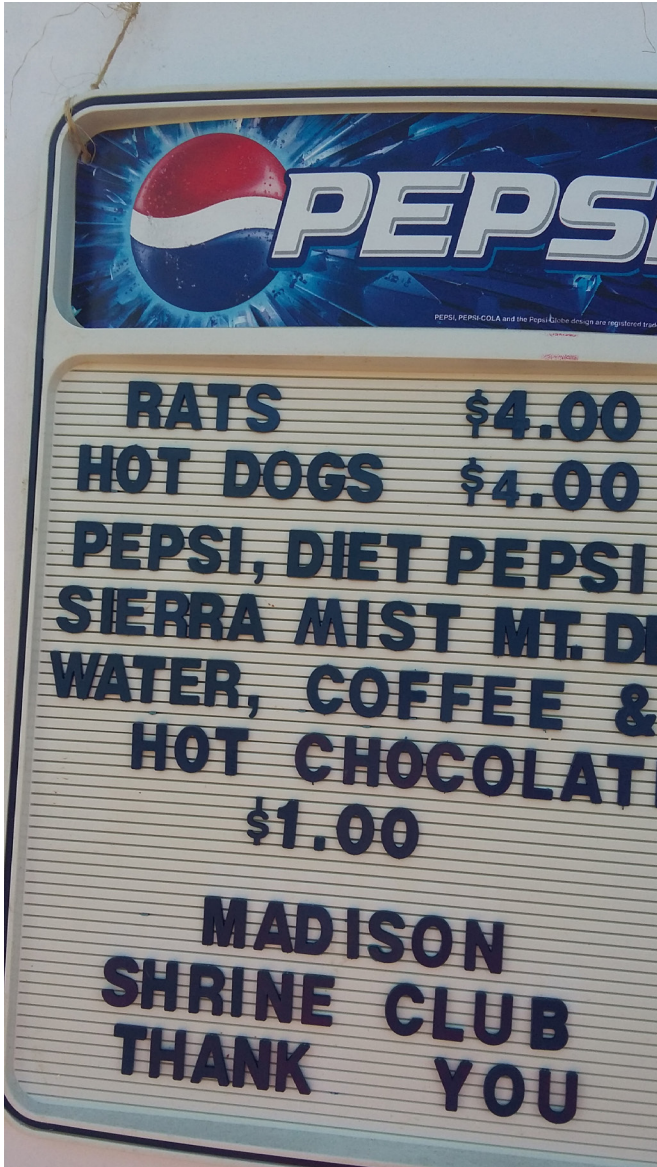


Natural gas
