

Mike retired in 2005 having served a total of 25 years in law enforcement. Mike is an adjunct instructor at Northwood Technical College in New Richmond for the past 18 years teaching traffic safety. He is also a member of the WI-Committee of the Employer Support of the Guard

and Reserve (ESGR), where he is the Area 6 Chairman which covers Western and Eastern Wisconsin, and he is one of 15 Ombudsman for the entire state. The ESGR represents both employers and service members who are working to prevent issues that could possibly have an impact on the service members duties as a soldier and the employers who support the service members.

Mike has been married to his Lady Susan for 38 years. They have 2 adult children Joseph and Stephanie, who are both married to wonderful spouses. Joseph has followed in Mike's footsteps career wise, and he is a detective with the New Richmond Police Department and Stephanie is a high school chemistry teacher at the Rice Lake School District. Joseph and his wife Kaila are raising three wonderful children. Scout - 5, Rhett - 3 and Tripp - 2, and Stephanie and her husband Luke are raising two beautiful children. Lydia - 4 and Jordy - 2.

Mike is also involved with the community of New Richmond, currently President of the New Richmond Municipal Utility Commission and a member of the New Richmond Plan Commission. He is active with the Butler-Harmon American Legion Post 80 where he is currently serving as the Adjutant of the Post. Mike is also a member of the Freedom Park Veteran's Building Committee where he is the secretary of the committee.

Mike's hobbies are fishing, digital photography, learning about computers and software, his grandchildren's activities and just spending time with his close friends and their coffee group which meets every day at 9:00 am.



Presenting the Fez to the MWGM were (L-R) Past Imperial Potentate Jim Smith, Zor Chief Rabban Al Brueggen and Past Potentate Mark Jerdee. Comments were made by the Most Worshipful Grand Master as to how proud he was of his home Lodge Valley #60 in Sparta, as it has produced two Grand Masters of Wisconsin and soon to be two Zor Potentates in the last 20 years.

Who we are is you! Thank you all for having confidence in me to be the leader of our Fraternity! I promise I will try my best to make you Proud and to make your Masonic experience as great as possible. I will not be doing it alone, as no one could. I have an amazing team of extremely talented men serving you as

your Grand Lodge Leadership team. We look forward to serving you.

At Annual Communication on Saturday morning, I started by bringing the delegates up to speed on what your Grand Lodge Leadership Team is doing to improve Wisconsin Freemasonry. The following are highlights from that conversation and words from our team that pertain specifically to our appendant bodies like Zor Shrine.

"Several years ago, the Grand Lodge leadership team developed a Strategic Plan. We had to build a plan to work off, we had to build a foundation, to lay a cornerstone. That's exactly what we did. That plan is based off three principles - Membership, Brotherly Love, and Education.

Membership is a 3-legged stool requiring retention, restoration, and relevance. Here's where I believe our appendant bodies, like Zor Shrine come in. Value add! We retain our Brothers and their Masonic families by adding value. Good men and their families like to have a positive impact on their communities, our appendant bodies do that! Good men and their families like to participate in philanthropy, our appendant bodies do that! Good men and their families like to have a fun time, our appendant bodies do that! Thank you for being a Shriner.

The Wisconsin Freemasonry Membership Initiative Program has had great results! Over the last 10 months, over 1,200 men have "knocked on our virtual door" and interestingly over 800 of those leads said that they don't personally know any Masons. As of today, we have conferred 60% more Master Mason degrees than this point last year. FYI, the number this year, my goal, is "1,000", plus a thousand good quality men belonging to our Fraternity by the end of the Masonic year.

It is important to note that being bigger does not make us better but, it does allow us to have more of an impact.

The theme of "Love ya Brother" by fellow Zor Shriner Most Worshipful Gary Stang Past Grand Master was exactly the right message at exactly the right time. It got us back to being together. Now it's time to shout! It's time to tell the people of Wisconsin that we are relevant. You should be extremely proud to be a Freemason. There is no better organization built on better principals in this world. We're not only the greatest Fraternity in the world, but we are also the greatest organization in the world. It is time that Wisconsin knows that. Everybody will do it differently. Some of you will do it while shouting from the mountain tops. Some of you will do it by wearing a shirt, a pin, a hat, or a bumper sticker on your car. And some of you will do it, as our Membership Chair says, by just being a good guy in your community. I don't care how you do it, but our communities need to see that we are relevant."

ZOR MEMBERSHIP MUSINGS

Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

I think we have finally turned the corner on Spring and have come upon Summer! With the start of Summer comes the opportunities for our clubs and units to participate in the Summer activities. While these activities are fun and meaningful to the participants and their communities, we must make sure that we are following the guidelines from Imperial.

Remember, that back in October of last year, we received our dues notices, and they were to be paid by December for all Nobles to remain an active member of the Shrine. Sadly, as of today, we have a total of 43 Nobles who have not paid their 2022 dues. The Imperial by-law clearly states if a Noble has not paid their dues before January 1st of the new year, the Noble is then considered to be delinquent until the dues have been paid. The by-law also states the Noble is not able to participate in any Shrine activities including but not limited to participating in parades, fundraising events, Club and Unit activities. This is due to not being covered by insurance.

Why am I bringing this up now you might ask? It is the prime time for our clubs and units to participate in parades and other fund raising events to support our great Fraternity. By not holding a current dues

card and something tragic occurs to you or someone from the public there is no insurance coverage for you. Your personal insurance and you personally become liable for the incident.

So really looking at the cost of membership is not a huge issue in the realm of things that could happen to you for not paying your dues. After a Noble has not paid their respective dues for two years, the Noble can be suspended from the Shrine for unpaid dues. In 2021, your Divan suspended 29 Nobles for not paying their respective dues. Please do not let this happen to you if you have not paid your 2022 dues!

In May, we welcomed the following new Nobles to the ZOR Shrine: Cody Bennington; Clancy Farago; Modukpe Houndegla; Jeffrey Little; Thomas McDermott; Wayne Pearce; Merl Steffen; Ken Walter; William McClain; and Ted Taylor.
