THE CHALLENGE

CAN WE USE THE SALE OF ZOR'S TEMPLE TO RENEW OUR FRATERNITY?

The decision by Zor Shrine's members to find temporary space for the Temple gives Zor the chance to do more than pick a location. It opens the door to a fundamental reexamination of everything Zor has been doing. If we don't use the opportunity presented by sale of the Temple building to reinvent Zor, we should not be surprised in five years when we have achieved more of the same.

The Zor Temple in Madison is the perfect symbol of why Zor needs to change. What do I mean?

If you look at Zor's total assets and spending objectively, you can only conclude that our organization's primary purpose is to own a building in Madison for a handful of events each year. That is where the vast bulk of our capital and a huge amount of money go. Selling the building will allow us to redirect our efforts to what Zor should be about – serving Wisconsin and the world as an engine of enthusiasm for the Masonic fraternity.

We need to take the time to ask some hard questions:

- 1. Why would any young man want to join the Shrine?
- 2. What are we doing to build the kind of programming which would make the Shrine relevant to families today?
- 3. What is the best way to produce programs and services with the funds and member resources we have?

Once we have thought through these questions and formulated answers, the question of what kind of space we need and where should be much easier to answer.

When I joined Masonry in 1994, the Shrine was a major reason why men became Masons. They joined the Blue Lodge so they could join Scottish Rite or York Rite and thereby be eligible to join the Shrine. The Shrine was so attractive then that it energized the entire remainder of Masonry. As we all know, that isn't the case anymore. We are a shell of our former selves. But we're not done yet. We have the capacity to rebuild the Shrine. Our Imperial Potentate has it exactly correct – we need to be about fun and fellowship again.

It will be a different kind of fun and fellowship perhaps than we had in the past. The Shrine, more than any of the other branches of the Masonic community, involves wives. It can involve children. All we have to do is put on events and fun that families want to go to.

I submit that this difficult year has created a new opportunity for the Shrine. Families across the nation and Wisconsin have been forced to confront the difficulty of the modern lifestyles that have developed in which we have little contact with our neighbors and engage one another through Facebook. When the pandemic hit, many of us discovered how isolated they really are. By contrast, those of us in Masonry have known we had hundreds of friends everywhere. In tough times, communities have your back. Masonry is the ultimate community.

Why haven't we been able to rebuild the Shrine before this, and why can we do it now? We have been busy with unproductive pursuits. We've stuck a lot of money, time and effort into caring for a building that isn't central to our mission. We've spent even more time on fundraising, spending thousands of hours to raise comparatively small amounts

of money. We spent a great deal of money hiring professional staff to take care of the paperwork associated with owning a building, managing a budget and running an office. What's missing from this? Fun and fellowship.

We haven't had staff people to organize events, make arrangements for our leaders and market our organization.

We have spent \$65,000 a year on a building used a handful of occasions, but we don't have the money in the budget to pay the expenses for our Divan and leaders of our larger units or clubs to attend the annual Shriners International meeting. That's where the answers we need can be found.

We talk about looking for new members, but we haven't really identified who might be interested in joining us, and going after them. There are many veterans today, for example, who would seem ideal candidates. We need to find them and sign them.

Let me be direct.

The question before Zor Shrine is not where to move our existing office and operation. To be blunt, our existing office and operation is not working. It has produced declining membership and participation. If it is simply relocated, it will continue to do so, but in a smaller office.

We need to start from scratch and build a Zor Shrine that has a chance to succeed. We must do what has a chance of working. We can use the income generated from selling our building to fund the same operations in a new location — and we will get the same results. Or — we can use those funds to finance a new birth of fun and fellowship. We have one last chance to salvage this organization. If we don't take it, it will be our fault.





ZOR QUARTERLY STATED MEETING AND ZOR HEADQUARTERS FUTURE LOCATION COMMITTEE REPORT AND VOTE RESULTS

On August 22, 2020, a Quarterly Stated meeting was held at the Holiday Inn Hotel & Suites, 1000 Imperial Ave, Rothschild, WI., 43 Nobles were in attendance in person and 48 Nobles via Zoom at 7 satellite locations.

Zor Recorder, Bob Gorsuch P.P. gave the Nobles a brief update on the progress of the sale of the Zor property. It appears a closing may occur during the first quarter of 2021. Noble Randy Webb suggested we negotiate a moving out date so that the Annual Meeting on January 9, 2021 could still be held in the Temple.

Option 2 - Rent Office space in City of Madison

- 1. Advantages:
 - a. Probably more ideally suited office space.
 - b. Nobles familiar with access.
 - c. Parking.
- 2. Disadvantages:
 - a. No facilities to host larger events (annual meeting, Fez Party, Clown Party, etc.).
 - b. Cost versus Wisconsin Masonic Center.

Option 3 - Rent Temporary location in Madison while looking for Permanent Site

(Seek approval from Imperial for location outside Madison if needed).

- 1. Advantages:
 - a. More centralized to members locations.
- 2. Disadvantages:
 - a. Unknown depending on location.

A paper ballot was used at all locations. Two tellers were appointed by Potentate Ausen to count the ballots cast at the meeting. Assigned Nobles at the satellite locations were responsible for governing the elections at their respective sites. Votes from the various satellites were text messaged to the Recorder. All paper ballots were collected from all locations and is on record with the Zor Recorder, Bob Gorsuch, P.P.. The voting results are as follows:

Option 1 = 23 votes

Option 2 = 7 votes

Option 3 = 61 votes

Noble delivers talk on potential Shrine patient

Noble Dr. Chris Tashjian was the guest speaker at the Hancock Lodge meeting on Tuesday September 8th.

His talk centered around his efforts to bring an Armenian little girl to the Philadelphia Shriners Hospital for treatment of a leg condition. Tashjian, whose grandparents emigrated to the US in 1920, has made numerous medical trips to the small mid-east country with other physicians as a part of the Armenia Missionary Association of America.

During one of his trips he met little Mary Alexanyan and her mom and dad in June 2019. Chris learned Mary developed an infection in a knee joint that made walking difficult even to the point of not allowing her right leg to bend. In the Armenia culture this means it would affect her socially for her entire life.

Dr. Chris applied for a 10-year visa for her mom and Mary and also cleared it with the Shriners Hospital for Children in Philadelphia to start treatment. The appointment was scheduled for February 2020 and was moved to March 2020 due the visa being held up. Shriner's was instrumental in getting this visa approved. The entire process was put on hold due the Covid 19 pandemic.

In his talk Dr. Tashjian showed a PowerPoint map showing the location of the little country of Armenia. Its people speak Armenian and Russian and are now learning English. Their life centers around family and the Armenian Christian Church. They may be a small nation, but they are connected by faith and the desire to be educated. Having very few physical resources in their country (smaller than Hawaii), they see technology as their future with an educated workforce.





Dear Fellow Nobles,

We know that, like us, you have been concerned for our Shriners Hospitals for Children locations in the path of hurricanes and wildfires. We are relieved to let you know that our patients and staff members in these areas are safe.

Our hospitals in Galveston, Houston and Shreveport took all necessary precautions as Hurricane Laura approached. The city of Galveston was under a mandatory evacuation order, but our hospital remained open for referrals and emergencies. As the hurricane passed on Thursday, the Texas hospitals experienced no issues and resumed business as usual the next day.

Our Shreveport hospital experienced a temporary loss of power, and there is some cleanup work for the yard crew, but the hospital weathered the hurricane with no substantial problems for patients, staff, or property.

In Northern California, our hospital is not threatened by the wildfires. Some workforce members were forced to evacuate their homes, but all have returned, and no property was damaged. The fires are now under control, and air quality continues to improve each day. Our medical staff is caring for several children who sustained burns due to the wildfires.

We are so proud of our Shriners Hospitals for Children staff members who have continued to provide the most amazing care anywhere despite these difficult and frightening circumstances. Their devotion to our patients and families is an inspiration to us, and we are sure, to you too.


