





Great SHRINER PARKING LOT PARADE PLANE CRASH of 2018

Shriners, ladies and community members converged on the Shriners' Hospital for Children - Chicago (which is, to be precise, located in Oak Park) on Sunday June 3. These several hundred visitors experienced what they expected – a tour of the excellent health care facility operated by the Shrine; an interesting program; fund and food, and, the usual collection of clowns. No one could have known, however, that the day's events would culminate in the first recorded Shrine Parade Plane Crash in the history of our Ancient Order. The events leading to that unceremonious, but happily injury-free event, are worth noting.

The first Sunday of June of the even-numbered year, the Chicago Hospital (Oak Park) holds an open house to modestly present the excellent facilities and care provided there. It's an opportunity many hundreds of people take to tour a unique health facility, one which still pursues quality over quantity.

It would not be a Shrine event if the serious purpose of the event were not accompanied by a hearty dose of fun. Mary Poppins set the tone – a spoonful of sugar helps the medicine go down, she sang. So, an open-air picnic with hot dogs, sandwiches, cookies and lemonade certainly helped the medical tours and program go over.

This year, the tour included presentations on the range of services the Hospital provides. The newer and notable features included the hospital's amazing EOS diagnostic imaging machine and magnetically adjustable orthopedic rods.

The EOS machine gives clinicians a three-dimensional view of their patient standing or sitting. In a health care practice which emphasizes restoring or giving the ability to stand and walk, visualizing how the patient's skeleton functions in an upright position is critical. The

machine itself is formidable in appearance. It looks like a 21st century phone booth would appear, if there were any phone booths left. Patients stand or sit inside the booth. The diagnostic imaging technicians adjust the machine to scan only the areas of the patient which need to be imaged. The EOS uses a small fraction of the X-ray radiation used by traditional machines. It dramatically reduces the total body radiation exposure of the patients. That has huge health benefits for the children seen at the hospital. The EOS machine was a great addition to the hospital - and it cost \$750,000. The funds for that device came from Shriners throughout the Midwest.

Some Shriners' patients present with spinal anomalies such as scoliosis, or improperly formed leg or arm bones. Treatment may include insertion of metal rods to straighten the spine or the bones. That treatment is complicated by the growth of the patients – the rods become too short as the bones lengthen. Until recently, extending the rods required additional surgeries, which meant hospital admissions, taking kids from school and the risks that go with inpatient procedures.

In the past year, Shriners has begun using new technology - rods that are adjustable with magnetics through the patient's skin, with no incisions or surgery. Many of the adjustments are done in the patient's home, by the child's parents. The adjustments can be made more frequently and in smaller increments, resulting in a more normal response to growth. It offers huge advantages from eliminating several follow-up surgeries. The downside? The rods are made of surgical titanium, machined to exacting tolerances. They cost tens of thousands of dollars. That's where Shriners' motto of "love to the rescue" comes in. We don't put cost before patient wellbeing. The Chicago Hospital Board approved introduction of the magnetic rods

knowing full well that fundraising would need to pick up the tab.

After the guests saw the Hospital's facilities displayed, they heard the results of our services from one of their recipients. Isabella Rose, a 15-year-old now living in Santa Rosa, was born with difficulties swallowing, breathing, sleeping and soon afterward, talking. Her parents took her from one health care specialist to another without success. Through an acquaintance who was on the Chicago Hospital Board, Isabella's family was able to bring her to Chicago. There, within five minutes, the professional staff diagnosed her problem - a rare type of cleft palate which is not visible. Surgery and therapy corrected the problem with spectacular results.

Isabella, who had trouble learning to talk, delivered the keynote address of Hospital Day. She confidently and clearly told the assembled guests how Shriners' treatment changed her life completely. To put an exclamation point on it, she also sang the national anthem. Her story was profound and moving, an example of the results of compassion.

Hospital Day traditionally ends like most events, with the crowd in the parking lot. There's a slight variation on the theme at the Chicago (Oak Park) facility. The crowd doesn't just walk out to the parking lot and leave. They attend a Shriners' Parade out there in which more than a dozen units march the 1000-foot-long perimeter of the parking lot. The units pass in review under the dropoff portico of the hospital and return to the place from whence they left, the side lot.

Billed as the World's Shortest Shrine Parade, the 2018 running became perhaps the oddest. It featured drum and pipe corps, Tin Lizzies, mini cars, motorcycles, motorized magic carpets, clowns, and vintage cars. Tebala Shrine brought their wing of fighter planes, which patrolled the parking lot (on their go-kart wheels) without encountering any hostile fire. Not to be outdone, the local force, Medinah Shriners, launched their air power. Medinah fields a much larger airplane which gives a convincing appearance of a King Air twin engine plane on top of a go kart. The proud pilot maneuvered Medinah's air command around the lot, proudly displaying its newly refurbished airframe and paint. He piloted the machine under the portico. He was making the final turn to line up for his final approach when the impossible occurred – the plane crashed in the parking lot.

In but a moment, the plane stopped rolling along and fell, dead, on its nose, awkwardly positioned and blocking the parade route. Behind this embarrassing situation, the remaining parade units marched in place, waiting to see what would happen.

The response was all but legendary: the crowd had a chance to see how many Shriners it took to fix an airplane. Masonic dedication being what it is, within a few moments of the plane crash, dozens of brethren raced to the rescue. Their efforts consisted, at least initially, of standing around the downed aircraft and offering solemn pronouncements about what should be done. Finally, after a few minutes, the commander of Medinah's air wing arrived at the scene, inspected the machine and issued a directive. We would pick up the plane and carry it.

Thus, it was that we learned, by doing, how many Shriners it took – one commander to give directions, and something like a dozen to lift, push, pull, and shove the plane to the side lot. There, after more deliberations, the same teamwork resulted in the plane being pushed onto its trailer.

The annals of the Shrine will record many tales of virtue, dedication and honor. It is safe to say, though, that it is likely that anything like the Great Plane Crash of 2018 will again be seen.

ZOR/ Imperial Shrine Dues

Sometimes it may seem like dues notices are coming around sooner than we may have expected. After all, as we get older, it seems like time slips by faster and faster and pretty soon we are looking at a renewal notice for a magazine, newspaper or our membership in the fraternal organizations. There seems to be some misunderstandings among members belonging to Shriners International and Zor Shriners. Dues notices typically are sent in the fall to cover the membership costs for the upcoming year, not the current year. Current dues are broken down as follows: Dues (next year) \$50.00, Per Capita Tax (next year) \$30.00, and Hospital Assessment (next year) of \$5.00, totaling \$85.00. Our dues are actually due by December 31st of the current year to cover the next year's membership costs. Early in the year, ZOR Shriners are required to remit to Shriners International that portion of each individual's dues that are payable to Imperial. When we have individual nobles who remain unpaid, those funds are coming out of the ZOR Shriners bank account to cover the Imperial portion. This does put stress on our budgeting process and can ultimately lead to a brother being suspended for non-payment of dues.

Current policy automatically places a Noble in a suspended status should the dues go unpaid after one year ending on the current year December 31st. Also, this suspended status can cause a Noble to go through what I call some 'nuisance paperwork' to achieve reinstatement - which none of us like! If there are special circumstances that are preventing a Noble from remitting dues payments, such as physical or cognitive functions, financial, or other issues, you or a family member is encouraged to contact a club or unit officer or Divan representative who in all likelihood could help solve any of these problems. After all we all became Shriners to be part of something 'bigger than ourselves' and to help our 'kids'. I trust that hasn't changed over the years. No matter how much, or how little, we can be involved in our fraternity our financial strength is still very important to continue our mission of helping our 'kids'. By not paying dues on a timely basis or letting it go until one is suspended definitely puts stress on our financial strength and diminishes our ability to move forward. Hopefully this helps clear up any misunderstandings of how our dues system works and should there be any questions please do not hesitate to contact the ZOR office, club or unit officers, or your Divan representative.



American Burn Association honors Shriners Hospitals for Children physical therapist

Ingrid Parry receives the 2018 Barbara Knothe Burn Therapist Achievement Award



Ingrid Parry, a physical therapist at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California, has been honored by the American Burn Association (ABA) as the recipient of the 2018 Barbara Knothe Burn Therapist Achievement Award. The award commemorates the spirit of Barbara Knothe, who dedicated over 20 years of service to burn rehabilitation. It is intended to inspire occupational and physical therapists to be both clinical and research based in their daily practice.

The award was presented to Ms. Parry during the 2018 Annual Meeting of the ABA held April 10-13 in Chicago. ABA President Steven Wolf, M.D., chief of staff at the Galveston Shriners Hospital, and outgoing ABA President Linwood R. Haith, M.D., presented the award.

"Receiving the Barbara Knothe Award is particularly meaningful to me because I have devoted my entire life's work to be a burn therapist and honing my skills to make the best

difference in the life of children who are burned that I possibly can," said Ms. Parry. "I have met innumerable patients and their parents who have added to my journey of learning. They don't probably realize it, but I carry those memories and lessons with me like they are my angels as I try to not only improve my own skills but to improve burn rehabilitation in general."

Ms. Parry holds a Master of Science Physical Therapy from Duke University and a Bachelor of Science Kinesiology from the University of Colorado, Boulder. She has worked for Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California for 21 years as a physical therapist and rehabilitation research specialist. She also is a research physical therapist for the University of California, Davis.

Through her work with the ABA, Ms. Parry participated in the development of the American Burn Association Burn Therapist Certification (BT-C). Established in April 2018, the certification serves to formally identify a physical or occupational therapist who has specialized skill, knowledge and experience in burn care.

"Burn survivors have so many rehabilitation needs after their injuries that they need burn rehabilitation specialists to help them fully recover," said Ms. Parry. "Now, with the BT-C, therapists with this specialization can be identified throughout the country. Having a certification for burn therapists also raises the standard of care, helping burn therapists throughout the world achieve a defined high level of practice."

Ms. Parry said her work has been inspired by the work of other burn therapists throughout the world, including her colleagues at all four Shriners Hospitals for Children specializing in burn care. "The burn rehabilitation community is a collaborative and dynamic group of passionate professionals," she said.



We have had Shriners Awareness Day on the calendar for months. However, we did not know that Shriners would be called upon to be part of a rescue mission to save critically burned children in Guatemala. Nobles from Florida, Guatemala and Texas have worked closely and collaboratively with Shriners Hospitals for Children medical professionals as well as governmental leaders from the United States and Guatemala in actively participating in this rescue mission. At 3:15 pm (CT), a military transport plane with military burn specialists on board, left San Antonio to land in Guatemala in hopes of picking up six children who have suffered burn injuries in the recent volcanic eruption in Guatemala. Medical professionals for Shriners Hospitals for Children are already in Guatemala and are making arrangements for the transportation of the children from a hospital in Guatemala to the military transport provided for this mission.

It is estimated that the burned children, their guardians and Shriners Hospitals for Children personnel will arrive in Galveston for transport to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Galveston at 12:50 am on Thursday morning.

The critical part of this mission will be the work of the medical professionals in preparing the patients for transport while in Guatemala. Quickly getting the patients ready for transport will test the skills of the medical teams involved.

While this transportation mission is being completed, Nobles and their ladies are encouraged to continue to learn about and participate in this mission. There are several specific things that you can do to help make sure this rescue mission is successful. You may want to contact your local television station to see if they have any information on the current status of this mission. By the late newscast, there should be information/video on whether the medical teams have arrived at the

hospital in Guatemala and perhaps even left that hospital with their patients en route to the military transport at the airport in Guatemala.

You can also share this information, concern about these patients and the success of this mission with friends and family members so they can also track the progress of these patients to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Galveston.

Do not hesitate to post about this rescue mission on Facebook. Finally, this is a great opportunity to share with your Masonic friends, who may not yet be Shriners, about how great it is to know that Shriners are making a tremendous difference in the lives of children by providing outstanding specialty care to children without regard to their families' ability to pay.

As owners of Shriners Hospitals for Children, Nobles and their ladies have a deep interest in the success of this rescue mission. We encourage all Nobles and their families to become part of this mission by actively participating in spreading the word as identified above.

You should be extremely proud to be an important part of the Shrine during the course of this rescue mission and of the world-class medical care and treatment these children will receive while at Shriners Hospitals for Children following the successful completion of their transportation to Galveston.


