# RECORDER BOB'S CORNER



2025 dues are now due. By now you should have received notice of this. After you pay, you will receive a personalized postcard attesting that you are a member in good standing. You can then choose the option that is most convenient for you, either digitally by downloading the MyFezCard Viewer to your mobile device to display your digital membership card, or by presenting your gold-colored membership hard card – either of which has a QR Code that the Temple can scan. Dues stickers will not be mailed. The Temple Office will have a limited number of stickers if exceptions rise. But again, we will only have a few. This will be the final year that stickers will be provided. Going forward, a Noble's dues status should be determined by

the Temple exclusively by using the QR Code.

We still have 87 Zor Nobles who have not paid their 2024 dues. They will be dropped from membership if not paid by 12/31/24. If hardship has fallen on a Noble, please notify a member of the Divan or me. Remember, if your 2025 dues are not paid by 12/31/24, you are not entitled to vote on any Zor matters in 2025 until they are paid.

SECURITY ITEM: Protect yourself from Phishing:

- Do not answer the phone if you don't recognize the number and let it go to voicemail. Most ID's can be faked.
- Do not respond to any questions if you pick up a call and think it's Vishing. Instead, hang up and block the number.
- Never provide personal information that you wouldn't give a stranger.



### ATTENTION ALL CLUBS AND UNITS

All clubs and units of Zor are encouraged to nominate Nobles for the Potentate's Annual Award of Merit. Here are guidelines to consider:

This award is presented for dedicated and exemplary voluntary service to Zor Shriners and to the Shriners philanthropy, the Shriners Children's (hospitals/clinics), over a minimum of five years.

- 1. Recognition for outstanding service to Shriner Clubs or Units solely shall be the responsibility of those bodies and the nominee shall not be eligible for the Award of Merit recognition as they do not meet the guidelines.
- 2. The Award shall preferably be presented to Nobles not otherwise recognized as serving on the Divan or by appointment to prominent positions.
- 3. No member of Zor Divan or past member of the Divan shall be eligible for consideration until at least five years following being on the Divan; then only for voluntary service that is within Zor's sphere of influence.
- 4. Nomination can be made by a nomination letter describing why the Noble is deserving of this award, i.e., what activities he has participated in; what offices has he held with the club/unit nominating him; how he has contributed to the shrine philanthropy; how has he been involved with helping children.
- Normally we request the letters be forwarded to the Zor Shriner office no later than November 1.
   While a woman has never received this award, the Potentate encourages such a nomination if a club or unit feels it is warranted.

The awardee is selected solely by the Potentate.


