4. If anyone ever has a negative experience with any of our paid staff, please let me know. As Recorder, I am responsible for managing the paid staff.
5. Remember, if your 2025 dues are not paid, you cannot participate in Zor Shriner events.
6. No reference in any materials or advertising can be made to anything that might imply that any funds being raised by any Shriner group are for our kids or the hospitals/clinics. Any wrongful marketing of any kind could lead to our hospitals losing their 501(c)3 status which would be devastating to the financial situation at the hospitals/clinics. Of course, if all the funds go to Shriners Children's and the event has been approved by the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of Shriners Children's, materials could reference the hospitals/clinics.


