SPEEDING TOWARD SUCCESS

Shriners Children's Chicago helps Brady drive toward his racing dreams

The work of the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) team allows patients like Brady to pursue their passions regardless of obstacles along the way.

Brady, 20, can be seen racing three nights a week in stock car #64. In most ways, Brady is just like any other young adult. But when he was 3, Brady was involved in a lawnmower injury and lost part of his foot. He came to Shriners Children's Chicago as a young teen with a very bowed leg and a foot prosthesis.

Brady had surgery in 2017 when he was 13. They were able to fit Brady with a slightly larger, below-knee prosthetic, which gave him more functional options for a prosthetic foot, allowing him to do the things he enjoys, like racing.

First Aid Kit Sales To Raise Money

As many of you know, our Shrine patients have complicated needs and have received the best care possible from Shriners. However, they are only able to continue receiving care until they age out of our system. After this, they are left to navigate the healthcare system on their own. Hoping to find the right physician who can continue caring for them the way they have become accustomed to. This can be very challenging for a young person.

I have seen this firsthand, as a Personal Care Assistant (PCA) I oversaw a group home where adults with disabilities lived. Taking them to the doctor was difficult. The "regular" doctor was just not equipped to help them with the complexity of their needs. I was therefore tested to find doctors who specialized in certain areas of healthcare to assist with their care.

Imperial 1st Lady JoLynn recognized a need to ensure Shrine kids can get the same level of care for their complex needs after they age out of the Shrine

Healthcare system. Her project this year inspired me, and along with Roger's slogan being '24K Care for Kids, it made sense for me to support this year's Women Impacting Care project.

During the flight home from Imperial Session last July, Roger and I hammered out the details of how this was going to work. We decided that since I work in healthcare, we would put together a first aid kit to sell to raise money for this project.

While we were talking with some of our friends one evening about my project, Illustrious Sir Roger said in front of these witnesses that if I could raise \$20,000 for my project, he would eat a carrot. OK! challenge accepted!

Almost all of you know how much he despises carrots; this is no secret. However, since there were witnesses to his statement, he is now locked in. This challenge is large, and after we talked some more about it, he decided to set some terms up for the challenge.

Here are his conditions for this challenge. If we reach \$10,000, he will eat a piece of carrot cake, if we reach \$15,000, he will eat a baby carrot and if we reach \$20,000, he will eat a full-sized cooked carrot.

So, if you want to see him live up to his end of this challenge at the December Ceremonial, find a Divan Lady and purchase your first aid kit to support my project.

Who are our officers and what do they do?

Let's continue with learning more about our order. Each chapter has 18 Officers, and they are (with explanation) the following.

Worthy Matron, she is the top officer and presides over all meetings. As the leader, she should exhibit fairness to all, and include all in discussions and decisions. Not be a dictator or be of a closed mind.

Worthy Patron, he is the one on her left. Making sure that the officers are proficient in their work, he presides over the ceremony of initiation and over our flag ceremony.

Associate Matron, she is to assist the Worthy Matron in her duties and preside over meetings during her absence.

Associate Patron, he is to assist the Worthy Patron in his duties and preside with the Worthy Matron in the absence of the Worthy Patron.

Secretary, keeps the records of the meetings and works with the Grand Secretary to have all necessary paperwork filed by the required dates. Conducts and receives all correspondence. Receives all invoices and works with the Treasurer to see that payment is made.

Treasurer, keeper of the monies, and sees that all bills are paid in a timely fashion.

Conductress, is the leader of our floor work for all ceremonies.

Associate Conductress, is her assistant and together they conduct the floor work.

Chaplain, goes without explanation.... they offer prayer.

Marshal, are there to assist you if you forget a line or word in your work.

Organist, another easy one...they provide the music during our meetings and ceremonies.

Star Points, these are the five ladies that represent our emblematic star. They tell of story of the heroine they represent.

Warder and Sentinel, they are our inside and outside guards of the doors. They work together in the performance of their duties.

Trustees, each chapter has three, elected by the membership. They audit the books, review the finances, and make suggestions for investment opportunities.

At the State level, the word Grand is added before each station, except with our top four, the Associate Conductress. For these stations the word "Grand" is between their station: for example: Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron, and Associate Grand Conductress. We also have a Grand Lecturer at the state level. In Wisconsin she must be a Past Grand Matron, she serves as the teacher of the Grand Officers, who in turn teach our members.

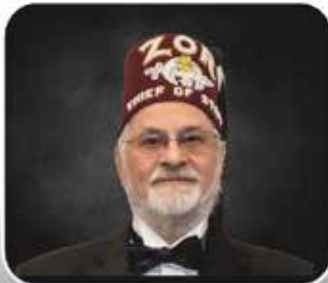

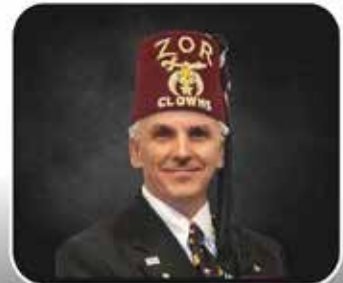

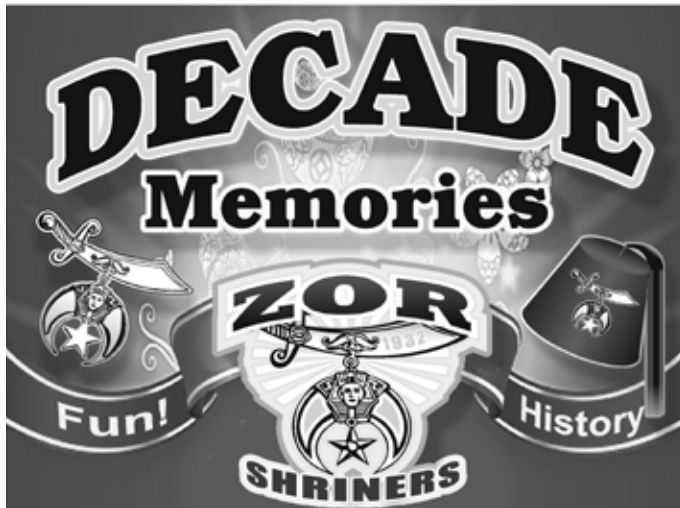
