


Zephyr



Donor Dollars Work Harder -- Shriners Hospitals Rated One of Top Charities

Charity Navigator, an independent agency, gave Shriners Hospitals for Children one of its highest ratings in 2017. The agency rated Shriners Hospitals 93.58 out of 100 points, an excellent overall score.

The review noted that Shriners has a superb record for accountability and transparency. Donors can follow where their money goes. Shriners are governed by a well-run board which has excellent protections against conflicts of interest.

The Hospitals are also rated highly for financial performance. Only 4.6 percent of expenditures went into fundraising. Administration cost 13.8 percent, which is highly efficient for a hospital system. The Hospitals have an enviable reserve of working capital, 9.72 years. And liabilities are just 7.6 percent of assets.

Those favorable financial numbers do not mean we can afford to relax fundraising efforts! It is the financial strength of Shriners which makes the organization efficient.


By comparison, another children's hospital which advertises extensively on television falls far shorter on Charity Navigator's measures. Although it scores well in accountability, it spends 16.1 percent of expenses on fundraising – three times what Shriners does. Only 73 percent of expenditures provide services to children.

It's great to know that when you ask for a dollar in contributions, it goes a long way to help kids.

Southwest Wisconsin Shrine Club/Queen B Radio All-Area Football Team

The Southwest Wisconsin Shrine Club and Queen B Radio announced its 2017 All-Area football team at an awards ceremony at Pioneer Lanes in Platteville on Sunday, Nov. 19, where 10 area players were honored.

Platteville's Ryley Bailey was named the All-Area Coach of the Year, while Lancaster senior Evan Gates shared the Offensive Player of the Year award with Platteville senior Donovan Blevins. Black Hawk senior Brody Milz was named the Defensive Player of the Year, while Platteville senior Ian Carter was named the Lineman of the Year.

Bailey led the Hillmen to a 9–2 record and a share of the Southwest Wisconsin Conference championship and in the process his offense shattered a number of school passing and receiving records and was named the SWC Coach of the Year.

Gates was named this year's Southwest Wisconsin Conference Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 2,051 yards and 33 touchdowns on 296 carries, and was a First-Team All-State selection by the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association.


Blevins was one of five wide receivers named to the All-State first team. He caught 65 passes and finished second in the state with 1,315 yards and 21 touchdowns. Blevins also earned All-Area honors as a defensive back and a return specialist. Carter was named the SWC Offensive Lineman of the Year.

Milz was named this year's Six Rivers Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year and recently received WFCAs All-State honors as both a running back and a linebacker. Milz finished the year with 163 tackles, including 16 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks and three interceptions, and also rushed for 1,685 yards and 28 touchdowns.

Lancaster senior Evan Straka earned a spot on the All-Area team as one of two quarterbacks, while Potosi/Cassville senior Dylan Pluemer was among seven running backs selected.

Lancaster senior center John Wagner and Potosi/Cassville seniors Brandon Kinyon and Ben Wheeler were among the 11 offensive linemen to receive honors.

On the defensive side, Lancaster had four players receive All-Area honors, and included: senior linemen Dalton Gardner and Gabe Hudson, along with junior linebacker Troy Klein and senior defensive back Garrett Birkett.



It was a warm and cordial evening at Layman's Supper Club in Rice Lake as members of North Country snowmobilers and Shriners gathered on January 20th to recognize their work to raise money for the Shriners Hospital for Children®.

Members of the Indianhead and Musky Shrine clubs received over \$11,000 from the snowmobile rally that covered a large area in the North Country.

Larry Riemenschneider, the President of the Indianhead Shrine Club, MCed the event, which also featured an appearance of the newly installed Potentate Gary Cuskey of Spooner.

In his comments Riemenschneider introduced Brent Sunberg, who at age 4 became a patient at the Shriners Hospital for Children.® In his comments, Larry read an account of his journey at the hospital along with commentary on his life after the Hospital. Sunberg, who is now 28, could no longer receive treatment when he turned 21, so Hospital personnel and an understanding social worker combined their efforts to continue his treatment at another hospital.

Potentate Cuskey reminded the assembled Snowmobile and Shriner member that Indianhead Shrine Club was the fourth highest contributor to the "Parade of Glory" last December.

Other divan members in attendance was Barry Ausen, Rod LeBlanc, Roger Keller and Allan Heinkel.


