



Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

I think we have finally turned the corner on Winter and Spring seems to be on the horizon! Summer will be upon us before we know it!

In last month's Zephyr, I talked about how we as Nobles of the ZOR Shrine need to be out there recruiting new Nobles for our great fraternity. On May 14, 2022 we had the Spring Ceremonial and Potentate's Ball in Mauston, Wisconsin. There were ten plus new Nobles brought into our fraternity!

Now with these ten plus new Nobles, we need to make each of those Nobles feel welcomed and make sure we include them in our club and unit activities, because if we do not, we will certainly lose them as

members of our fraternity. By doing so, this is called "Retainment" which is the job of all Nobles of the ZOR Shrine Temple. So, if you have not attended a club or unit function in a while, what better way for you to get involved by asking the new Noble if he and his lady would like to attend a club function!

Retainment is nothing more than keeping the members we already have in ZOR Shrine, our clubs, and our units. If we do not work hard on keeping the members interested in our clubs and units, they will stop being active members. They may also start to wonder why I even bothered to join this fraternity in the first place if all I am is a number within the temple, club, and unit. We worked hard to find this new member and now we need to work even harder to retain this members. It all comes down to keeping the new member informed, active, and inspired that this is a premier organization for him!

Here are a few ideas for keeping the new member informed:

- 1. Have someone in your club or unit contact the new member and welcome him to your club or unit.
- 2.Go over or obtain his primary information, such as correct mailing address; correct or current telephone number, make sure if he has an email address that it is correct; obtain his lady's information such as birthdate and their anniversary.
- **3**.When the next club event happens, not only mail or email the information to the new member but call him as a means of checking that he has received the event information.
- **4**.Offer to pick-up the new member and his lady to take them to the event.

Here are a few ideas for keeping the new member active:

- If a few of your club members meet during a day during the week for some socializing, check with the new member to see if he is available and if he would like to partic ipate in the socializing event with you. There is a not a better way for the new member to meet members of the club or unit by socializing with a small group of members.
- **2**.Offer to give the new member a ride to a socializing event.
- **3**.Offer the new member to join your unit what ever that is.
- **4**.If there is not a unit within your club the new member is interested in joining, ask him what he is interested in, and you could be surprised there maybe other members within your club that have similar interests; there is a new unit that can be formed!

Here are a few ideas for keeping the new member inspired:

- 1.Make him feel welcomed to be part of your club or unit!
- 2.Introduce the new member at you club's event and have him tell a little about himself and his lady.
- **3**.Reward and thank him for choosing to join Shriners and especially your club or unit. The reward does not have to be something of value but encouraging words for something he has done to help the club or unit. Remember everyone likes to have something positive said about us!

If you use the above information or have something you do to keep the new member interested in remaining a member of the Shrine which is what our goal is with our new members!

Our next two big events happening this year, is the Imperial Session is in Minneapolis Minnesota and the Summer Midwest Shrine Association Event will be in Green Bay Wisconsin. The Imperial Session will be July 2-6, 2022. The Imperial Parade will be on Tuesday July 5, 2022. The Summer Midwest Shrine Association Event will be August 17-20, 2022.

A recruiting reminder if someone tells you they are interested in becoming a Shriner, do not tell that perspective member that you will take his name and phone number to pass on to the Membership Chairman or the Membership Committee. Direct that perspective member to beashrinernow.com website to complete an e-petition to join the Shrine. When a perspective member completes an e-petition, it is received at ZOR and responded to by the Recorder or Membership Chair within a few hours or days.

Either Recorder or Membership Chair will direct the prospective member to join a Masonic Lodge if he is not already a Master Mason. If he is a Master Mason, we will then take the steps necessary for him to become a Noble within our Fraternity. Just think how easy it is to take the perspective member and turn him into a Noble within our Fraternity!

With this being our 150th Anniversary of the founding of the Shrine and the 100th Anniversary of the founding of the Shrine Hospital system, it is an exciting time to be out in the public recruiting new members!

BEEP BEEP!!!!

Have you ever thought about how an idea originated? Who decided on the first circus? Who decided to build a wheelchair? Were these ideas planned for years with big committees or perhaps they were sketched out on a bar napkin at happy hour? Here is a fun story to read on how the Zor Road Runners got started. Many years ago, the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club supported a Shrine Unit called the Zor Zoo. This active unit consisted of full size mascot costumes of such characters as Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, Goofy, Dumbo the elephant, Yogi Bear, Porky Pig, and many others. This unit of characters walked in parades to promote the St. Croix Valley Shrine Club's Little East West Shrine football game. (The proceeds from the sale of tickets and donations of money for this college football game played in River Falls, WI, went to the Shriners Hospitals for Children - Twin Cities.) In one of the last parades for the Zor Zoo, one of the younger Shriners asked a seasoned Shriner how they could handle wearing the costumes in the middle of summer as it was like wearing

meeting at the Knickerbocker Cottage in New York City, but it was Nobles Darl Hoffman, Larry Nelson, Paul Stokke and Bob Hering meeting at the 11 O'clock Club in Bud's Lanes located in River Falls, WI. After many Saturday meetings and a few glasses of the foamy amber fluid, numerous ideas were hashed over until it was decided to go with a go-cart parade unit. Wheels over walking might allow more drivers of all ages. And who doesn't like go-carts?!

The original cart that was looked at had a triangular rear rollbar in which we could attach our logo. The logo of a character that would fit into the rollbar frame would have to be tall and slim. After trying to design different logos, the Road Runner was chosen. Going with the Road Runner idea, Warner Bros. was contacted to see what it would cost for a license to use the Road Runner logo. They said that the cheapest license would cost \$10,000. So, alterations were made to the original idea of the logo such as replacing the Road Runners legs with smoking tires and the plumage on his head was replaced with a fez. With these alterations made, Warner Bros. agreed that this wasn't their Road Runner anymore, so a license was not needed. The Zor Road Runners were chartered on February 1, 1995. This new parade go-cart unit was made up of 31 St. Croix Valley Shrine Club Noble drivers from several cities in western Wisconsin with headquarters in River Falls.

The unit purchased eight go-carts and one trailer to haul the carts. The first carts were powered by 3 1/2 HP Briggs engines and had a top speed of about 25MPH.

The original carts served their need very well, but in 2000 it was decided to invest in updated carts to better accommodate drivers with safety in mind. The purchase was made in early 2000, along with a larger trailer. The new carts with the 5HP engines were outfitted and ready to roll in the first parade of the year in May. The original carts along with the trailer were sold to a Shrine Club in Jamestown, New York.

Starting with Pea Soup Days in Somerset, WI, over 25 years ago, we have had a handful of dedicated lead Captains, minor changes in the uniform, and creative adjustments in parade maneuvers. We are still one of the most sought after motorized parade units in western Wisconsin and perform in more than 20 parades each summer.



On behalf of everyone at Shriners Hospitals for Children[®] in Chicago, I wanted to check in to provide you with amazing happenings from our hospital and invite you to show your excitement for spring with us. You are an integral part of the generous donors who help us provide specialty medical treatment for children regardless of their family's ability to pay. Thank you for your past generosity.

In 2021, Chicago Shriners Hospital held true to our mission of providing the highest quality care to our children. The children we served needed us more now than ever. We performed 1,189 surgeries, conducted 773 telehealth visits and recorded 2,902 patient days. Please note of our 1,189 surgeries our surgeons logged 245,813 minutes of surgery representing the complexity of work our surgeons are doing to help our patients. You and the rest of our donors made hope and healing a reality in 2021 to more kids in more places, thank you!

We have had creative focused outcomes for our patients thanks to our amazing hospital staff. An example of our focused outcomes is our Motion Analysis staff. They have achieved full accreditation from the Commission for Motion Analysis Accreditation (CMLA). The Motion Analysis Center was evaluated on 87 criteria to ensure both competency and reliability. This rigorous process has taken a year to accomplish. Additionally, we are in the process of hiring a full-time spine surgeon for our expanding spine service program. We are also interviewing for a part-time NP/PA to support Urology and Rehabilitation services, a neurologist to replace Dr. Larson and intensivist to replace Dr. Podorovsky. One of our goals is to treat more children in more places by providing clinical services at more sites (i.e. UI Health, Loyola Medical Center, Cook County), provide telehealth, support other shrine hospitals that are transitioning and treat more international patients.

We are springing ahead of the pandemic and have big plans for 2022 to create and fund equipment, therapeutic programs, and services to the children who need it most!
