





Zor Imagineers MarCom Report

This report stems from the 2013 Zor long-range committee. It is a vision for a long-range Zor communication plan. In 2017, the communication structure was addressed for the future. Existing members & potential candidates will benefit from an organization that is up to date with current times. Our organic receipt for Zor membership growth is detailed in four phases: Foundation audit, Building a Structure, Organization, Marketing & membership growth. There is, and always will be traditional communications. In addition, four phases will be focused on with a timeline that evolves over the years.

Phase 1 - Communication Structure (2017 - 2020)

This initiative was both intense & time consuming. A foundation of Divan & member support was in place. A strong communication structure needed to be developed. "The Horizon Diamond Paradigm" is unique to Zor Shriners. Organically developed from data, missing communications, suggestions & vision.

Zor's website has been recreated. Savings for costly update charges. The ability to make changes and updates internally was a necessity for communications. GoDaddy is our host. www.zorshriners.com

The Zor Zephyr was reduced to a bulletin. The Zephyr was brought back to a journal status. The magazine is the only communication source that reaches all members of Zor. In 2022, it is returning to a monthly edition. Helmer printing is our printer & mails out the copies.

Member lists had to be updated for accuracy. Communication requires current member information. Social media channels had to be built to keep up with the ever-changing world we live in. Traditional and new ways to communicate are key to our future. 34 Facebook pages were built for clubs and units to reach their communities. Excellent resource to show our fun, fellowship & philanthropy. It is a great channel to share that message with the public. Users are involved in inspiring posts. Facebook & Instagram are our two leading social media platforms.

Email (Electronic mail) was in place. The addition of Eblast is an email using direct marketing strategies that is used to communicate directly to our members. We have about 830 of our 1000 members signed up to receive current news with this method. We can spread information fast and promote events. It is a wonderful way to communicate between the monthly issues of the magazine. We use Mailchimp for this service. Slack is a work platform for private communication. Internal communication was needed between meetings. Divan, committees, groups, clubs & units use this platform. It keeps an archive of conversations and files that can easily be recalled. Personal messaging can also be used. It is an organizational tool that keeps all internal communication in one place.

Zoom is a work & social platform. It was implemented by Zor before it became a household name. It is video conferencing available to Divan, clubs & units. During the pandemic it is vital for continued communications.

Phase 2 - Organization by Education (2021 - 2022)

Why do we have communications? The communication structure is built, and explanation is key to usage. Zor Shriners has entered the electronic world. Traditional communications are untouched & available to those who are accustomed to the way it was previously. We have many new additions to our communication channels to reach all prospective candidates and members. Also, return to the basics and update information. Training, learning, and sharing among our members. The upcoming Zephyr issues will have continued learning in the Marketing & Communications section.

Phase 3 - Creative Marketing (2021 - 2023)

Creative Marketing of Zor Shriners will be key to reaching our members and prospective candidates. It will keep the public informed of our efforts as Shriners and promote our events. Digital & physical media campaigns will be created to create inspiration of fun, fellowship & to show our philanthropy at work. These consistent impressions will lead to more interest in Shriners. Promoting Zor Shriners and Shriners International e-petitions initiative program. A membership program that has proven to be 200% more effective than in previous programs. Memes, short videos, and inspiring content posts. We have recently dropped under 200,000 Shriners worldwide. It is time to express our value & help our numbers. Zor Shriners must recreate a market name for Zor Shriners. Recently, the Circus brought much attention to Zor. We have an excellent opportunity in today's market to brand Zor Shriners. The most likely of immediate progress is in phase 3 with YouTube. The goal of these 3 phases is to be completed by 2023. Both physical and digital marketing content will be implemented. All platform user & passwords are on file in Zor Office. Zor Shriners will be hosting the 2024 MSA (Midwest Shrine Association) in La Crosse. Zor will be ready!

Phase 4 - Membership (2022 - 2023)

Membership is phase 4, not phase 1 in this paradigm (The Horizon Diamond paradigm). Membership needs the help of the previous 3 phases to be in place to work properly. Communication structure, organization by education, & creative marketing are key for membership growth. Potential candidates who see a highly organized organization are more likely to join. Answer to Zor Trustee Questions

Apparently there were questions raised subsequent to the Annual Meeting about why there was no election of Trustees. In an attempt to clarify, below are the reasons.

First, there is no requirement in the Bylaws that a Temple has Trustees. Zor set up the Trustees years ago to assist the Divan in the maintenance of the Temple building; rental and use of the building; and oversight of the investments held by Zor. The Bylaws clearly state that the responsibility for the Temples expenditures and investments rests with the Divan with ultimate approval by the Nobility.

With the eventual sale of the building, the only remaining task for the Trustees is the investment oversight. The Trustees have had difficulty finding Nobles willing to serve as a Trustee. Just having Trustees meeting to look at Investments when the Divan is planning to do that, seems a duplication of effort. Even if it is felt that the Divan should appoint another group to oversee the investments, such appointments should be Nobles with some expertise in investments.

Any questions about this should be forwarded to the Potentate or to a member of the Divan.

Greetings Nobles,



I'm sure everyone who had attended the event had a great time. I want to congratulate our new Potentate Rodney LaBlanc and his beautiful First Lady Mary; I wish them much success in 2022. for his year which I feel will be great for the fraternity. I am once again honored to be the Membership Chair for 2022.

2021 in review saw some positive movement in membership with the addition of 16 new Nobles and 5 restorations, but there is still a lot of work to be done. The unfortunate thing was the dreaded black camel visited 42 Nobles. Another unfortunate issue was we had to suspend 29 Nobles for non-payment of dues. Below is the information for the year 2021.



The chart above shows the number of active Nobles for the past 4 years. In 2018, there were 1,204 active Nobles; 2019 there were 1,129 active Nobles; 2020 there were 1,075 active Nobles; 2021 there were 1, 020 active Nobles. This does not include any associated Nobles in our fraternity. From 2018 to 2021 we lost 184 active Nobles for various reasons.

So, as we start into 2022, we need to reverse the course of membership from losing active Nobles to recruiting new Nobles and working with our inactive Nobles to getting them back onboard. This is where everyone comes into help, if you know a Noble who has been suspended for not paying dues or he is thinking of demitting from ZOR Shrine, please contact the Noble and see what we as an organization can do for that Noble.

The information below is the annual breakdown of the ZOR membership for 2021.

Meet the New ZOR Potentate

On Saturday the 8th of January, 2022 during Zor Shriners annual Meeting, held at the Madison Marriott West, Noble Rodney E LaBlanc was elected Potentate of Zor Shriners. As potentate, Noble LaBlanc will serve Zor Shriners as Chairman of the Board of Directors for the 2022 Shrine Year.

Zor's new Potentate, Rodney LaBlanc was born in Cumberland, WI on October 19, 1960, and grew up on a dairy farm in Clayton, WI. Rodney was the seventh of nine children. In addition to working on the family farm and neighbor's farms, Rodney was also involved in sports, Choir and FFA while in school.

After High School, Rodney worked in a number of fields including: farming; road construction; cross country truck driving; real estate; cheese making; prison guard and cabinet maker. Rodney retired from the Department of Corrections as a Sergeant in February, 2014.

Rodney married Mary on July 6, 1985 and they were blessed with three children: Benjamin, Jacob and Lexie. Ben and his wife, Alyssa live in Spring, Texas and have a one-year daughter – Avery. Jacob and his wife Kessa live in Poynette and have two daughters – Willa, age 4 and Nellie, age 1. Lexie lives in Montello. While the kids were in school, they were all involved in three sports as well as music and drama events. In 12 years, Rodney never missed a sports event, concert, or play!



Community service is important to Rodney. Through the years he has served as a member of the Montello School Board, was a Charter member of the Montello Jaycees; coached the kid's sports teams; ran the youth wrestling club for 11 years and consistently gives to others in the community who are less fortunate.






