1ST LADY PENNY'S PROJECT

In preparation to be the Potentate's Lady in 2023, I executed research on what my Lady's Project would be for Shriners Children's Clinic – Twin Cities. After learning the objectives of Camp Achieve and the activities provided to the Shrine Children, I made the decision to do my project for Camp Achieve, which is a camp for children with limb deficiencies. The program was founded in 2012 with the collaboration of the rehabilitation departments of Shriners Children's. The Camp Achieve program is funded solely through donations. It provides participants with a chance to participate in challenging activities that push their limits both physically and mentally and do it with confidence. Objectives for Camp Achieve are to have fun, build camaraderie and make new friends. To build confidence and to empower a child to attempt new challenges and become successful in a variety of activities, and to create a place for campers to share their perspectives and to learn from other's experiences and to build strength and gain perspective. All these things are important to me and are things I wish for kids.



With the parameters of the Camp Achieve Program, it was an easy decision for me to choose Camp Achieve for my Lady's Project. It wasn't just the parameters of the program and what it provides, but also the privilege of knowing a family from Sparta who has a son that falls into the categories that Camp Achieve caters to. Al and I are honored to know and keep in contact with Luke and his family. Luke helps us with the Annual Festival of Trees event as he loves to attend the event and share stories with Shriners. He is the "patient" behind the scenes who draws the lucky tree winners at the end of the event. Luke attended the Camp Achieve Trout Fishing event this summer in Star Prairie with Al and I and had a great time, even catching a fish he named "Bob". Our relationship with Luke has certainly grown over the years, as I remember back to the first time we met him, he was so shy he hid under the table, so he wasn't in site. Luke is certainly an inspiration and I'm grateful to be able to help support a program like Camp Achieve that benefits both Luke and other Shrine kids like him.

After deciding on my project, I had to establish a plan as to how to raise the money to support the program. As my story has gone throughout 2023, I wanted to incorporate the help of Amish in our community as several utilize Shriners Children's for their children's care. I'm honored that so many of my Amish friends and other Amish in the community were on board and willing to do anything they could to "give back". I decided to recruit an Amish friend who without hesitation agreed to make the quilt I raffled off as her way of giving back. Tickets for the quilt were sold by all the Divan ladies, friends, and family. I'm so grateful to all who supported me and my project and made it a success. The quilt winner was drawn on December 2, 2023, at Ceremonial in La Crosse. Congratulations to Paula Bloor who was the lucky winner. Paula is from Ontario, Wisconsin. Making it more exciting is that Paula's father was a driver for the Zor Shriners Midgets for many years.

I'm happy to report that with the sale of tickets for the quilt, two generous donations from both the Yoshi and Mehara Shrine Clubs, along with donations given by Divan members failing to wear their Amish hats when designated and other generous donors of my project I made a total of \$3,555.00. The donation has been sent to Camp Achieve at Shriners Children's - Twin Cities.

FEZTIVAL OF TREES ZOR MIDGETS

Three years ago, the Zor Shriners Midgets Parade Unit found it necessary to raise funds to pay for much needed new parade vehicles; thus, the beginning of Feztival of Trees – Sparta. This has been a very successful fundraiser for the Midgets Parade Unit and something the community looks forward to every year. This year was the Third Annual Feztival of Trees and was held November 13 - 18, 2023. It is a weeklong occasion and is held the week prior to Thanksgiving each year.

The event is held at Valley Lodge #60 Masonic Lodge, in Sparta, which is beautifully decorated for the occasion. After the initial decorating is completed by the Committee, tree sponsors come in with their trees and get them decorated and ready for display. Feztival of Trees is a great start to the holiday season with the Christmas smells and music that radiates through the building while the community enjoys the festivities. Those viewing the trees are provided warm beverages and snacks to enhance their viewing pleasure. This year the Zor Midgets hosted a total of 21 decorated sponsor trees with several others showing interest to participate in 2024.

Some exciting things that we have on site for the event are one of the parade vehicles for kids and even adults to get into for a photo opportunity, Santa Claus, the Grinch and Cindy Lou Who, and even a mini donut truck who serves up a variety of warm mini donuts with plenty of deliciousness.

Sparta has a shrine patient that attends the annual Feztival of Trees throughout the week and then helps with the event by drawing the winning tickets for each sponsored tree. He enjoys helping the Shriners and loves the Feztival of Trees. Drawing the winner's names is something he looks forward to every year.

The Sparta Feztival of Trees Committee helped the Wisconsin Rapids area Feztival of Trees get off the ground this year and they were also able to host a very successful event. If there are any Clubs or Units in Zor that would like to start a Feztival of Trees in the future, we would be happy to work with you.



Organizing community events that bring in fundraising for Shriners or their affiliated units is a significant endeavor. It requires making a puzzle, a marketing plan with pieces, and execution with communications. While profit is often viewed as the first piece in the ultimate goal of the finished puzzle, the true success of an event includes all pieces of the endeavor to complete the picture. The "Feztival of Trees" goes beyond just a fundraiser, in addition, the impact has been found in pure relevancy. The Zor Shriners Feztival of Trees in Sparta has thrived over the past few years, pioneered by the Zor Midgets, proving to be a successful Shrine unit initiative. Similarly, the inaugural year of the Zor Shriners Feztival of Trees in Wisconsin Rapids, organized by the Zor Funsters unit, has been remarkably successful as well. Thanks to the shared information between the two units and other Shriners hosting similar events nationwide.

This event has made a great impact on both Freemasonry and Shriners. Using local Masonic centers as the event venues has significantly increased awareness. As the public strolls through these landmark buildings, marveling at history & the beautiful decorations, they gain a deeper understanding of Freemasonry and Shrine.

Key highlights from the "Feztival of Trees" events underscore its relevance beyond monetary gain:

- The event created an avenue of participation & community service for Freemasons, Shriners, and the general public.
- Charitable contributions from attendees in the form of non-perishable food donations highlighted Freemasonry's commitment to social causes.
- The event garnered media attention via a press release to newspapers, TV stations, and free radio ads. Amplifying relevance and audience reach.
- A strong presence on social media generated substantial awareness with thousands of impressions & considerations.
- Digital, physical media, and word of mouth created a buzz to attend and turned considerations into conversions by purchasing raffle tickets.
- Advertisements consistently mentioned the Masonic Center location, connecting Freemasonry with the Shriner event and fostering awareness that Shriners are indeed Masons.
- Local businesses and families actively participated in tree decoration, fostering team building, family, and friendship bonding.
- Local dignitaries such as the Mayor, Sheriff, Chief of Police, Fire Chief, and Zor Potentate attended and showed event support.
- The event saw inactive Mason/Shriners proudly wearing their fezzes, for other Shriners a rekindling of their significance within the lodge room.
- The transformation of the Masonic Center during the holidays, from plain curb appeal to a vibrant, inviting atmosphere, became an outdoor/indoor showcase of holiday spirit.
- Families enjoyed meeting Santa, sparking joyful conversations, and encouraging return visits.
- Many photos were taken of the event with prop advertising and shared with friends and family.
- Boy's and Girl's Club, Assisted Living, and Opportunity Development Centers found engaging group activities through this event.
- The handout of requested petitions, by attendees, may foster new membership.
- A subsequent Santa's Special Christmas event evolved from the decorated space. Catered to special needs kids, and sponsored by the Lodge.
- Decorations continue to adorn the Lodge for meetings and events creating a warm feel. Big decorations were loaned to the local community auditorium with credit to the Freemasons and Zor Shriners.

Indeed, this event serves as a wonderful platform that unites communities, adding relevance to the identities for both Wisconsin Freemasonry and Zor Shriners. Together, the local communities felt and appreciated the good these events created. When the puzzle picture is completed, the pieces of relevance have set the stage for the last piece, profit.

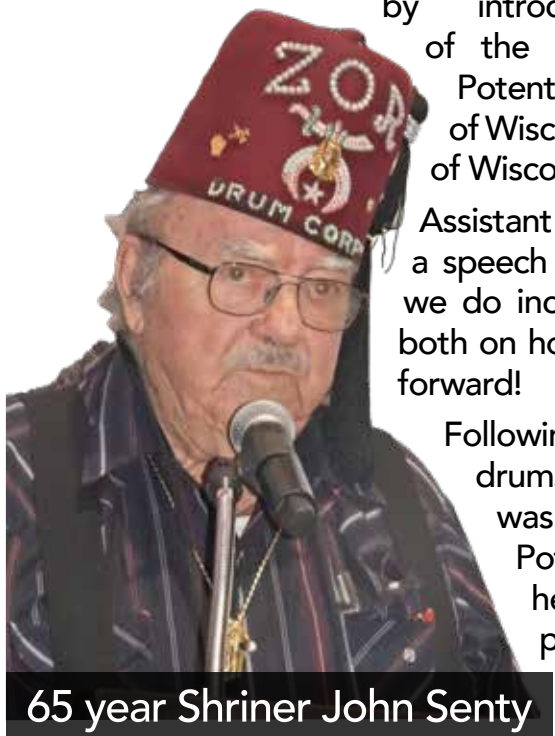

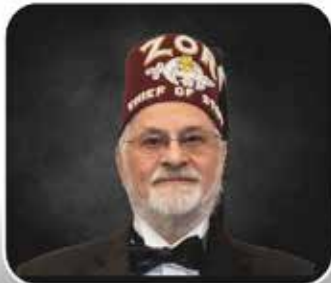

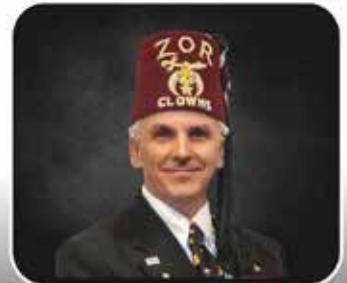
