



2023 Shriners Twin Cities East West Football Game

Meet the 2023 Shriners Twin Cities East West Football Game Grand Marshall Gioia (Joya) Schutte.

Gioia, presently a fourteen-year-old, was born missing part of her right arm. At age six, she was fit with her first prosthetic arm, but due to difficulties operating on the arm, she chose not to use it very often. In the summer of 2021, she visited her pediatrician looking for a better prosthetic arm so she could ride her bike and do simple everyday tasks. Her doctor suggested that she should check out Shriners Children's Twin Cities.

On her first visit to Shriners Children's Twin Cities, she was given several options for a different prosthetic arm. Now a proud owner of four different prosthetic arms - one to play the violin, one for weightlifting, a cosmetic one, and a robotic one. The robotic arm is the most versatile as she does laundry and everyday things around the house with it. The arm is controlled by sensors on her upper arm and has been very useful in doing simple needs in her day-to-day life.

As Gioia's arm continues to grow, she has regular appointments with the prosthetic department to ensure a great fit. She has developed great relationships with the staff at Shriners Children's Clinic so coming in for new fittings and regular doctor's appointments is a positive experience. Visiting with all the staff helps make the time go fast while waiting on her fittings/cast to cure. She is very happy with all the services she has received at Shriners Children's, which also extends to programs outside the clinic.


Gioia has attended several Shriners Children's Camp Programs. Camp Achieve, a day camp for kids with limb deficiencies; where a variety of programs from rock climbing, canoeing, fishing, and zip lining are held. They encourage the kids to step outside their comfort zone and try new things. New friendships are often developed during these camps because they are with kids who can relate to each other and not feel different. Camp Achieve Adventure for Teens was a 3-day camp to the Apostle Islands for a kayaking adventure on Lake Superior. This camp really pushes the teens and they all rose to the challenge and had an awesome time. Through the Child Life Department, Gioia was also introduced to a Kids Camp put on by the USA Patriots, which she attended along with six other Shriners Patients. At this camp they spent a week learning softball skills and developing new friendships. It ended with a big softball game.

Gioia has been very active in dance, horseback riding, weightlifting and volleyball. This fall she will be a freshman in high school, which is an exciting time. Her future desires are to stay active in sports and hoping to continue being athletically engaged in college. As for formal studies, she is considering a culinary position for her further studies.

Gioia will be a speaker at the East-West Football Banquet on September 25th and the Potentate Dinner September 29th at Junior's Restaurant & Tap House in River Falls.

Gioia will be on hand at the Oasis hosted by the St. Croix Valley Women's Auxiliary at Jerry's Towing, in the Shrine UW River Falls UW-Platteville Parade on September 30th in River Falls and will be introduced before the Homecoming game.

Shriners will be selling tickets to the game, and everyone is invited to attend this annual fall classic.






