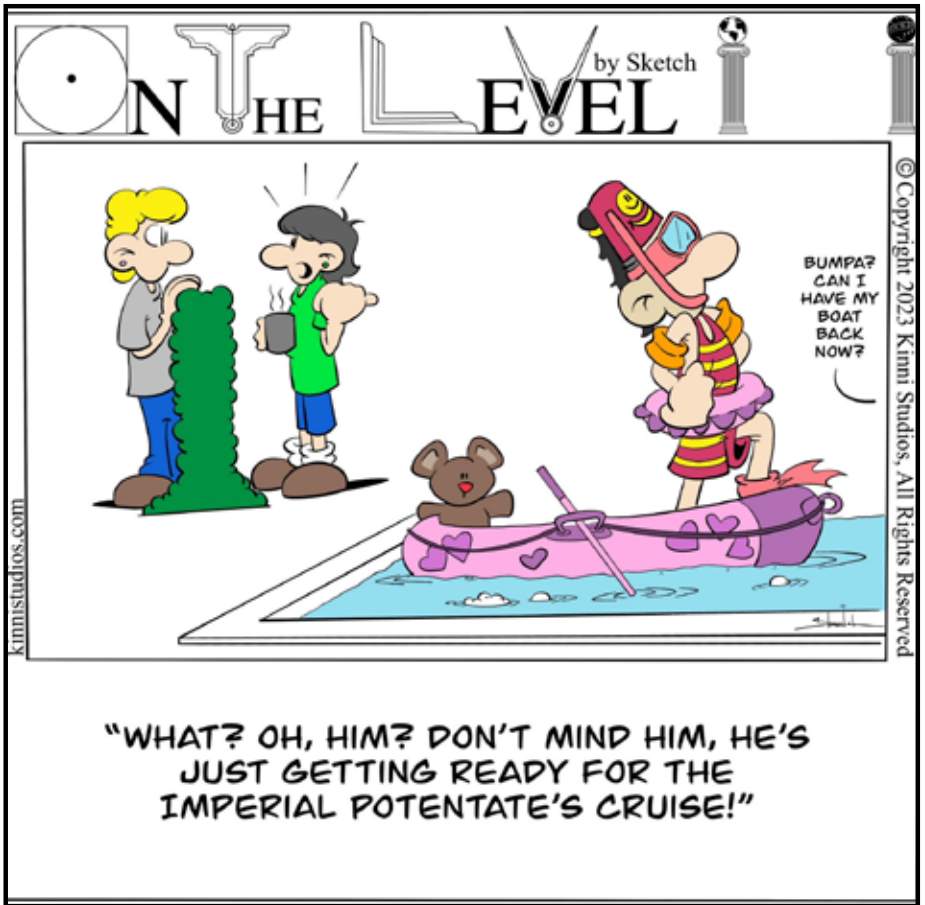
Dues are Due!

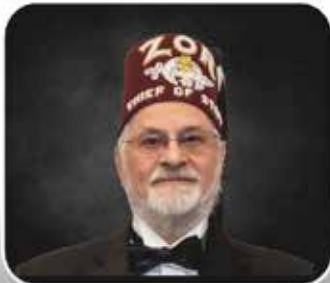

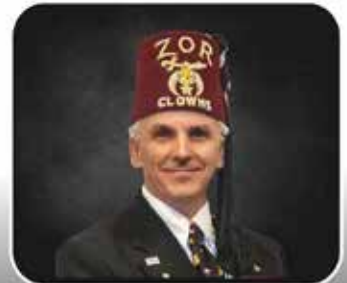

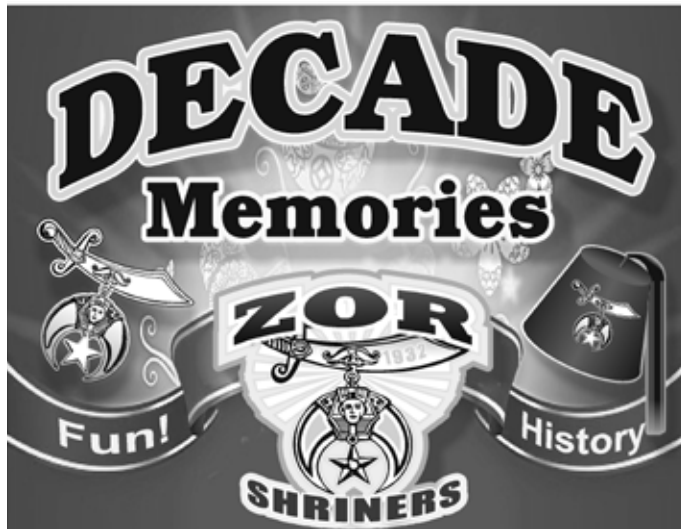
