"Leah's Project" A Legacy of Love and Safety, Birthed by Arabia Shriners with Strong Ties to Zor

At the recent Imperial Session of Shriners International in Atlanta, Nobles and Ladies from across the globe were introduced to a powerful new movement within our fraternity—Leah's Project. This grassroots initiative began with two devoted Shrine couples from Arabia Shriners in Houston, Texas: Illustrious Sir Ben LaBlanc and First Lady Alyssa LaBlanc, and Treasurer Chris Staudt and Lady Amy Staudt. What started as a moment of inspiration has now become a mission to protect children and families from preventable harm—and it has strong ties to Zor Shriners.

Ben LaBlanc, son of Zor Past Potentate Rodney LaBlanc and Lady Mary LaBlanc, is not only the current Potentate of Arabia but also a proud associate member of Zor Shriners. Through Leah's Project, he and Alyssa are honoring their Zor roots while making an extraordinary impact across Shrinedom.

The Heart of the Project: Leah's Story

Leah's Project was born from tragedy but fueled by purpose. The project is named in memory of Leah Burke, a young girl who tragically passed away due to severe burns from overheated bathwater—a danger that, heartbreakingly, could have been prevented. Her story was shared by her family, including Imperial Sir Richard Burke and Lady Judy, at the 2024 Imperial Session, leaving the room in tears and stirring hearts to action. That story sparked a life-changing idea in Noble Chris Staudt, a licensed home inspector. Sitting in that session, he turned to his wife Amy and whispered, "There's no standard for testing water temperature in home inspections." That simple but profound realization led to action.

A Mission in Motion

Since that moment, the Staudts and the LaBlancs have mobilized an impressive movement. Working with home inspection software companies, they've added hot water safety prompts to national inspection platforms. They've created Leah's Labels—faucet hangers that include safety information, a QR code to donate to Shriners Children's, and, most importantly, Leah's story.

The team has traveled across the country, speaking to realtors, inspectors, and community leaders in multiple states. Their message has been met with overwhelming support and, more importantly, immediate action. Realtors are sharing safety materials with clients. Inspectors are adjusting practices. Awareness is growing.

And it's all tied back to Shrinedom—highlighting how one child's story can ripple out to change countless lives.

The Role of the Ladies—and the Legacy

Lady Alyssa LaBlanc closed the presentation in Atlanta with a stirring call to action for the Ladies of our fraternity. She reminded everyone that we, the families and spouses behind the scenes, are the heart of this mission. "Let's not just host events," she said. "Let's spark passion. Let's build connections. Let's be the reason a new Noble brings his wife, his kids, his energy into Shrinedom."







Leah's Project doesn't just honor a single life lost too soon—it represents thousands of lives saved. It's about preserving a child's memory by protecting the future of others. And it's being driven forward by Shriners who lead with compassion and conviction.

Zor's Pride in One of Our Own

Zor Shriners can be especially proud of Ben and Alyssa LaBlanc. Ben was shaped by this Temple—by his father Rodney's unwavering service and by the legacy of leadership and love embedded in the Zor family. Now, he is paying that forward by creating waves of impact, not only in Houston but across North America.

Ben's remarks in Atlanta reminded all Nobles to ask themselves: "What is your why?" His "why" was instilled through his father's example and is now passed forward through his daughters Avery and Addison, and the entire Shrine mission. Through Leah's Project, his "why" is clear—to transform heartbreak into hope and to ensure that Shrinedom remains a force for good in every community we serve.

We get inundated with emails and other communications daily, sometimes even hourly! In this current day of constant communications we often glance over important details. When it comes to technological communications like email, this may be doubly so. Unfortunately, email is a technology with a lot of scammers and spammers trying to trick you or try to steal youraccount names, passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers. If they get that information, they could get access to your email, bank, or otheraccounts. Or they could sell your information to other scammers. They may also be asking you to do them a favor like get a few gift cards and tell them the numbers.

Your phone dings. You check it and see a notification about an email from a close friend! It's easy enough to see their name in the 'From' field. You start reaading it and see they want some quick help, so you start planning how you can help a Brother out. He is at a charity event and forgothis gift card prizes! He says he needs you to help him out and send him the numbers after you buy some. **This is a very common scam technique**. This email isn't really from a Bro, it's a scammer engaging in a technique called **phishing**.

Phishing emails or text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. They might pretend to be from someone else. This is called 'Spoofing'. You might get an unexpected email or text message that looks like it's from a company or person you know and trust, like a bank or a credit card or the name of a Brother. The message could be from a scammer, who might say things like:

- claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information
- include an invoice you don't recognize to pay now
- want you to click on a link to make a payment for some item or 'urgent' reason
- ask you to buy some gift cards for any reason

Scammers will usually say something is urgent, or time sensitive. They don't want you to have time to think about what they're saying or talk to someone you trust. Slow down. Don't pay. It's a scam. Scammers will tellyou which gift card to buy (and where). They might say to put money on an eBay, Google Play, Target, or Apple gift card. They might send you to a specific store — often Walmart, Target, CVS, or Walgreens. Sometimes they'll tell you to buy cards at several stores, so cashiers won't get suspicious. The scammer also might stay on the phone with you while you go to the store and load money onto the card. Scammers will ask you for the gift card number and PIN. The card number and PIN on the back of the card let the scammer get the money you loaded onto the card — even if you still have the card itself.

Slow down. Don't give them those numbers or send them a photo of the card. It's a scam. A Zor representative will never contact you through email and ask you to buy gift cards. No one should ever need a gift card number or pin, without having that gift card in their physical possession.

Here are a few tips to spot phishing emails. Pay attention to the details not just the content of the message. Inspect the sender's email address to confirm it's actually coming from that person. Scammers will often send the email from a random email account and change the Display Name of the email address to a publically known one. It may show up as:

Email: Steve Livernash <not-a-spammer@spammercentral.xyz>

Date: Tue, Aug 1, 2025 at 7:18 AM

Subject: Need urgent help!

Look at the From field. It says 'Steve Livernash', and that's a known Brother! But pay attention to the email address behind it. **That** is definitely not Steves' email. You should be very wary of trusting this as being a legitimate email from Steve; it isn't, it's a scam. Call the sender to verify authenticity of the request or use the sender's email account on file or your address book that you already have. Do not reply to the email. Do notpurchase any gift cards.

With warm hearts and wet shoes, the 2025 Mini Car celebration was a memorable day of Shriners spirit, laughter, and generosity.




