When the Future Meets Tradition

There are days when I honestly wonder if I am keeping up with the world around me.

About a year ago, I earned a certification in Artificial Intelligence.

At the time, I felt like I was on the cutting edge of technology. Today, that certificate already feels outdated. Every week there seems to be another breakthrough, another program, or another tool that promises to change the world.

The interesting thing is that Artificial Intelligence is not really new. It has existed for decades. What has changed is that it has finally made its way onto our personal computers, tablets, and phones. Today, almost anyone can create artwork, write a speech, build a website, or solve complicated problems with the push of a button.

That is both exciting... and a little concerning.

Born in 1967, I grew up in the 1970s when technology moved at a pace we could appreciate. We watched each new invention make life just a little easier. I remember seeing Doppler radar on the evening news and wondering how anyone could see a storm before it arrived. Rabbit-ear antennas sat atop every television. The first microwave oven seemed unbelievable. The first television remote meant you no longer had to get up to change the channel. Fuel injection replaced carburetors, and suddenly your truck started with the turn of a key. Pocket calculators somehow knew the answer before we did. Bazooka Bubble Gum cost two cents. Every new invention was another “wow” moment.

One memory still takes me back.

One evening, I became lost deep in a large forest after dark. The only way to find my bearings was to climb the tallest tree I could find until I was above the tree line. Off in the distance, I spotted the blinking lights of a radio tower transmitting. I threw my hat toward that direction so I would know which way to walk once I reached the ground. Then I realized my headlamp was attached to my hat. Getting down that tree in the dark became a whole lot harder than climbing up. Looking back, whenever I see those blinking towers, they instantly take me back to life before cell phones, GPS, and digital maps—when sometimes your own instincts were the best technology you had. The more I learn about Artificial Intelligence, the more I appreciate the timeless value

of genuine human judgment and relationships. Technology has and will always change. What matters has not.

Artificial Intelligence is transforming medicine, research, and communication. At Shriners Children's, advanced technology is helping physicians discover new treatments, improve outcomes, and change the lives of children around the world. Those are advancements we should celebrate. Shriners Children's will be opening their first ever Research Institute at Georgia Tech's Science Square in the City of Atlanta.

At Zor Shrine, we embrace technology because it helps us better serve our Nobility and our philanthropy. Our needed Marketing and Communications Director, Anessa, has done a fabulous job expanding both our digital and physical presence while sharing the relevance, ideas, and story of Zor Shrine through our publications, social media, and the Zephyr and a slew of other behind the scenes projects that will impact our future. Divan member and Information Technologist Sean Shilling has implemented our new Nobility Relationship Management System per our strategic plan, giving us better tools to communicate, understand our membership, and strengthen relationships throughout our Shrine.

Over the past year, we have worked diligently to update our membership records. What started as a simple database project quickly became something much more valuable. By organizing our location data, we were able to identify areas of tremendous membership potential that had previously been difficult to recognize.

The results have already exceeded our expectations.

That information supports the foundation for bringing the Badger Shrine Club back to Beaver Dam after thirty years. Membership Chairman Rodney Schultz, Divan member Kevin Reilly, and I recently visited the lodge for a Shrine Night, and we expect the club to officially return this August. Even more encouraging, the data revealed another dozen Nobles living in that area who will now know a Shrine Club is returning and will soon receive an invitation to become involved again.

Just down the road in Sun Prairie, another fifteen enthusiastic individuals are discussing the formation of an exciting new motorized unit led by Brad Graf. Once again, technology will help connect people with a shared vision, while providing the information and support needed to help that new unit grow and succeed. In many ways, our new relationship management system has positioned Zor Shrine 2026 to become one of the most technologically advanced Shrine Centers

in Shriners International. We now have the tools to communicate more effectively, identify growth opportunities, and better serve every Noble across our jurisdiction. All it takes is implementation and use by our leaders. The tools are there. Zor is looking at the future boldly, living in the present, learning from and keeping values from our past.

But after all the software, databases, Artificial Intelligence, websites, and social media...The most important membership tools we possess are still a handshake, a shared laugh around the dinner table, or the feeling of belonging that comes from genuine fellowship. Technology helps us find people. Tradition helps us keep them. That is the difference.

Our Blue Lodges have understood this for centuries. Men are not inspired by algorithms. They are inspired by mentors. They grow through conversation, trust, shared experiences, and traditions passed from one generation to the next. The Shrine is an appendant body that can increase family time and bonding socially. While having fun and helping kids at the same time.

I believe the pendulum will eventually swing back to the community service we offer: fun, fellowship, philanthropy.

As the world becomes increasingly artificial, people will begin searching for what is real. They will seek authentic friendships, meaningful conversations, and organizations built on service, purpose, and integrity. We must be aware, embrace, and market membership more than ever before with vision, priority, purity, and awareness of changing trends,

And I believe that, no matter how advanced technology becomes, it never will replace the warmth of a handshake, the comfort of a friend, or the bond shared by Brothers and families united in a common purpose.

Technology may change how we reach people. It will never change why they stay. We are Zor Shriners!

Message from the 2026 Chief Rabban

Zor Shrine Represented at the 152nd Imperial Session

From July 13–16, Potentate Steve Livernash, Assistant Rabban Mike Kastens, and I, Chief Rabban Ron Malcolm, had the honor of representing Zor Shrine at the 152nd Imperial Session in Tampa, Florida. We served as voting members for the Iowa delegation. In addition, several of our Past Potentates attended and were eligible to vote as Colorado members on matters related to Shriners Children's governance. Zor Shrine was well represented, with at least six Past Potentates participating in the session.

During the Imperial Session, voting members considered 31 articles and proposed amendments. Of those, 23 were approved, 4 failed, and 4 were withdrawn. The withdrawn proposals were generally similar to, or incorporated into, measures that were ultimately defeated.

Among the proposals that did not pass were measures to eliminate airfare reimbursement for voting members attending the session, allow Colorado members to vote for elected Imperial officers, prohibit current board members from nominating new board members, and grant Colorado voting status to members serving on a Hospital Board of Governors. The proposal concerning airfare reimbursement failed by a very narrow margin.

Several significant measures were approved during the session. These included eliminating the \$20 per diem provided to voting members attending the Imperial Session and adopting a new Imperial dues structure. Under the new structure, the Imperial portion of dues, currently set at \$50, may be adjusted annually based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and changes in Shriners International membership, with any increase capped at \$5 per year.

Additional approved measures included requiring candidates for Imperial Potentate to have served at least one year on the Imperial line before nomination, approving address changes for two Shrine Centers, and authorizing four Shrine Centers to join regional Shrine associations. Members also approved the removal of Arkansas's exemption permitting Shrine membership for individuals who are not Master Masons, as well as the establishment of new Shrine Centers in Ecuador, Cyprus, the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, and Paraguay.

On the hospital side, four measures were approved that primarily addressed housekeeping matters, updated outdated language, and improved operational efficiency within the Shriners Children's system.

The 152nd Imperial Session provided an excellent opportunity to help shape the future of Shriners International while ensuring that our fraternity and our hospitals remain strong and effective in serving children and families in need.
