Plenty going on... **Imagine That!**

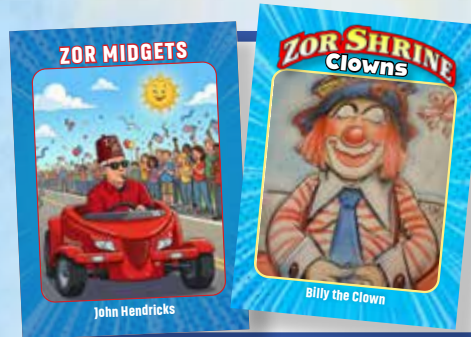

Polices & Procedures

With the arrival of spring and the beginning of parade season, I would like to extend my greetings to fellow Nobles and take this opportunity to share an important reminder related to event promotion and compliance.

Parades are among the most visible and valued ways we represent our fraternity in the community. As units prepare to participate in events throughout the season, it is important that our messaging reflects both the pride we take in that representation and our responsibility to communicate accurately.

In particular, please exercise care when promoting unit events and activities. Promotional materials should not state or imply that proceeds are being raised for Shriners Hospitals unless the event has been specifically designated for that purpose. If promotional materials indicate that funds are being raised for Shriners Hospitals, all proceeds

from the event must be directed to the hospital. Such funds may not be retained in a club's general fund or otherwise allocated at the discretion of individual Nobles or units.

The same standard applies to parade announcements. If a unit's announcement states that it participates in parades on behalf of Shriners Hospitals, but collected donations are not intended to be provided in full to the hospital, the language should be revised to ensure it is accurate.

If you have questions regarding this guidance, please contact me or your Divan Representative. We appreciate your attention to this matter and your continued commitment to ensuring that your unit remains in compliance.

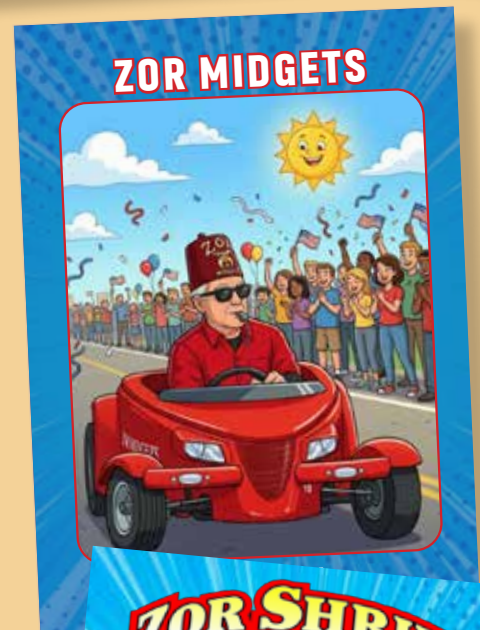

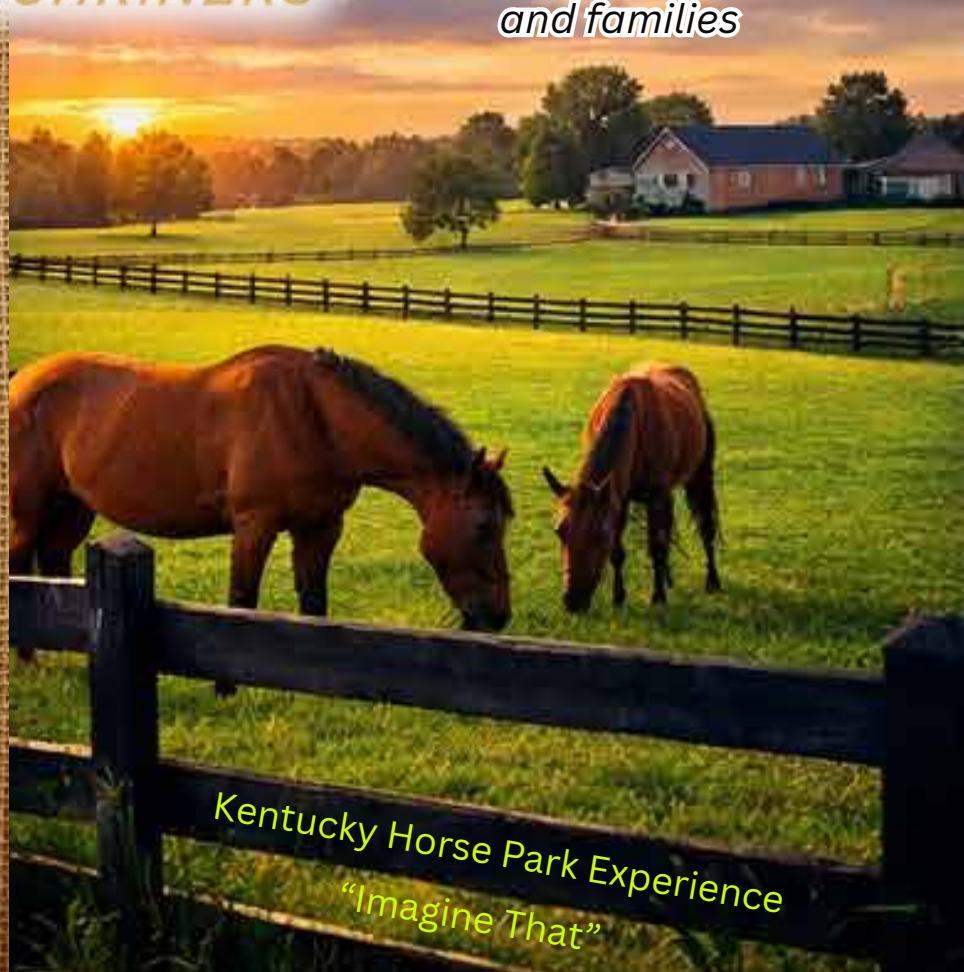
