Who Am I?

My brother Kevin stressed defense fundamentals, don't pull your head and take it off your body on a bad hop, and my Dad always said, "Watch the ball hit the bat, and you won't miss." I still struck out swinging my share of times...lol. He taught me the technique, and that where the ball strikes the bat determines whether it becomes a ground ball, line drive, knuckleball, home run, or pop-up. Baseball may be called a game of inches, but I learned it is really a game of microscopic concentration.

My family shaped me in many ways. My brother Todd and I spent countless hours exploring outdoors, leading to a lifelong love of treasure hunting with metal detectors. My brother Keith taught me about cars and fixing things. My sister Julie was always there and held my hand with guidance as a toddler.

Since then, every illness, diagnosis, setback, and challenge has been met with determination. Everyone comes from a different background. Everyone has different experiences that shape them. My advice is simple: be creative, be you. The world already has enough copies. It needs originals.

When you feel like you have seen the last few pages of a book you have not finished reading, you begin to appreciate life differently. You value relationships more and worry less about things that do not matter. As for me, I like to joke that I am cashing in on my extended warranty. So far, it appears God approved the claim. I still have work to do.

This is who I am. A product of family, faith, friendship, coaches, teachers, mentors, and a wonderful wife who never stopped believing in me. I believe ordinary people can accomplish extraordinary things when inspired, and that every one of us can make a positive difference in the lives of others, especially in the children we serve.

That is what brought me to you as your Potentate today, along with a mountain of other people. I share all that I know with you, not a know-it-all, fine line, big difference.

Fundraising

As Recorder of Zor Shriners, I am required to inform all Nobles at least once a year what the fundraising requirements are per General Order No. 1, Pages 41-46. I encourage everyone to review it in its entirety but here is a summary of the critical parts of it.

It is natural to associate the Fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children (Shriners Children's). Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fundraising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe his or her money will be used for the hospitals when all or a portion, thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

1. The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children or Shriners Children's" or reference to such in connection with any fundraising activity by a Temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.
2. No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations, shall engage in any fundraising activity without the written consent of the Potentate of the Temple having jurisdiction, thereof.
3. There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals or Shriners Children's.
4. Any officer, Noble, or temple which violates a provision of Fundraising Activities as outlined in General Order No. 1 is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of Shriners International.

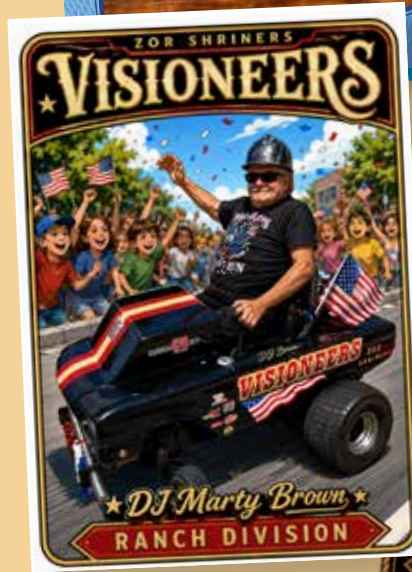

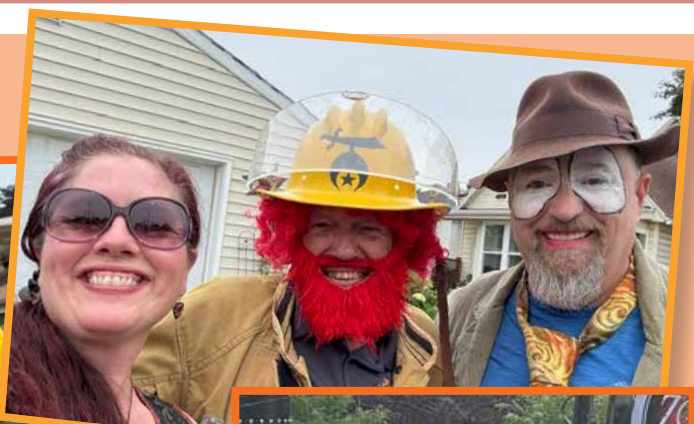

Parade To Joy! Behind The Wheel Of A MiniCar With A Lawnmower Engine Fueled By Love

Late in May came the call I'd always dreaded. "We need a Mini Car driver for the parade in Arcadia on Sunday. Can you come?"


The request came from Illustrious Potentate Steve Livernash. Since that request came from someone who has done just about everything he possibly could for the Shrine, how can you say no? So I said yes.

As I drove from Madison to Arcadia, I thought about why I had managed to be a Shriner for 26 years without ever driving a mini car in a parade. I've seen lots of mini car performances. Many of them were amazing feats of almost reckless exhibitionism. That led me to think I could never do that. Plus, I have always told myself I'm too busy. The reckoning loomed – could I handle a mini car?

I arrived at the designated parade muster site, the Ashley Furniture main factory. You can readily see Ashley isn't exaggerating when they label their complex the largest furniture factory in the world. When I saw the enormous factory looming ahead, I worried about how I'd find our group. No worries. The Arcadia Lions Club, sponsors of the parade, had its members out in force directing the many parade participants to their preparation spaces.

Site 43, our designated assembly area, was in the center of a hive of activity. Ahead of us was a political candidate; behind, a church group gathered. Shrine Clowns were preparing at a nearby site, riding around on their tricked-out bikes to get ready to spread goofy fun along the parade route.

At our site, I found several vehicles and trailers parked, one of which was a miniature pickup truck with intimidating decals proclaiming it to be the "Visionator." Soon I learned it would be my ride. After an exhaustive three minute overview of the controls of the 20 horsepower lawn mower under the fiberglass body, I carefully practiced driving.



Keep in mind that we let 8 year olds drive riding mowers – at least my dad did. So I found handling this barely controlled beast a manageable proposition. The basic drill was simple – follow the vehicle ahead of you. Until he moves, wait.

The “wait” part is something we all do a lot of in life. There was more than an hour until the parade started. In that time, I had the chance to meet the political candidate ahead of us, talk to the church group behind us, and then, to witness something truly remarkable –the preparations by Potentate Steve Livernash to take the steampunk carriage he built out on the parade.

I first met Steve Livernash a decade ago at the Shrine Circus at the time in his life when he was Batman. I’ve seen people in Batman costumes at theme parks. Steve was not in costume. He was Batman. The details of his costume, his posture and gestures – he was the Caped Crusader. Kids loved him, and at least one chick (Koral) dug it. If there’s anything you instantly get about Steve, it’s that there’s no half-measures with him.

When word came out in Zor Zephyr that Steve was building a steampunk style carriage, well, I knew it would be impressive. And it is. He started with a golf cart and ended up with a contraption straight out of Jules Verne. To get there, he attached carriage wheels, tufted bench seats, a ships’ wheel for steering, Victorian parasols for sun screening; an animatronic parrot; lights; a metal tube smokestack; and details that evoke 20,000 Leagues Under The Sea.

So our group of Shrine vehicles was, to say the least, impressive. At 1:30 p.m, the parade started. The groups marching or riding the route started moving, though not without many starts and stops. Eventually, we turned onto Main Street and – there was the audience!

After starting conservatively by just driving ahead in a straight line, I couldn’t resist the temptation to start driving in loops and making silly faces. I tried waving to the crowd and discovered, immediately, that the people lining the route responded enthusiastically.

And that was the most amazing thing of all – enthusiasm!

All along our route, there were families and kids – lots and lots of kids! I’m at that stage in life – people run into me and tell me “You look good.” That’s a sure sign you’re old. Too often, when you’re older, you don’t see kids very much. You forget how wonderful kids are!

As I cruised along, I waved to toddlers who clapped their hands and waved back. I saw elementary school kids who were hoping for candy but laughed at our shenanigans. Even the preteens engaged with us. And their parents were delighted to point us out to the kids.

It’s energizing to ride in a parade. You see there really are lots of kids in the world, proof that there is a future for our nation. You see that these small towns like Arcadia – battered as they have been by losing jobs to foreign countries—are resilient in everything that really matters. It was a diverse crowd too, showing that the idea of America still resonates with every kind of people you can imagine.

By the time we finished the parade route, I was not tired or bored. I was thrilled. I felt energized and hopeful about this country in a way I haven’t been for years.

So, I’m planning to be in a parade again! I hope those of you reading this article who haven’t tried it, will do so. The power of joy is beyond description!

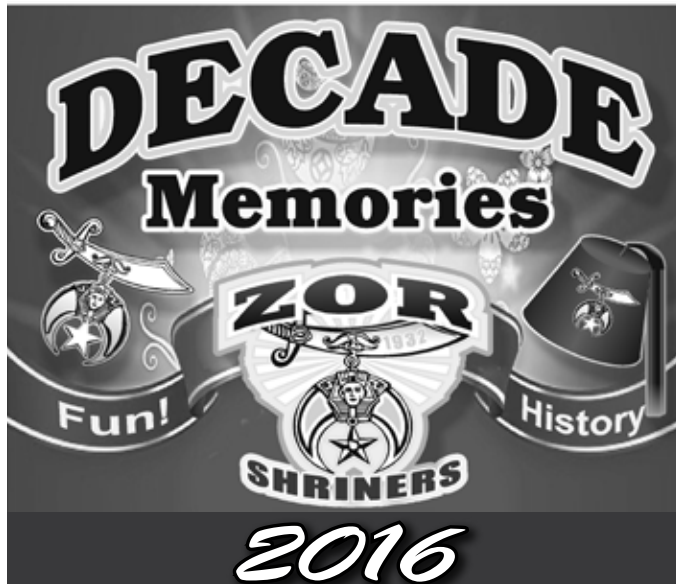
