



2018 ALL-AREA FOOTBALL TEAM

The Southwest Wisconsin Shrine Club and QueenB Radio of Platteville has announced their 11th Annual All-Area football team. The players are selected by local media that cover the SWC, SWAL, and 6-Rivers conferences in southwest Wisconsin.

The players were honored at a "Tail-Gate" banquet at the Sports Page in Belmont on November 18, 2018. The Master of Ceremonies for the event was QueenB Radio General Manager Herb Cody . The speaker for the evening was Dennis Murphy. He is a WFCA Hall of Fame member who taught and coached at Black Hawk schools. He shared how many mentors led him along the way. He stressed that no matter how much you love your chosen profession, one must work hard to be a success in that profession. A video interview featuring Alex Erickson of the Cincinnati Bengals and a former Wisconsin Badger was presented. Also he is a past award winner of an All-Area Award as a Darlington High School athlete. He too described what it takes to be a success. While a little luck is involved, hard work certainly improves the luck one has. Noble Peter Augelli talked about what being a Shrine Mason means to him. In this discussion he described the many things that both Shriners and Masons do for society and how proud he is to be part of the organization. The awards were presented



by Mark Evenstad, and RJ Osterholz, sports directors for the 4 QueenB radio stations.

A contribution to the Minneapolis Shrine Hospital was made in the players honor.

Black Hawk's Cory Milz was named the All-Area Coach of the Year. He led the

undefeated Warriors (13-0) to 22-15 victory over top-ranked Edgar (13-1) in the WIAA Division 7 state championship game at Camp Randall.

Black Hawk junior lineman Avery Baumgartner was named the All-Area Lineman of the Year.

Mineral Point junior quarter back Isaac Lindsey was named the All-Area Offensive Player of the Year after leading the Pointers (9-2, 6-0) to a second straight conference title. Lindsey completed 142 of 237 passes for a league-high 2,260 yards, 26 TDs with only 6 interceptions in 11 games. He also rushed for 632 yards and 10 TDs on 115 carries.

River Valley senior linebacker Shane Liegel was named the All-Area Defensive Player of the year after earning Co-SWC Defensive Player of the Year for the SWC runner-up Blackhawks (8-3, 4-1 SWC). Liegel finished his senior with 107 total tackles, 12 tackles for loss, two sacks and one interception.







Adison continues to succeed as a football player after adjusting to wearing a prosthetic leg



He has been tackling in the field since he was 6, but in 2018, Adison had to overcome much more than a strong football offensive line. After having his right leg amputated due to a gunshot wound, Adison and his family were referred to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston. A member of the Shriners fraternity in their hometown of Eagle Pass, Texas, reached out to his parents, Daniel and Leticia, and helped them with the hospital admission process.

Adison received care for his wound, rehabilitation services and a prosthesis while at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston.

"He had to overcome many difficult challenges," said Daniel. "Physical therapy was hard for him. He would cry out in pain, but he prevailed."

The recovery period for Adison was anything but simple. Nevertheless, with continuous physical, occupational and recreational therapy, Adison managed to get back on his feet. He uses a prosthesis for everyday wear and switches to his running leg when playing sports.

Less than a year since his injury, Adison, now 11, is back on the field. He is a defensive lineman for the Broncos, a team in a local youth league in Eagle Pass.

"The hospital is a six-and-a-half-hour drive from home, but it's worth it coming down here for the quality of care," said Daniel. "The people, the service – it's been excellent. We are thankful for everything they have done for us."

Mickie named Chicago Bears Magellan Champion of the Game




Upon meeting 11-year-old Mickie, her sweet laugh and can-do attitude are evident. Mickie was born with Pierre Robin syndrome, a congenital condition involving facial anomalies.


