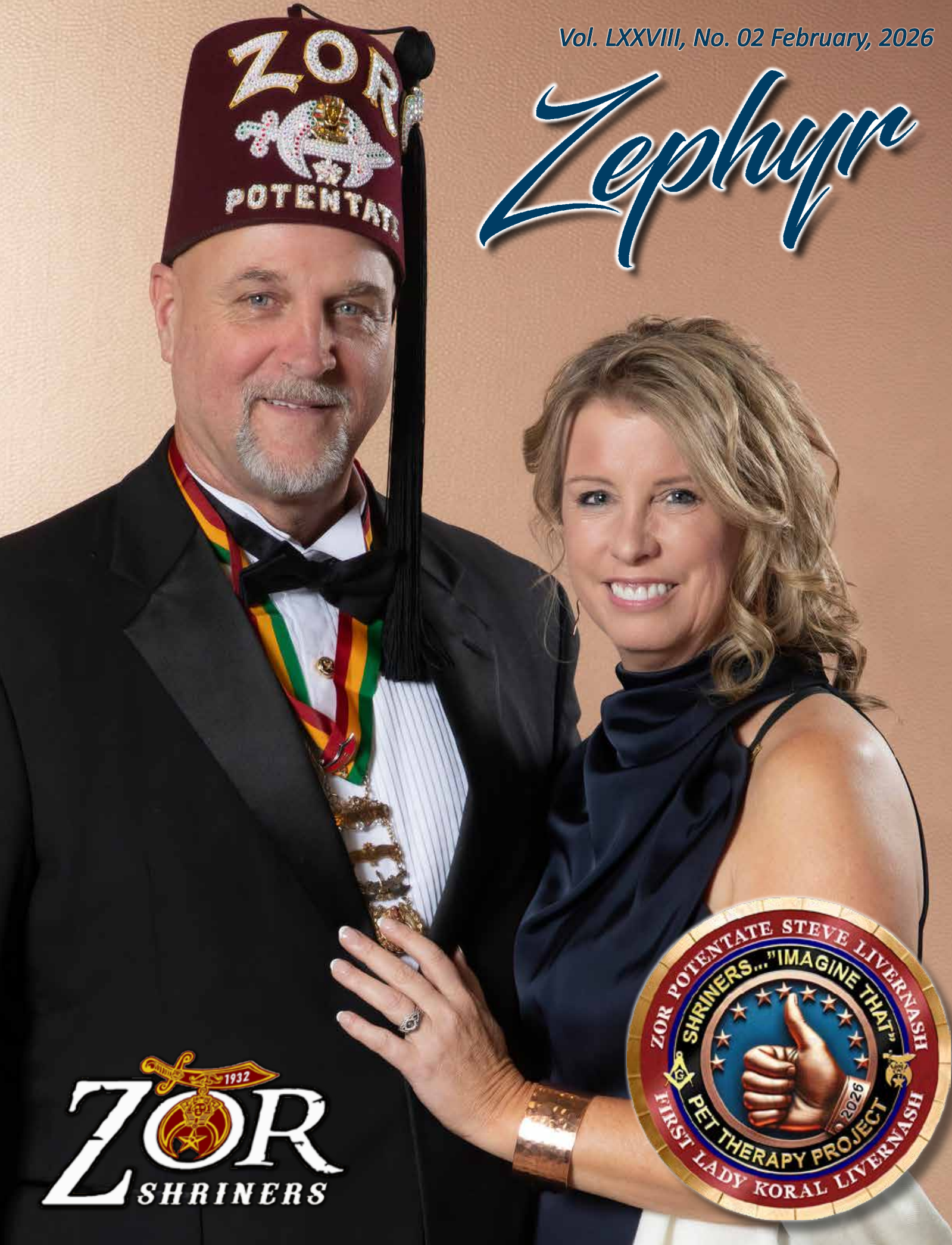

Message from the 2026 Chief Rabban

Greetings from the 2026 Chief Rabban, Ron Malcolm. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Nobles for electing me on January 10, 2026, to serve as Chief Rabban of Zor Shrine. I am truly honored to serve alongside our Potentate, Steve Livernash. I look forward to the year ahead and the leadership and inspiration he brings to our fraternity.

The roles and responsibilities of our Divan members have now been clearly defined, ensuring that each of us understands our duties. As Chief Rabban, my responsibility is to help ensure compliance with the rules and regulations of both Zor Shrine and Shriners International. Throughout the year, I plan to highlight important governance topics in a monthly article within the Zephyr.

In this February edition, I want to focus on Shriners International General Order Number One, which governs gaming and raffles. Recent changes to this order—effective January 1, 2026—were implemented to protect our brand and ensure compliance with state and local laws.

Key Requirements:

- All gaming and raffle events, including 50/50 raffles, must be reviewed by our Temple Attorney, Mark Hazelbaker.
- Clubs and Units must complete the required form and submit it for legal review prior to holding any raffle.
- The form is available on our website under Forms, and a direct link will soon be accessible through the Zor Calendar.
- After legal review and approval, the Potentate will provide final authorization for the event.

Under the Shriners International General Order, it is also necessary that Zor Shrine uses caution to avoid conducting gambling as part of Shrine activities or socializing under the Zor name. This would include NCAA tournament pools, poker games or other gaming. These activities should not be conducted in any manner that could be attributed to the Shrine.

Please note that if an event is intended to raise funds for a Club or Unit rather than Shriners Children's, no mention of Shriners Children's clinics or hospitals may be made in advertising or promotions. Failure to do so will require all proceeds to be directed to the hospital.

If you have any questions, please contact me, the Zor Shrine office, or your Divan representative. We are happy to assist and guide you through the process.

Thank you for all that you do for the fraternity and for Shriners Children's.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is no longer just the stuff of science fiction. From recommending music to diagnosing diseases in hospitals, AI is rapidly becoming a part of our daily lives. At first glance, AI systems may appear neutral, even objective. AI systems often reflect the biases of their human creators and the data they're trained on, resulting in inaccuracies and bias. The myth of AI impartiality is one of the most dangerous misconceptions of the digital age.

AI now shapes our online experiences, based on our interactions; what you click, what you viewed, and even who you respond to. This changes what news you see, what videos are recommended, or influence your understanding of a topic. Social media platforms use AI to optimize engagement but are not necessarily accurate. As a result, misinformation spreads and extreme points of views could be accentuated. At AI's conception it was hailed as increasing efficiency, personalization and automation. These days, this level of personalization has become manipulation. The more we rely on AI, the more we must ask who controls it, how it operates, and what values are embedded within the results it gives us.

Here are a couple of ways to guard yourself against AI biases and fallacies:

- Consider using online websites that can guide you to authentic content. These verification tools should be used to supplement – not replace – human judgment and traditional verification methods. Tools such as Media Bias detector, Facticity AI or InVID can help you determine the truthfulness of the output.
- Limit personal identification information and be cautious of giving any AI tools access to your computer, personal files or details. Many AI tools can share this information with third parties without notifying users.

This is not to say that artificial intelligence is inherently evil or bad. There are many great use cases and convenience factors from well meaning use of AI but it's up to us as humans to utilize our tools, like AI with caution and restraint. Our best defense is awareness and skepticism. By staying informed about these tactics and verifying unexpected requests, we can protect ourselves and our communities from AI-powered scams and misinformation.

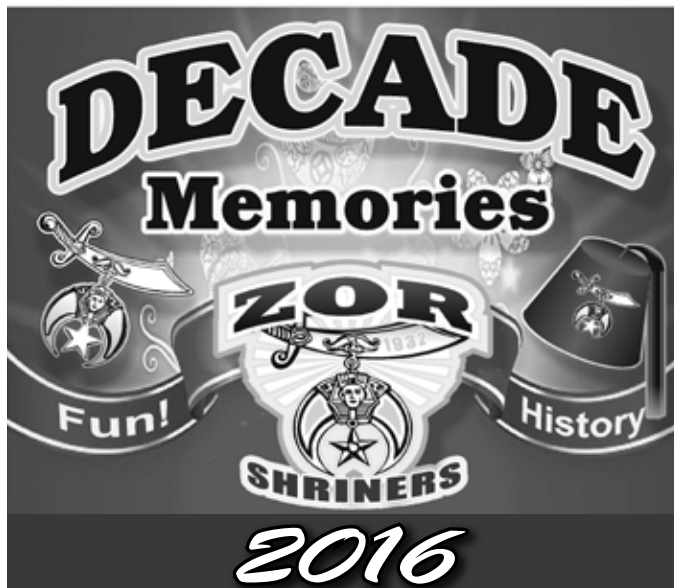
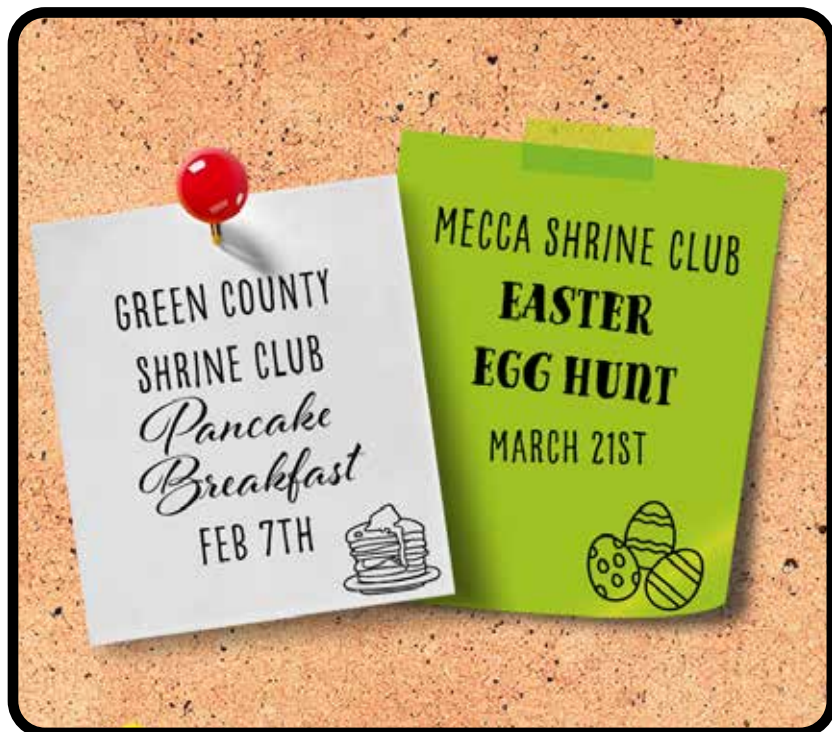
