






When he showed potential in using his legs, he was fitted with hinged leg braces, which helped him build strength in his thighs. However, his calf muscles did not develop at the same pace. It was during this period that doctors recommended surgery to support further leg development.

Encouraged by his grandfather—a dedicated Shriner—Heather brought Rowan to Shriners Hospital's for Children for a second opinion in his younger years. This proved to be a pivotal moment in Rowan's care journey. To their surprise and relief, the Shriners care team determined that surgery was not necessary. Instead, Rowan was fitted with new ankle-foot orthoses and received a holistic treatment plan that included physical, occupational, and speech therapies.

With the comprehensive care and unwavering support from Shriner's Hospital for Children, Rowan began to flourish. Not only did he start walking, but he also began to speak—growing into a lively and talkative young man. Heather remains deeply grateful for the personalized care and compassion shown by the entire Shriners team.

Over the years, Rowan's progress continued. Today, he no longer requires braces to walk and participates in a variety of sports. He's an enthusiastic athlete, competing in bowling, basketball, track, and baseball through the Special Olympics. His basketball team has even secured a state championship title.

Now a confident and driven young man, Rowan embraces life with positivity and gratitude. He credits his journey with helping strengthen the bond within his family, fostering close and meaningful relationships that he holds dear.

Rowan maintains a busy schedule, balancing two part-time jobs—working at County Market, along with working at the St. Croix County Government Center in Hudson with the Rise Program. One of his goals is currently working toward obtaining a moped license. His long-term goal? Earning a driver's license and owning his own car.

Rowan Pruitt stands as a shining example of determination and the transformative impact of compassionate care. As Patient Ambassador and Parade Marshal, he proudly represents the mission of Shriners Children's—proving that with the right support, anything is possible.

## **Pertinent Imperial Bylaws**

325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume' consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, or circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) Expenditures prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officer void and order a new election.

## SCC researcher awarded \$3.2M grant to study foot deformities

Karen Kruger, Ph.D., of Shriners Children's Chicago's motion analysis center, was awarded a prestigious NIH research grant in September. Her project studies flatfoot deformities, which affect up to 1/3 of all children.

"A lot of those children who have flat feet will be asymptomatic but a subset go on to develop pain and a collapsed arch," said Kruger. "In children with cerebral palsy it may be as high as 60-70%."

The 5-year study will assess weight bearing computed tomography (WBCT) and its ability to provide 3D imaging for use in children whose feet are still growing.

This study includes collaborations with university partners and multiple Shriners Children's sites.




