Greetings All, Your Temple leadership is fresh off Shriners Annual Imperial session that was held in Charlotte NC this year, July 2nd – 6th. Many resolutions were on the call, but the one that has the most effect on our Temple was the annual per capita increase. Like everything else, the unstable stock market and cost of doing business has also taken its toll on Shriners International. Imperial Sir James E. "Ed" Stolze Jr. was elected to serve as Imperial Potentate. Imperial Sir Stolze hails from Phoenix AZ and along with his Lady JoLynn Dickins will reign over Shriners International for 2023/2024. Imperial Sir Stolze reported that there was a membership increase for two consecutive quarters in 2023, this has not happened in many years. Shriners are 180 thousand members strong worldwide with new Temples being formed yearly. This year Lubnan Temple from Lebanon received its charter bringing the number of Temples worldwide to two hundred. The Shriners Fraternity has chapters in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Panama, Puerto Rico, the Philippines, Germany, Brazil, Bolivia and Lebanon, and members spread across six continents.

A recent trip to the Star Prairie WI trout fishing pond proved to be a fun day for many kids from the Twin Cities Clinic Camp Achieve Program. This program is in its 22nd year and is sponsored by the Zuhrah Shriners from Minnesota. The 30 plus kids fishing on July 28 were assisted by Nobles from Zor's St. Croix Valley Shrine Club, Zuhrah's Sportsman's Shrine Club and other Nobles who provided technical assistance with baiting hooks, untangling crossed lines, and hook and fish removal. When the final count was taken, I believe more fishermen were



hooked than fish. This is a great event for Shriners to meet the many patients we support. This is an awesome event to help out with if you get the chance.

Mentoring and Membership, as you all know, it is important and something we need to continue to work on. We need members and I know I'm preaching to the choir, but if every member could bring in "JUST ONE" new member it would put Zor in the positive, big time and help secure our future. 



# 1st Lady Penny's Project

Camp Achieve is a week-long day camp for limb-different patients. Participants are split into groups of patients ages 5–8 and 9–12. Summer campers participate in a wide variety of adventure activities and challenges.

Winter Camp Achieve is a one-day camp featuring winter adventure activities, offered to patients 5–12 years old.

Camp Achieve Summer is a three-day day camp for patients who have a limb difference. The camp began in 2002 as an opportunity for patients to be with other children having the same needs and abilities. Often, these patients are the only children in their community or school with an artificial limb. Camp Achieve gives the kids a place where they can be surrounded by other children who are just like them. Campers forge friendships and learn skills while gaining confidence and trying new and different things.

The objectives of Camp Achieve are simple:

- To have fun.
- To build camaraderie and make new friends so each camper knows they are not alone.
- To have a place where campers can share their experiences and listen to one another's experiences and build strength from them.
- To have an opportunity to participate and be successful in a variety of activities.
- To build confidence and empower a child to attempt new challenges.

Camp Achieve is Lady Penny's project for 2023. Lady Penny chose Camp Achieve because of the number of kids/patients it benefits and because five years ago, Potentate Al and Lady Penny met a Shrine patient and his family from Sparta where they live. It has been their passion to keep in close contact with the family and to provide them with opportunities to be involved in activities and provide them with assistance as needed. What a rewarding opportunity and experience and one they hold dear to their hearts.

Lady Penny has incorporated the help of the 2023 Divan Ladies to help raise funds for the Camp Achieve Program by raffling off a handmade Amish quilt that



was donated to Penny for the project. As indicated in previous articles in the Zephyr and has been noted throughout the year, this fits into the theme of involving the Amish in their effort to give back for all the Shriners do in the Amish Community where Potentate Al and Penny live. The quilt is a "Trip Around the World" pattern and is done in gray, white and black colors. The quilt winner will be drawn on December 2, 2023, during the Winter Ceremonial in La Crosse. The winner is not required to be present to win. All 2023 Divan Ladies have tickets for sale. Tickets are \$5 each or 3 for \$10.

Lady Penny would love to have your support in her project by purchasing tickets for the beautiful quilt. Not only is the quilt beautiful but would be a heirloom for years to come.

#### **MEET YOUR NEW IMPERIAL POTENTATE**

James E. "Ed" Stolze Jr. of Peoria, Arizona, is serving his 10th year as a member of the Boards of Directors for Shriners International and Shriners Children's<sup>TM</sup>. He was elected Imperial Potentate, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners 2023 Imperial Session held July 2–6 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

To James E. "Ed" Stolze, family is everything. That includes his Arizona family — where 289 residents of Phoenix are not only his neighbors but also his blood relatives — as well as his Shrine family. In both, the bonds are tight.

Ed was born in Phoenix, Arizona, and raised alongside dozens of cousins. He fondly remembers his aunts and uncles playing cards at his grandparents' house every Saturday night. To this day, Ed and his family still play cards together every weekend, with games presided over by his aunts and uncles and their potluck style meals always featuring more desserts than entrees.

It's this family bond that Ed wants to nurture in the fraternity.

Ed met his late wife Cheryl, in 1985, and they married in 1987. Both were in the military, and they moved often. Their two children were born in Virginia, and the family lived in places including Iceland; Hawaii; Phoenix, Arizona; Biloxi, Mississippi; and San Diego, California.

Stolze enlisted in the Navy as a computer technician and was promoted through the ranks to Chief Petty Officer. Selected for Officer Indoctrination School, he was commissioned as an Electronics Maintenance Officer. After more than 25 years in the Navy, he retired in 2002 as a Lieutenant Commander, while serving as the Electronics Maintenance Officer for the Pacific Fleet. He looked forward to having his family closer together upon his retirement.

For his second act, Ed served as the Chief Technology Officer for a large school district in Phoenix, retiring in 2017. In addition, he is a senior leader-ship consultant for a family-owned consulting company.

Ed's Masonic journey began in Chesapeake, Virginia, where he was raised as a Master Mason of Doric Lodge #44 in 1992. Later, he became a charter member of Hunters Paradise Lodge #85, in Phoenix.

The "newest Noble" on the Joint Boards, Ed became a Shriner in 2005. His talent and dedication to the fraternity quickly led him into leadership. He served on the Divan of El Zaribah Shrine starting in 2009 and became Potentate in 2013. In 2014, with support from his wife and family, he started campaigning for election to the Imperial Divan.

Although he lost his first election, he continued his campaign efforts. Then tragedy struck. His wife Cheryl was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and passed away just 17 days later. Among her last wishes was a strong desire that Ed continue to run for Imperial office. She knew that it would be his Mason and Shrine family who would keep him going.

She was right. Ed says that as he was campaigning, there were times when he felt so lonely, in a room full of people. But in a room full of Shriners, he was no longer lonely. That's what the Shrine family is all about.

Ed is proud to be here today, serving this great fraternity and fulfilling the promise he made to Cheryl. He's grateful to everyone who helped him along the way, especially his children, Josh and Joey, and his best friend and partner JoLynn Dickins, who has supported him over the years and is generously and graciously serving with him as First Lady of Shriners International.

Shriners and Masons are his heroes, and this year Ed looks forward to serving and thanking the fraternal community.









## SHRINERS INTERNATIONAL RECENT GROWTH

Over the last two years, three new international chapters have been established: Salah Shriners in Brazil (under dispensation in 2021), Al Atfal Shriners in Mexico (chartered in 2022), and Lubnan Shriners in Lebanon (under dispensation in 2022). Each of these new chapters began as an international Shrine Club sponsored by an already established chapter. Through long-term growth practices, travel and strategic alliances with local Masonic leaders, the international development modality supports these clubs toward their dispensation and – ultimately – their charter.

Additionally, four new international Shrine Clubs have been created in the last two years in hopes of further international development over time: the Gabon Shrine Club (established as part of Mahi Shriners in 2021), South Africa Shrine Club (established as part of Mahi Shriners in 2022), Ivory Coast/Cote d'Ivoire Shrine Club (established as part of Karnak Shriners in 2022), and the Israel Shrine Club (established as part of Mecca Shriners in 2023).

Our international chapters have also seen the largest growth of new members over the last two years. Mexico, which has two chapters, saw 103.2% growth. Panama, which has one chapter, saw 5.7% growth. Brazil, which has three chapters, saw 17% growth. Germany, which has one chapter, saw 25.5% growth.





## PER CAPITAL INCREASE PASSES AT IMPERIAL SESSION

A very spirited debate at the just completed Imperial Session in Charlotte, NC surrounded the proposal to double the Shriners International per capita tax from \$30.00 per year to \$60.00. Passage required a two-thirds approval to pass. It failed to pass by 5 votes. The vote was 403 in favor; 208 opposed. 408 in favor was required.

However, parliamentary procedure provides a reconsideration of a failed item if a voter who voted against the failed resolution moves for reconsideration, which occurred.

After the motion to reconsider passed on a simple majority vote, several amendments were brought to the floor. Confusion reigned from the several authorities on stage who were responsible for proper protocol with the amendments. Eventually the amendment to increase the per capita from \$30.00 per year to \$50.00 per year passed with a solid two-thirds in favor vote.

Zor Nobles will be receiving their 2024 dues notices soon. Be aware the total amount due of \$105.00 includes the increase. Your Zor Temple will not receive any portion of the increase. The total increase was deemed essential to the ongoing financial needs of Shriners International, the fraternal arm. Shriners Childrens (hospitals/clinics) receives none of the increase. The hospital assessment remains at \$5.00 per year.

Everyone may want to consider buying a life membership before 2024. Today's cost for a life per capita and hospital membership is \$1,050. After December 31, 2023, it will be \$1,650. So you can save \$600 by doing the life purchase now.






