ACHIEVING HER DREAMS!

Shriners Children's Chicago helps create real-life Cinderella story

For most teenagers being voted queen would be the memory they carry forward from senior prom. But Jennessa, 17, from eastern Iowa, will also remember her shoes thanks to care she received at Shriners Children's Chicago. The teen was able to wear the cute sneakers she hoped for when a childhood orthopedic condition threatened her footwear goals.

Pediatric orthopedic surgeons treated Jennessa for macrodactyly as a child, a condition where the toes and foot may develop bigger. In



2023, she returned to Shriners Children's with a new goal, to wear sneakers at prom.

Six months before the dance, Clark Schierle, M.D., Ph.D., used liposuction to remove extra tissue on her foot. However, a rare infection put her fairy tale moment at risk. The team performed several procedures leading to successful skin graft. Jennessa was able to wear white sneakers to prom and was even crowned Prom Queen. "I remember receiving a text that night in April and seeing pictures from prom. I was sobbing in my kitchen tears of joy thinking this is why Shriners Children's is amazing!" said Dr. Schierle.

USA SLED HOCKEY CAMP RECAP

Good morning!

I would love to share about an awesome camp that we were able to sponsor, and I was able to attend at the end of June. Many thanks to Lauren for taking care of all the logistics with sponsorship and getting the word out to patients!!

Minnesota Diversified Hockey believes hockey is truly for everyBODY. They have five different divisions including blind hockey, deaf/HOH hockey, special hockey, sled hockey, and warrior hockey. We had the opportunity to partner with the Minnesota Sled Hockey Association for this camp. In Minnesota, there are three sled hockey teams for players 5 years of age and above. MN Wild Sled (Twin Cities), Mustangs (Rochester), and Hope, Inc. (Moorhead). Players sit in a sled with two blades on the bottom and propel themselves across the ice with two short hockey sticks with ice picks on the bottom.

This specific camp was one of four regional Sled Hockey Player Development Camps hosted by USA Hockey. The camp took place at Eagan Civic Arena.

The camp started off Friday evening with registration. There were 40 campers signed up from 11 different states...including several Shriners Twin Cities patients! While there were kids from all over, the sled hockey community is a close-knit community, and it was a reunion for many.

The kids were so eager to get on the ice and meet their coaches. The coaching staff included the USA Men's Paralympic head coach and members of the men's and women's USA Paralympic Team. One player was even from Minnesota! Kids were then separated into three different groups based on ability.

Day 2 started off by me making wiser and warmer clothing and shoe choices. The campers had a full day with two on ice sessions and two off ice sessions. On Saturday morning I sat in on a parent meeting with USA Sled Hockey staff. The dedication and investment the coaching staff had in youth sled hockey was amazing. Parents had the opportunity to ask questions and network.

On Saturday afternoon the off-ice session included time spent discussing equipment and what members of the paralympic team have found most helpful throughout their years of playing. For example, the men's USA Paralympic goalie takes an old track shoe, cuts off the sole and spikes, and glues it on his pads for better

traction!! I learned SO much about sled hockey and the equipment and dedication it requires. There are only two companies in North America that make sleds and caregivers are told to plan on spending around \$1,000! Many of the teams have sleds for younger players to use until they feel committed enough to the game to purchase their own. One of the parents said it best, "As a parent, we are not only a mom or dad, but a coach, equipment manager, and engineer". Sled hockey equipment is not a one-size-fits-all as many players (and parents) are adapting equipment themselves to fit their individual needs. It was cool to see the kids explain an issue they were having with equipment and for the Paralympians to be able to empathize and troubleshoot with them.



Coaches and campers are already looking forward to next year, anticipating another developmental camp in Minnesota! From time to time the Minnesota Sled Hockey Association will have opportunities for kids to try out sled hockey. They rent ice time and have equipment available. The president of the Minnesota Sled Hockey Association, Jason, will keep me updated on those opportunities so we can get the information out to the appropriate kids!

The next adventure starts today as Maureen and Becky B. are headed to Joy Ranch in Florence, South Dakota!

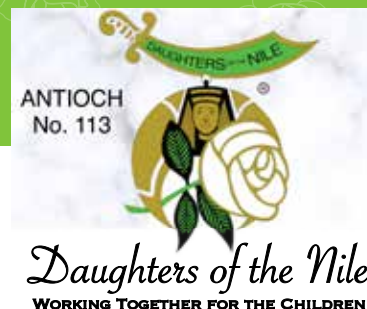

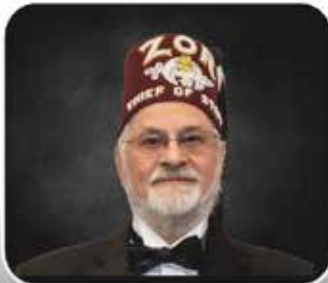

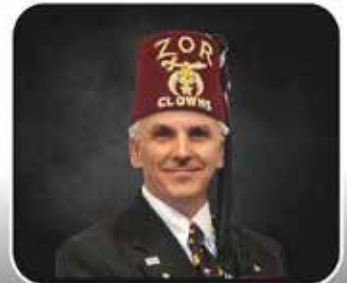
