



I met several Shriners from

around the world and spoke with them about their membership and how the other Temples communicate with their respective membership. I can tell you ZOR has some great things going for it as far as communicating with the members, but there is always room for improvement.

ZOR Temple received a Bronze Award during the Hall of Fame Membership Luncheon event. It was nice to receive this award, but it also tells us that we have a lot of work ahead of us to reach the Silver Award and someday possibly the Gold Award. I look at this as a marathon not a sprint race, in other words we are taking the small steps necessary to work our way towards the Silver Award, but we may be stuck in the Bronze Category for a few years.

In this issue, I am going to share with you some facts going forward that will show you why maintaining membership in ZOR is so important.

I'm hoping that we can work together to turn around the numbers in red to black by the end of the year! But that will take ALL OF US working together to get back into the black.

There is currently as of July 11, 2021, 100 Nobles who have not paid their 2021 dues and are close to being suspended for non-payment of dues. Also, by the time you get this issue of the Zephyr, Imperial will be starting to send out the 2022 dues notice. So, it's important if you have not paid your dues for 2021 to get them paid AS SOON AS POSSIBLE!! I as Membership Chair don't like or want to suspend any Noble for non-payment of dues.

Here is another table showing the membership of ZOR Shrine for the past 5 years.

Table is current as of:	July 11, 2021
2017 Active Members:	1,268
2018 Active Members:	1,204
2019 Active Members:	1,129
2020 Active Members:	1,075
2021 Active Members:	1,058

As, you can see the membership has been declining for the past 5 years and it is even more important if we drop below 1,000 members ZOR may possibly lose 1 vote at the Imperial Sessions. I am sure you maybe asking yourself why is losing a vote at the Imperial Sessions important. Well, there could one day be an important resolution that could impact our Temple in either a positive or negative way.

Another interesting fact is at the rate ZOR is going will be under 600 members in the year 2030. Now, that's only 9 years away and it would effectively shutdown our Temple as we know it today. This is a very sobering statistics that I have shared with you.

We have options available for you to use to pay your dues to avoid being suspended for non-payment of dues or you having to owe for 2 years of dues before the end of December during the holidays. These options are available to ALL MEMBERS of ZOR!

The options are as follows:

- 1. Making monthly payments from either your credit card, checking or savings account. This would be 12 equal payments in the amount of: \$7.09 per month.
- 2. Making quarterly payments from either your credit card, checking or savings account. This would be 4 equal payments of: \$21.25 per quarter.
- 3. Making a payment every 6 months from either your credit card, checking or savings account. This would be 2 equal payments of: \$42.50 every 6 months.

Please contact either Pat or Amy in the office at telephone number: 608-833-6343. They are more than happy to assist you in setting up the payment option that you decide would work best for you.

Now, if you are a member who is in distress for some reason as things happen in life that we do have any control over, please contact either Pat or Amy at the above telephone number so we can assist you. Everything will be handled in a confidential manner. There is nothing embarrassing or bad about needing assistance. This is what we as both Master Masons and Shriners do is assist brothers who need help. Who knows there may even be a day that one of the Divan Members may need assistance with the payment of their dues.

#### **CUSTOMIZED TREATMENTS**

Scoliosis is a disorder that results in a curved spine. The condition causes the spine to take on a curved appearance, sometimes similar to an "S" or "C" shape. No two cases are alike. Children typically wear a cast for two to three months, then transition to a new one. Bracing is one of the least invasive treatment options for scoliosis. At Shriners Hospitals for Children, every scoliosis brace is customized to the individual patient to best address the severity and location of their spinal curve.

**Spinal fusion:** Not every child will need surgical intervention. When surgery is the best option, our renowned orthopedic specialists have a wealth of experience. In fusion surgery, screws and rods are used to correct the curve, then bone grafts fuse the spine to hold the correction in place.

Vertebral body tethering (VBT): This treatment is an alternative to fusion surgery for certain patients. It was developed by our medical team at the Shriners Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This technology helps correct the scoliosis while allowing a more natural motion, unlike fusion surgeries.
